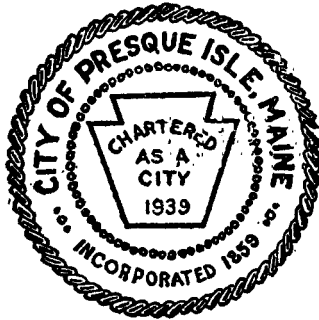

## REPORT OF THE CITY MANAGER

To the City Council and Citizens of Presque Isle :

In our annual report this year we have tried to make a financial report as brief as possible and yet be complete in detail.

The city accounts have been audited by W. Frank Gardiner, Public Accountant, a state representative of Municipal Accounts, and his report is made on the accounts as shown by this report.

As will be seen by the comparative balance sheet, our net debt was increased by \$36,990.05 in 1940, however this is best explained by the fact that we issued bonds for \$40,000.00 to finance our part of the cost of the airport construction.

We had an unexpended balance of \$3,358.13 on our appropriation accounts. Our relief load has been substantially reduced in 1940 as also the cost per person of the relief rendered.

We collected 68% of our 1940 tax commitment and the schedule of tax delinquencies by groups shows the amount paid and the delinquency in the various groups.

I want to express my appreciation to the City Council for their assistance and co-operation, my fellow employees for their loyal support in carrying out our work, and the citizens for their co-operation.

## AUDITOR'S REPORT

Houlton, Maine

April 5, 1941

To The Honorable Council  
City of Presque Isle, Maine

Pursuant to your recent request, I have audited the books and other records of the City Manager, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Clerk for the year ending December 31, 1940 and submit to you herewith the following statements, which, in my opinion correctly reflect the operation of the various appropriation and revenue accounts and financial standing of the City as of January 1, 1941.

Comparative Balance Sheet  
Analysis of Change in Net Debt  
Summary of Accounts  
Treasurer's Report  
Tax Collector's Report

Together with supporting schedules and lists for each department.

**TREASURER**—All cash received was found to have been deposited in the bank and balance on hand reconciled with the bank statement. All disbursements were made by warrant properly authorized as provided in the Charter and council meetings, bearing the signature of the City Manager and a member of the Council so designated.

**TAX COLLECTOR**—The Commitment of 1940 taxes was examined in detail for computation, addition, etc., and was found to be correct and has been accounted for by the Collector either by cash, discount, abatement or remaining unpaid. No verification of the unpaid portion of the commitment was made. In addition to the accounts of the current year, I have reviewed the tax accounts for all years back to 1931 and have taken off a list of unpaid taxes which compares favorably in the aggregate with the control accounts for the respective years.

**AUTO EXCISE TAX & CITY CLERK REVENUE**—Both of the above departments were examined, and all receipts found to have been properly remitted to the Treasurer.

**TRUST FUND INVESTMENTS**—I have examined savings accounts passbooks and other securities of the investment account and find them to be correct, schedule of which appears elsewhere in this report.

**INSURANCE**—A tabulation of City Property at a fair value was checked against insurance coverage and found to be insured at approximately eighty per cent of value, which is considered adequate protection.

**PETTY CASH & UNREMITTED RECEIPTS**—Petty Cash for change, and receipts from January 1, to January 25, 1941, in the office of the Tax Collector, City Clerk and Deputy Treasurer were verified by actual count and found to be correct as of January 25, 1941.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

According to custom and in compliance with the school laws of the State of Maine I submit to you my eighth annual report. The report this year will be more of a statistical nature, showing enrollment and expenditures for the past year with a comparison of several past years.

The enrollment in Gouldsville, Training School and the rural schools is somewhat less than last year. The high school enrollment is much larger, however, due to a large entering class of seventh grade pupils.

Due to resignations it was necessary to have nine new rural school teachers. It is almost impossible to find successful teachers of experience who are willing to go into rural schools at the salaries we have to offer. An attempt was made to obtain the best teachers possible for the rural schools. There was a scarcity of teachers graduating from the normal school. With few exceptions the rural teachers are doing excellent work. We have two or three outstanding rural school teachers.

There were no changes in the staff at Gouldsville. In the high school an extra Home Economics teacher and an English teacher were added. It was necessary to have an extra teacher in the seventh grade.

The course of study is practically the same as last year. Home Economics is now offered to all four classes in the high school. Nearly 200 girls are enrolled. Every seventh and eighth grade pupil has regular work in Art, Music, Physical Education, Health and Music Appreciation in addition to the other academic subjects. Every eighth grade pupil is given a regular Red Cross first aid course. Instruction in instrumental music is given to all pupils who desire it. Rural pupils come in every Saturday morning for this instruction. Music is carefully supervised in all rural schools. In order for this to be fully successful we must have rural teachers who have been conscientious about their preparation in normal school and carry over this same attitude in their schools. The Physical Education program has been revised with

much better results being accomplished. We are very fortunate in the type of special teachers we have. Their preparation is far better than the average teachers in their line of work.

During the past summer the interior of the Gouldville building was cleaned and painted. A new coal stoker was installed in the high school. The James School was painted on the interior and exterior and one side of the roof shingled. The Maysville, Butterfield and South Presque Isle schools were painted on the interior and exterior. The Sawyer School was painted on the interior. During the coming summer the Glidden, Pomeroy and Chandler Schools should be painted. Some work should be done on the interior of the high school and Training School. The windows and outside trimmings in the Gouldville building should be painted. Some work may be necessary on the boilers in the high school.

It is my contention that the success of any school system depends upon its elementary schools. Although the high school is perhaps more in the public eye and its importance should not be minimized, yet it cannot accomplish its best results unless the pupils entering have a good foundation. I feel that much has been accomplished during the past few years in the improvement of the elementary schools. Some of our best and hardest working teachers will be found in the grades or in some of our rural schools.

If we wish to procure and hold the type of teacher which every parents wants for his boy or girl, we must increase the salary of this group to make it attractive. A study of salary conditions throughout the County shows that the maximum salary of elementary teachers is less than \$1000 and the average less than \$20 per week. As a result of this there is a scarcity of elementary teachers in the County and almost any person with a teaching certificate is able to procure a position. As a result many people are in the teaching profession who would be more successful in some other line of work. I believe we should improve this situation in the County by doing two things: 1. Establish a minimum salary for elementary teachers high enough

to attract our best young people. 2. Have a long range program of consolidation of rural schools making more two or three teacher schools centrally located.

I am very proud of the training and professional attitude of our teaching force. A large percentage of them are improving themselves by summer school and teacher training courses. Every special teacher, except in the commercial course, has a degree in his line of work. Your superintendent, high school principal and two high school teachers hold Master's degrees in Education. Three elementary teachers hold degrees. Eighteen elementary teachers who were graduates of the two-year normal school course have taken special summer school work and evening courses so that they will receive their third-year diplomas next year. Several elementary teachers are working for their degrees. This is a healthy situation and should be encouraged. Some school systems grant a salary bonus for this work.

The purpose of all our schools should be to educate for a democracy. This we are endeavoring to do from the first grade through high school. Special courses in the National Defense program are in the process of organization. Vocational education is recommended as a necessary addition to our school system.

I hope that the statistics which follow will be of interest and of value to you.

May I take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation for the splendid cooperation given to me by teachers, school board and town officials. No one could ask for a better spirit of team work than exists in Presque Isle. I wish to have you feel that my interests are only in the improvement of the school system in Presque Isle and any suggestions which you can offer towards this end will be gratefully received.

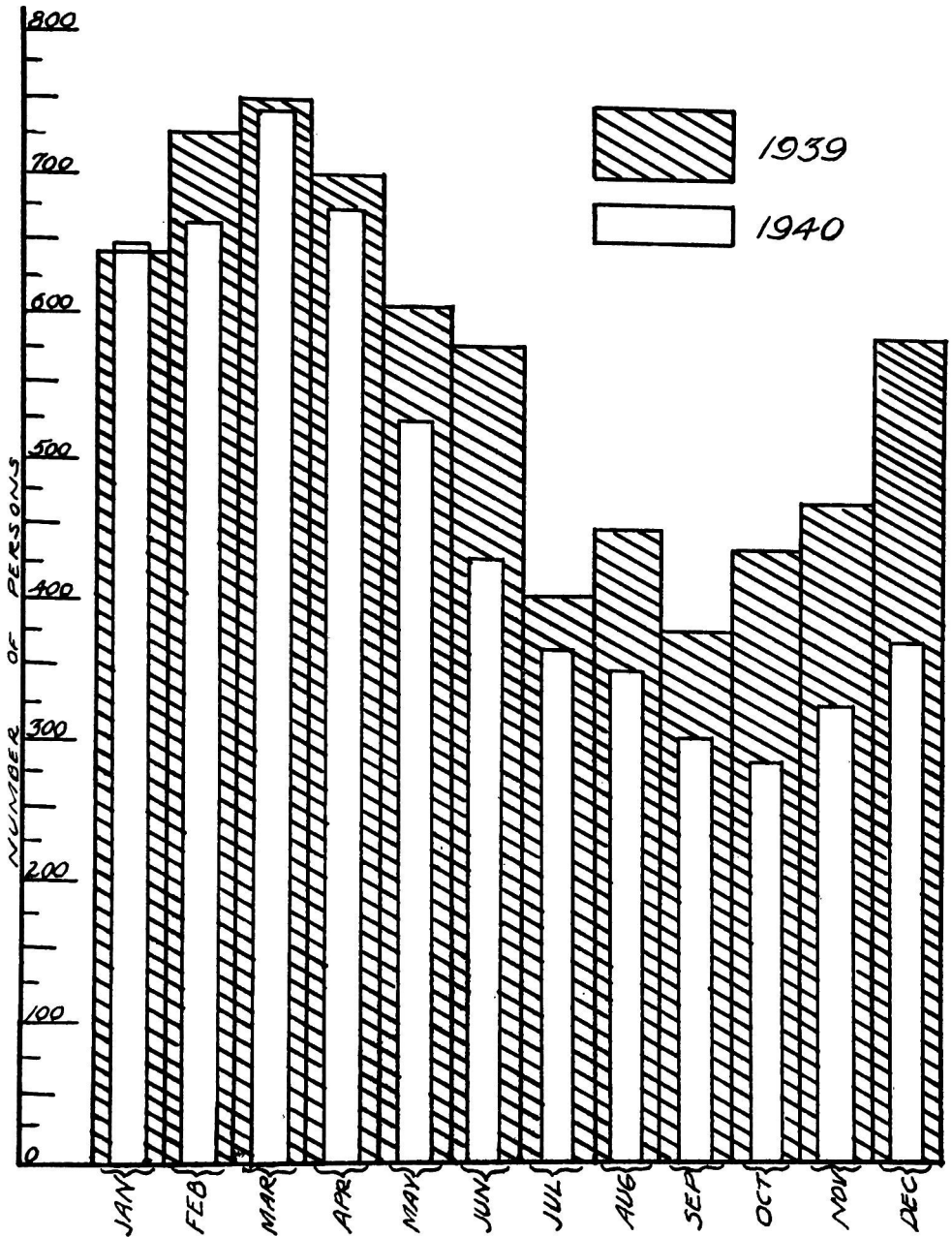

## REPORT OF CITY WELFARE DEPARTMENT

1940

The City Welfare Department, by utilizing Federal and State Relief Agencies, has been able to furnish employment to at least one employable member of family groups on relief, that has enabled them to be self sustaining and all families, to whom relief is now being furnished, are considered unemployable and in need.

Need is interpreted as existing when a family or unattached individual has neither income nor resources sufficient to maintain living standards compatible with decency and health.

The standards are of necessity on a subsistence level and cannot take into account the varying standards of living of the individuals concerned.

As a means to securing uniformity in the amount of aid to be furnished an eligible family or individual, maximum budget figures have been established.

In addition to the allowable items specified on the budget, an allowance is made for medical care when the need of such is substantiated by a statement from a physician.

Persons in the household who are not the logical breadwinners for the household, as wife, son or daughter, are considered equally responsible for the support of the family group and the entire amount of their earnings are included as income of the group.

As a result of the application of this system during 1940 a substantial reduction has been made as compared with the previous year, in the expenditures by the Welfare Department.

Four Elections were held during the year; the Primary Election on June 17, the State Election on September 9, the National Election on Nov. 5, and the City Election on December 11.

The Board of Registration is in Session nine days before each election, the first six days of which are open session for the purpose of Registering voters, the last three days being closed session to enable the Board to verify the correctness of the voting list and to complete and close its records.

The hours of open session are from nine to twelve in the forenoon, and all persons wishing to Register must appear before the Board in person and prove that they possess all the qualifications of voters.

On Election Day the Board is in continuous session for the purpose of correcting any errors which may have occurred. A woman changing her surname may appear before the Board any time it is in session and Re-register under her new name.

Whoever causes his name to be Registered, knowing that he is not a legal voter, or whoever falsely represents himself before a Board of Registration makes himself liable by a fine and imprisonment.

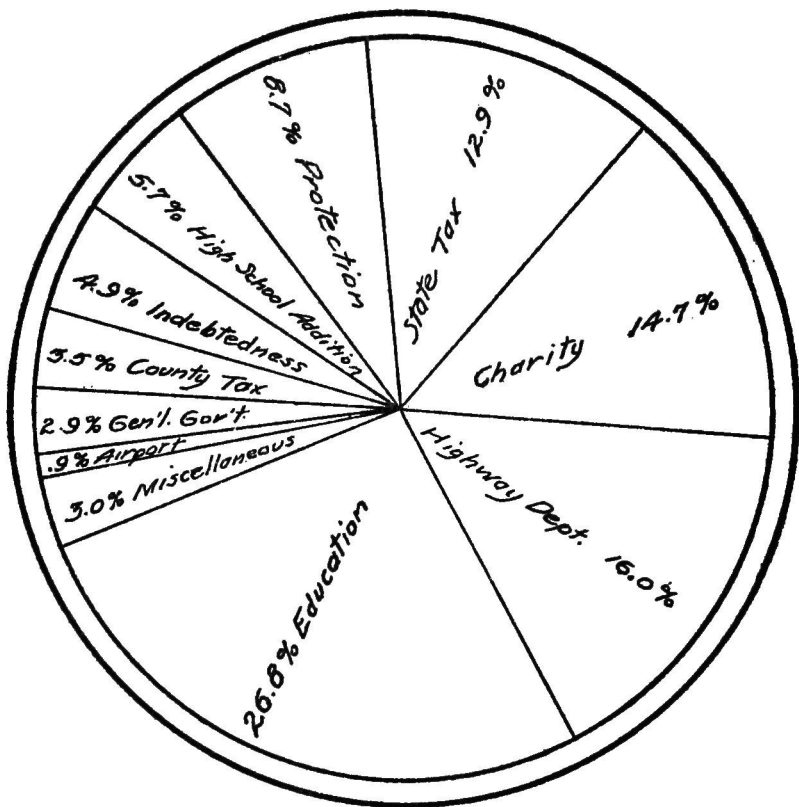
