## REPORT OF THE CITY MANAGER

---

To the Citizens of Presque Isle:

We have seen many changes in our city in the past year. Many of our citizens have left to join the armed forces or have left to do defense work in other sections of the country, and we have had many new citizens move to our community to work on the essential national defense program that is located within our city.

The property that has been taken over by the Federal Government for military purposes is not subject to local taxes, so that we have had a considerable reduction in real estate valuation subject to local municipal taxes, and since private construction is held up for the duration we have no means of gaining back, at least for the time being, the valuation that has been lost unless other means of tax revenue be used.

By order of the Federal Government, all street and highway construction has been curtailed and maintenance has had to be cut to a minimum. Asphalt can not now be obtained and only a very limited amount of tar, so that street maintenance work will now be limited to spot patching.

Our poor relief costs have been reduced to the lowest that they have been for a great many years, but on the other hand costs in other departments have been greatly increased. With the increased population, it has been necessary to increase the size of our police force and fire department, and school department costs have increased.

Our accounts have been audited by Mr. Fred Shean, certified public accountant, and his report is hereinafter printed and shows that we have so far been able to carry on our municipal affairs on a balanced budget and maintain a sound financial structure.

I want to express my appreciation to the City Council, my fellow employees and the citizens for their support and cooperation in carrying on the business of our city.

CASH: Examination revealed that all cash received is properly and promptly entered and deposited. Disbursements are made by check from properly drawn warrants. Schedule No. 1 sets forth the detail of items that make up the total cash as shown in Exhibit A.

**TAXES:** The detail lists of uncollected taxes, tax liens and property acquired through non-payment of taxes are printed in the Annual Report. No other method of verification was employed. Very good results were accomplished in this department during the year. See this subject in Report of Audit of proceeding year. See Exhibit D of this report for appropriations and abatements.

**TRUST FUND INVESTMENTS:** All investments were checked and found correct. See Schedule 7 for detail of Trusts and nature of investments.

**GENERAL:** In the belief that the figures in the exhibits and schedules of this report speak louder than words no attempt will be made here to describe the progress that was made during the year in many departments.

The "Reserve for (New) City Hall" supported by the purchase of a lot of land and the segregation of cash indicates that better quarters for the city offices will be provided as soon as possible and then the proper indexing, storing and protection of valuable records will be installed. Suspense account, Exhibit A. This account contains certain items which it was deemed advisable to suspend, until more information was available, rather than carry them to Net Deficit.

In conclusion, we want to express the feeling that some of the success of the year was due to discussions and recommendations in our efforts to serve you well last year and we especially want to thank all the city employees who were involved in this audit, for their courtesy and assistance.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT FOR 1942

---

In accordance with custom and the school laws of Maine, I herewith present to you my tenth annual report as Superintendent of schools of the City of Presque Isle.

Every effort is being made to adjust our curriculum to the needs of the time in relation to the war effort and at the same time not to lessen our emphasis on those phases of education needed for the future. To this end increased emphasis is being placed upon the fundamentals of arithmetic, reading, English, social studies, health and physical fitness. Committees of teachers have been at work studying how we may better teach the different subjects.

In the high school a new course in shop work has been introduced with about eighty boys enrolled. In spite of the difficulties of organization and the obtaining of equipment, it is filling a definite need. Given time, this course can be made one of the most important in high school. Because increased emphasis is being placed upon physical fitness, the Victory Corps is being organized in high school. Every junior and senior boy is being given three periods a week of strenuous physical exercise as recommended by the War Department. In connection with the physical fitness and health program we need a regular school physician and full time school nurse. For the next school year we will need to combine some courses in order to make room for essential war preparation courses. I would recommend that not more than three years of Latin be offered; that first year civics and fourth year government be combined in a one-year course; that one year of American history be required of all high school pupils; and that more emphasis be placed on practical mathematics. There is probably no course in high school so necessary for girls as Home Economics. It is recommended that every girl be required to have at least one year in this course in order to better prepare herself for home making. Because of the shortage of typewriters and the need for trained people in commercial work, the state department will not allow typewriters to be used by students who are not being trained for vocational work. For this reason many college preparatory students could not take this subject. It is now being made a three year course. Sophomores who show an aptitude for it will be allowed to continue for one or two years.

## REPORT OF FIRE CHIEF

The Fire Department answered a total of 220 calls during the year 1942. Of these, 118 were still calls answered by the men stationed in the Hose House, and losses from all fires are estimated at \$41,340.00 for the year.

In controlling these fires, the department laid 10,390 feet of hose, pumped water 23  $\frac{3}{4}$  hours and raised 2418 feet of ladders. The equipment used was as follows:

- One 1917 300-Gal. American LaFrance Pumper
- One 1924 1000-Gal. American LaFrance Pumper
- One 1937 100-Gal. Chevrolet Booster Truck
- One 1931 Mack City Service Ladder Truck
- One 1929 Chevrolet Pick-up, Hose and Lighting Truck

The 1924 Pumper has been completely rebuilt and equipped with a Booster Tank and new tires. The 1917 Pumper has been equipped with new wheels and tires. We purchased during the year, 500 feet of 2½-inch hose 500 feet of 1½-inch hose, a special spray pipe and a special pipe for gasoline and oil fires.

The Department has had two full-time men in the house during the past year, and we hope to have another full-time man for the coming year.
