Warrant

To Ernest E. Lyons, a Constable in the Town of Presque Isle, Maine. GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of said Town of Presque Isle, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Perry Theatre in said Town of Presque Isle on the Nineteenth day of March, 1934, at nine o'clock in the morning to act upon the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To elect a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the town report as printed.
- Art. 4. To elect all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to charge interest at the rate of six per cent per annum on all taxes remaining unpaid after October 15, 1934 and eight per cent per annum on all taxes remaining unpaid after January 1, 1935.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will fix a time when taxes will be due and payable.

- Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote that Poll Taxes shall be due and payable on the first day of May, 1934, and the commitment of the list of poll tax payers shall be made to the Collector prior to that date.
- Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Councilors and Treasurer of the Town to obtain temporary loans for the Town from time to time during the coming municipal year, to be paid out of money raised by taxation, such loans not to exceed in the aggregate at any one time the sum of ONE HUNDRED FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$140,000.-00) and to make, execute and negotiate in the name of the Town a note or notes therefore such time and term as to them seems advisable, and also to renew from time to time as to them seems necessary, the whole or any part of such notes given.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Protection of Persons and Property.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health and Sanitation.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways, Sidewalks and Bridges.
- Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the road as laid out by the Councilors and Road Commissioner for State Aid. (The Parsons Road and the Old Fort Fairfield Road.)

- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the Section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 22, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Councilors and Road Commissioner to tar the streets that are in condition to tar: providing the abutters pay one-half of the cost. The Town's part to be taken from the Highway Maintenance account, as provided by Section 49, Chapter 27, of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for Charity.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for Education.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for the Free Public Library.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for Interest.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for the improvement of Cemeteries.

- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for Abatements.
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for the Maintenance of the Municipal Building.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate to raise for the Armory Commission.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for Memorial Day.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise to be deposited as a Sinking Fund.
- Art. 27. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of ONE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$1,100.00) to take care of the balance due on the 1930 tax book.
- Art. 28. To see if the Town will vote to ratify the action of the Special Town Meeting of July 21, 1933 whereby the Town Council was given the authority to enact and enforce the Ordinances for Town of Presque Isle.
- Art. 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,500.00) for the repair of the south end of the Centerline road.
- Art. 30. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise FOUR HUNDRED EIGHTY and 24-100 DOLLARS (\$480.24) for the purpose of settling the claims of Frank Guiou against the Town for illegal taxation.
- Art. 31. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise FIFTY-EIGHT and 56-100 DOLLARS (\$58.56) for

the purpose of repaying Bennett Marks for double taxation in the year of 1932.

- Art. 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money equal to the amount of tax assessed against the Presque Isle Hotel Company for the purpose of paying said tax for the ensuing year.
- Art. 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money equal to the amount of the tax assessment against the Presque Isle Airport for the ensuing year.
- Art. 34. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$400.00) balance of the appropriation of 1931 for the tax collector and the TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00) appropriated for the G. M. Park History of Presque Isle to the reduction of the temporary loan account.
- Art. 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY and 09-100 DOLLARS (\$720.09) to pay the balance of the overdrawn accounts of the fiscal year of 1932-1933.
- Art. 36. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise a sum of money sufficient to complete the sidewalk on the east side of Main Street from Church Street to Allen Street providing the abutting property owners pay two-thirds the cost of construction.
- Art. 37. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a tractor and snow plow.
- Art. 38. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise for the purchase of a tractor and snow plow.

The Councillors give notice that they will be in session at the Municipal Hall in said Town of Presque Isle, the fifteenth, sixteenth and seventeenth days of March, 1934, at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of Voters.

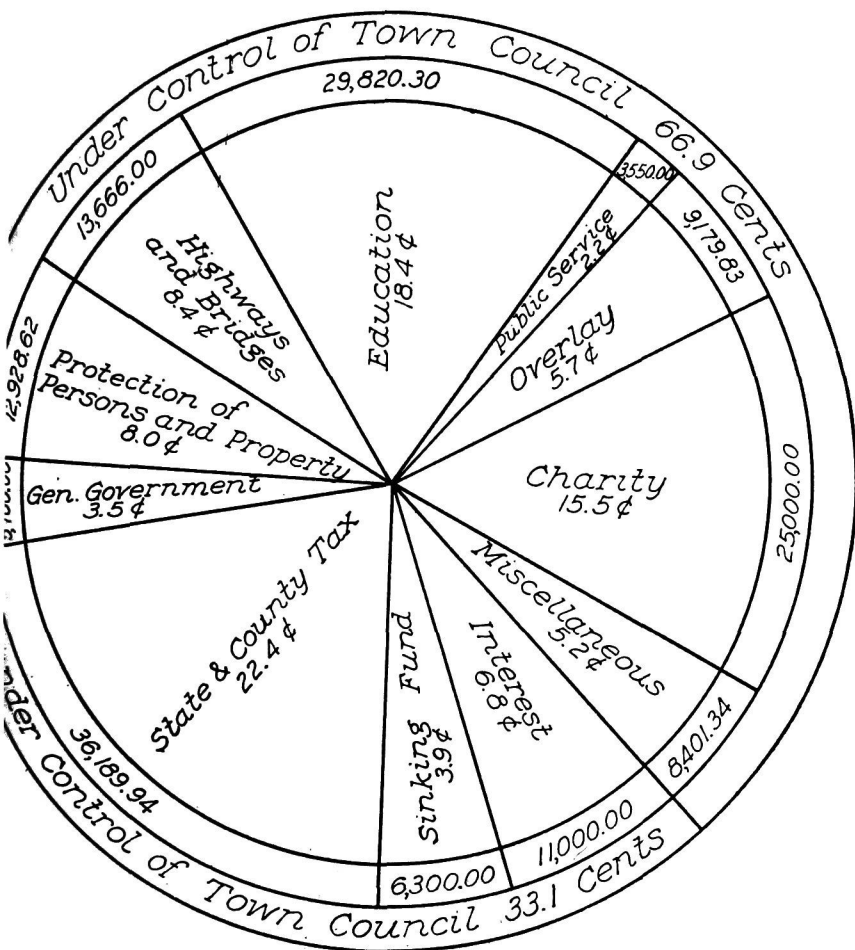
