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Town Warrant.

To George M. Esty, a Constable of the Town of Rangeley, County of Franklin, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Rangeley, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town, on Monday, the third day of March next, at I o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

- ART. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- ART. 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.
- ART. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.
- ART. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair highways and bridges the ensuing year.
- ART. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for a State road.
- ART. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of text-books and school supplies for the ensuing year.
- ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.
- ART. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on town debt.
- ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on indebtedness.
- ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Fish Hatchery, and how the same shall be expended.
- ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for building and repairing of sidewalks.

- ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town charges.
- ART. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
- ART. 15. To see if the town will vote to abate any part of F. S. Dickson's highway tax, and if so how much.
- ART. 16. To see if the town will vote to have the taxes collected same as last year and, if so, how much money shall be raised to pay discount on same.
- ART. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Library.
- ART. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay J. A. Russell for public watering tub.
- ART. 19. To see if the town will vote to buy a schoolhouse lot and to build a modern schoolhouse and, if so, what sum of money it will vote to raise for same.
- ART. 20. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall for the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town, at 12.30 P. M., on the day of said meeting.

Superintendent's Report.

Citizens of Rangeley:

I have the honor of submitting the following report for your consideration.

All the schools in town have been given thirty weeks instruction, nearly every scholar has made good progress, the majority of the teachers have done their duty faithfully and well.

The Primary department has been crowded for the past two terms and one teacher cannot give the proper attention that each pupil requires in trying to teach such a large number in so small a room.

The Grammar room is also taxed to its uttermost for want of space. With the number of scholars increasing from year to year as they are at present in our town, we need a new and modern school building, so that the Primary may be divided into two grades and the High and Grammar can have separate rooms. We have placed new and modern seats in the Intermediate room. A few new ones have been added to the Primary room. The White schoolhouse has been repaired and several new seats placed therein. Six new charts have been placed in the rooms at a cost of \$90.00, to be paid for in one year's time.

I regret that the money for school books has been overdrawn, but the books in many of the schools were worthless and had to be replaced by new ones. We now have quite a large number of new books on hand.

The town needs a place to keep its school books in where they will not have to be moved as often as superintendents change.

Recommendations.

- 1. That we raise \$850.00 for support of common schools.
- 2. That we expend \$500.00 for Free High school.
- 3. That we raise \$250.00 for text-books and to pay for the charts.
- 4. That we raise \$100.00 for repairs.
