Have found conditions in the town good and the people in general willing to co-operate with us when they understand the results we are working for. This has kept our fire losses way below the average, as a check-up on the fire losses of the last few years will show you.

Have made around 2200 calls this year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

To the Citizens of Presque Isle:

We respectfully submit our report for the fiscal year closing February 20, 1932.

It is with combined feelings of satisfaction and pleasure that we contemplate the conditions and progress of our schools for the past year.

Rural, Elementary, High School, Training School and the Rural Training School are all in fine condition. Not during the term of office of the present Board have we had greater cause for satisfaction. The work of the rural schools has been fully up to the average of previous years. Only a few changes were necessary at the opening of the year, and the new teachers as a whole have done good work. The work of the elementry schools of the village has been most satisfactory. Most of the regular force of teachers were retained and their long experience renders them most valuable. What vacancies occurred were filled by teachers personally known to the Board and they readily adapted themselves to their new conditions. This added to the efficiency of the system. Principal Jellison is a teacher of long experience and ability and a good and faithful supervisor. To him as well as to his efficient staff of teachers is due the praise for the fine showing of this school. In the High School few changes were made and able teachers were secured for these places. This able staff of teachers, directed by their energetic and efficient Principal, F. S. Cunningham, has placed Presque Isle High School in an enviable position among the High Schools of the State.

The work in music in the rural and elementary grades under Miss Mossman, and the High School music, band, orchestra and glee clubs under Mr. W. H. Jenkins, have been excellent. The

citizens of Presque Isle may well be proud of the pe ormance of the boys' and girls, glee clubs, the orchestra and the Presque Isle High School Band.

Physical Education hardly needs mention as so many of our citizens are familiar with the efficient work of Director Hanscom. This course is highly subsidized by the State and our goal is that every student in the High School and in the grades as well may profit by the instruction given by this department. It is a large undertaking and progress will necessarily be slow. but we are approaching our goal.

Our Agricultural Department, directed by that excellent leader, Fred P. Loring, is one of which any town in Maine can well be proud, and the training received is most fitting to cur needs as an agricultural county.

The business courses offered by the High School have been too cnewded for good work. More are taking the courses than we are equipped to accommodate. Notwithstanding this handicap, Miss Kitchen, the Director of this Department, has brought the classes up to, if not beyond, expected standards.

The Training School under the able leadership of Mrs. S. E. Preble has maintained its usual standards of excellence. Vacancies caused by resignation were filled by teachers of good ability and earnest purpose, and the results have been favorable.

The Rural Training School is an addition to our school system. This school receives a good subsidy from the State. It has been entirely satisfactory both to the State and the town. Miss Irene Bartlett is Director. A more efficient and better trained teacher was secured than the town would feel to employ without state aid. This training under rural conditions, which all the members of the graduating class receive, adds greatly to their efficiency as rural teachers and is a help not only to our County but to the State.

We do not wish to convey the impression that our schools are perfect for they are not. Probably no one knows this better than the members of the Board. However we feel that they are better each year than the previous year. These are improvements which should be made and courses which should be added. Courses in art and domestic science similar to those offered in the Training School should be added to our elementary curriculum. Also a more advanced course in art and domestic science should be offered in the High School.

A manual training course adapted to farm needs would be fine in conjunction with the agricultural course of the High School. These are additions for which we should strive just as soon as conditions warrant.

The Board is pleased to note the excellent spirit of cooperation which exists among the teachers and students of all the schools in town. Never since the State took over the Training School has such hearty cooperation and good fellowship prevailed. This spirit is due not only to the desire of the dischers to make all of our schools the most efficient possible but to the splendid spirit of helpfulness, inspiration and leadership of our Superintendent, Alden B. Hayes.

Gifts

There have been two notable gifts of books during the past year. The first was 82 volumes from the library of the late Geo. H. Collins, a gift from his grandsons Everett and Frederick Larrabee. The second was 262 volumes from the library of Laila and Sidney Graves, a gift from their daughter, Dorothy Graves.

Beside these there were gifts of single books from individuals too numerous to mention but which nevertheless have been much appreciated.

Repairs

Since the death of Mrs. M. L. T. White and her bequest to the library, it has been recognized by those familiar with the situation that sometime something would have to be done to enlarge the library and give more room for books.

The first step was the cleaning of the attic and the building of shelves there to take care of the books and magazines on file but seldom used. This done the committee invited a representative of the Library Bureau to visit the library and suggest plans for a complete remodeling of the first floor that could be done a little at a time as funds were available. Mr. Applegate from the library bureau made two trips going over the plans in detail with the members of the committee.

At the beginning of the new year, work was begun by removing the Librarian's desk to face the entering door, and the removal of the partitions of the children's room. The children's room as a room has been done away with, but the section devoted to the children's purposes, has been doubled in size, greatly increased book capacity, and at least a doubling of the former seating capacity. The new arrangement also provides much better ventilation and can be more easily supervised from the librarian's desk. This is just a beginning of the changes we hope to make, but it is certainly a very satisfactory beginning.

The death in September of the Librarian, Miss Lucinda B. Marston, removed one who has done more for the library than any other individual. Miss Marston had served as librarian ever since the founding of the library, and though unable, because of illness to attend to her duties as librarian, during the past three years, was still continued as librarian by the committee until her death. By her will she left a legacy of \$2000.00, the interest of which is to be used in the purchase of non-fiction, an added token of her interest in, and her love for the library.

To Ernest E. Lyons a Constable in the Town of Presque Isle, in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine. Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Town of Presque Isle, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Perry Theatre, in said Town of Presque Isle on the Twenty-first day of March, 1932, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To elect a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the report as printed, and allow accounts.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to elect three, five or seven Selectmen.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to elect or instruct the Selectmen to appoint a Road Commissioner in accordance with Chapter 5, Section 16, of the Public Laws of 1930.

- Art. 6. To elect all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest at the rate of six per cent per annum on all taxes remaining unpaid after October 15, 1932, and twelve per cent per annum on all taxes remaining unpaid after January 1, 1933.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will fix a time when taxes shall be due and payable.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote that Poll Taxes shall be due and payable on the first day of May, 1932, and the commitment of the list of poll tax payers shall be made to the Collector prior to that date.
- Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote NOT to pay a Collector of taxes any part of his Commission or Salary until he has made a satisfactory settlement with the Selectmen.
- Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen and Treasurer of the Town to obtain temporary loans for the Town from time to time during the coming year, to be paid out of money raised by taxation, such loans not to exceed in the aggregate at any one time the sum of ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$140,000.00) and to make, execute and negotiate in the name of the Town a note or notes therefor such time and term as to them

- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government, as follows: Selectmen and Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Town Auditor, Moderator and Officers' Expense.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Protection of Persons and Property, as follows: Police Department, Fire Department, Street Lights, Fire Inspector, Building Inspector, Electrical Inspector, Insurance Premiums and Hydrant Rental.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health and Sanitation, as follows:

 Public Dump, Vital Statistics, Anti-Tuberculesis Association, Health Officer and Plumbing Inspector.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways, Sidewalks and Bridges, as follows: Maintenance and Equipment, Winter

Breaking, Road Commissioner, Third-Class Road Patrol, and Sidewalks.

- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote "YES" or "NO" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ONE THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX DOLLARS (\$1,466.00) for the improvement of the section of State-Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the Town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of SEVEN THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED THIRTY COLLARS (\$7,33000) for the improvement of the section of State-Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the Town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 21, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to accept the road as laid out by the Selectmen and Road Commissioner for State Aid. (The Parsons Road and the Old Fort Fairfield Road).
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Section 26 to 34, inclusive of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, for the construction of a State-Aid Highway through the towns of Presque Isle, Fort Fairfield and Caribou, beginning at the Mapleton-Presque Isle town line and extending via State-Aid No. 5 in Presque Isle to State Street, over Dyer Street to Park Street, over Park Street to Main Street, over Main Street to Blake Street, over Blake Street, or State-Aid No. 6, so-called, to State Aid No. 7, (New designation) over State-Aid No. 7 to Fort Fairfield town line, over State-Aid No. 3 to State Highway "K Spur," over State Highway "K Spur" to Fort Fairfield Third-Class No. 1, over Fort Fairfield Third-Class No. 1 to Caribou town line, over Caribou State-Aid No. 1 to Aroostook River, over Broadway to Limestone Road and Route? over Limestone Road to River Road in Caribou leading to Grimes Mill, over River Road, or Grimes Mill Road to Fort Fairfield town line and Fort Fairfield Third-Class No. 2.

- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and Road Commissioner to tar the streets that are in condition to tar; providing the couters pay one-half of the cost. The Town's part to be taken from the Highway Maintenance account, as provided by Section 49, Chapter 27, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Charity, as follows: Town Farm, Poor off the Farm, Mothers' Aid and Children's Guardian.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will yote to raise and appropriate for Education, as follows: Common School Teachers, Common School Janitors, Common School Fuel, Common School Conveyance, Common School Text-books, Common School Supplies, High School Teacher, High School Janitors, High School Fuel, High School Textbooks, High School Supplies, Repairs, Superintendent, Office Expense and Committee, Physical Education, Music, Compulsory Education, Equipment, Agricultural Course and Interest on School Fund.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Free Public Library.

- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the improvement of Cemeteries.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Abatements.
- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Maintenance of the Municipal Building.
- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be deposited as a Sinking Fund.
- Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money equal to the amount of tax assessed against the Presque Isle Water Company for the purpose of paying said tax for the ensuing year.
- Art. 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) for adverttising our natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.
- Art. 33. To see if the Town will vote to ratify the action of the Special Town Meeting of March 15, 1932, if a vote is taken to adopt an act to Provide a Town Council and Manager form of Government for the Town of Presque Isle, in the County of Aroostook.

- Art. 34. To see if the Inhabitants of the Town of Pre-que Isle in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine will vote to ratify Chapter 100 of the Laws of the State of Maine, 1931; Said Chapter being entitled "An act to provide a Town Council and Manager Form of Government for the town of Presque Isle, in the County of Aroostook."
- Art. 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of FIFTEEN THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN AND 80:100 DOLLARS (\$15,-214.80) to take care of the balance of the Overdrawn accounts.
- Art. 36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to foreclose by any method prescribed by the Statutes of Maine, any one or more of the mortgages assigned to the Inhabitants of the town of Presque Isle by Boyton R. Todd. Executor of the last will and testament of Myrtle L. T. White, late of Presque Isle, deceased, which said mortgages and assignments thereof are recorded in the Southern District of the Aroostook Registry of Deeds: and authorize the Selectmen to do and perform, for and in behalf of said town, or the Inhabitants thereof, any and all acts required by law in the foreclosure proceedings adopted for the foreclosure of any one or more of said mortgages, including the oath required in case of foreolosure by newspaper publications.

- Art. 37. To see if the Town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the Selectmen, Town Treasurer and Town Clerk.
- Art. 38. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following Town Ordinances.
 - Sec. 1. No person shall engage in the business of public trucking within the limits of the town of Presque Isle without first obtaining a license therefor from the Selectmen of the town. The Selectmen shall issue a license as a public truckman to any proper person who applies therefor and the fee for said license shall be TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00), which sum shall be paid before said license shall become effective. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding TWENTY DOLLARS (\$20.00).
- Art.39. To see if the Town will vote to repeal all existing Parking Regulations.
- Art. 40. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following

 Town Ordinance: regulating the traffic and parking of

 Motor Vehicles.
 - Sec. 1. On Main Street, from Academy to Blake Street, South bound cars shall park on the West side of said street at an angle of 45 degrees to the curb. North bound cars shall park on the East side of said Street at an angle of 45 degrees to the curb. Between

Academy Street and Hall Street, North of Hall Street. on the East side of Main Street, extending to Blake Street, all cars shall park parallel to the curb. The Selectemn of said Village of Presque Isle may designate two spaces in front of the Presque Isle Opera House, so called, with a parking limit of five minutes: said Selectmen may also designate four parking spaces in front of the Northeastland Hotel with a parking limit of five minutes. On State Street, between the right-of-way of the Bangor and Aroostook Railroad Company and Second Street, cars parked on the South side thereof shall face the East and be parked as near the curb as practicable. West bound cars shall park on the North side of said Street as an angle of 45 degrees to the curb. On State Street, between the rightof-way of the Bangor and Aroostook Railroad Company, and the junction of State and Mechanic Streets, all westbound cars shall park on the North side of the street and parallel to the curb; all eastbound cars shall park on the South side of said street and parallel to the curb. No parking shall be permitted on the Concrete Bridge on State Street. On Hall Street, cars shall be parked only on the South side of said street and facing East and as near the South ditch as practicable. On Church Street cars shall be parked only on the South side of said Street and facing the East and as near the South ditch as practicable.

- Sec. 2. Cars shall not be allowed to stop at the curb as above, or at a cross walk or street intersection to take or discharge passengers. If necessary to turn around, this shall be done at street intersections or private ways only except as noted in section 11, below.
- Sec. 3. The following rights of way and their entrances shall be left sufficiently clear to allow the fire truck to get to the rear of the buildings, said clear spaces to be not less than 10 feet in width at any point; the so-called, Fernald, Aroostook Co-Operative Co., Aroostook Wholesale Grocery Co., Northeastland Hotel Co., rights of way on Main Street and right of way from Main Street to State Street around the Presque Isle National Bank Building, the right of way from Hall Street to the rear of the Post Office Block, the right of way from State Street between the B. &. A. R. R., track and H. N. Whitney Drug Store, the right of way between the B. & A. R. R., track and Livingston Store, the right of way off State Street between the A. M. Smith block and the Hedrich block.
- Sec. 4. No cars shall be parked in front of or within seven feet of any hydrant in the Village, of Presque Isle.
- Sec. 5. No cars shall be parked within fifteen feet of the curb intersection of ny street corner in the village of Presque Isle.

- Sec. 6. Any street or portion of Presque Isle on which the parking of cars is prohibited by this ordinance shall be marked by a sign or some other manner so as to be reasonably visible to the driver of a car or motor vehicle about to park.
- Sec. 7. All Motor driven vehicles shall come to a step before entering any street or highway in the village and town of Presque Isle at the entrance of which a stop sign shall have been placed by the order of the Selectmen of said town of Presque Isle.
 - Sec. 8. Motor vehicles shall not be driven in the compact pertion of the village and town of Presque Isle at a rate of speed in excess of twenty miles per hour.
 - Sec. 9. Hall Street in the vollage and town of Presque Isle shall be a one-way street and vehicles shall not proceed thereon except from West to East.
 - Sec. 10. What is known as Station Street, being a short street approaching the Bangor & Aroostook Railroad Station, shall be known as a one-way street and Motor vehicles shall enter said street only by its Northern intersection with Main Street and shall leave said Street only by its Southern intersection with said Main Street.
 - Sec. 11. Motor driven vehicles and vehicles hauled by teams shall not make what is known as a "U" turn in the square formed by the intersection of Main Street and State Street, nor shall any vehicle make any

turn at the junction of Hall and Main Street other than for the purpose of entering Hall Street.

Sec. 12. All night parking on all concrete streets is prohibited.
