SUPERVISOR'S REPORT.

FELLOW CITIZENS :—I respectfully submit the following report as Supervisor of Schools :

The schools throughout the town, during the past year, have been, in my opinion, unusually successful. With one or two exceptions they have been, so far as I have been able to learn, perfectly satisfactory. I have never known a time when so many scholars were attending school and so much interest manifested in the schools by both parents and scholars. The teachers have all labored hard and good progress has been made by the scholars.

On account of the increase in number of scholars, together with the increase in the number of classes, as they advance in the course of study, it became necessary to hire an assistant for the High School at Welchville. Mr. Walter E. Holmes was engaged to assist Miss Stone, one half of each school day. This school has a class of seven to graduate next June. It is the first class to graduate from this school. I hope as many of our citizens as can will attend the graduating exercises. I do not hesitate to predict that it will be a credit to the school and to the town.

For the same reason, as given above, it became necessary to hire an assistant for the Oxford Village High School. This school now contains thirty-five pupils, and the number of daily recitations during the fall term numbered sixteen, allowing an average of scarcely twenty minutes to a recitation. In order to enable him to do more and better work with his classes, Mr. Hanscom employed an assistant, Miss Jennie Hayes, a portion of each day during the winter term. This he did at his own expense, except for some \$9.00 received for tuition from out of town pupils at this term of school.

A class of eleven graduated from this school last June. The graduating exercises were held in Robinson Hall. The following is a copy of the programme :

I attribute the success in the schools to the fact that I have employed, so far as I have been able, only first class teachers. I am a firm believer in *good* schools. I have no patience with a poor school. It is said that "A penny saved is a penny earned," but a penny that is saved at the expense of a town's public schools is far from being a penny earned. A town that is liberal in its appropriations for educational purposes is a good town every time. Poor schools are good enough for a poor town, but a town that is full of the true essence of "get there" will never have any thing in the educational line but the very best things that money can buy.

Good schools are never lights hid under a bushel. Their brilliance is soon visible for many miles around, and pupils from

neighboring towns and, from outlying country school districts hasten to attend and profit by them, and also assist in supporting the schools by their tuitions.

TOWN WARRANT.

To W. R. Farris, a Constable of the town of Oxford, County of Oxford, State of Maine.

GREETING :

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Oxford, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the town house in said Oxford on Monday the 4th day of March next, at ten o'clock A. M., to act on the following articles, to wit :

- Art. 1st, To choose a moderator to preside in said meeting.
- Art. 2d, To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3d, To act upon the report of the town officers for the past year.
- Art. 4th, To choose a board of selectmen, overseers of the poor, a town treasurer, town agent, superintending school committee, and all other town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5th, To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of town schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6th, To see if the town will vote to raise money for high schools, and how much.
- Art. 7th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town officers for the ensuing year.

- Art. 10th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in highway labor tax for the ensuing year.
- Art. 12th, To see what wages the town will vote to pay per hour, for labor on highway for men and oxen and horses.
- Art. 13th, To see what discount the town will vote to make if any, on all highway taxes paid into the town treasurer on or before the first day of June, 1895.
- Art. 14th, To see what discount the town will vote to make if any, on all money taxes paid in to the town treasurer on or before the first day of September and the first day of December 1895.
- Art. 15th, To see if the town will vote to fix a date on which all money taxes assessed for the ensuing year shall become due.
- Art. 16th, To see if the town will vote to charge interest and what rate on taxes due and unpaid.
- Art. 17th, To see if the town will vote to charge interest on all money taxes assessed for the ensuing year, when due and unpaid.
- Art. 18th, To see if the town will vote to buy a summer road machine.
- Art. 19th, To see if the town will vote to buy one or more winter road machines of J. L. Holden.
- Art. 20th, To see what sum of money if any the town will vote to raise to pay for road machines.
- Art. 21st, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the contingent fund for the ensuing year.

- Art. 22d, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day for the ensuing year.
- Art. 23d, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of Freeland Homes Library for the ensuing year.
- Art. 24th, To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for fuel, insurance, repairs, supplies, etc., for schools and school houses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 25th, To see what method the town will take to fill vacancies in the board of trustees of Freeland Holmes Library.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the town house for the purpose of receiving names and correcting the the list of voters on the 4th day of March next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon.
