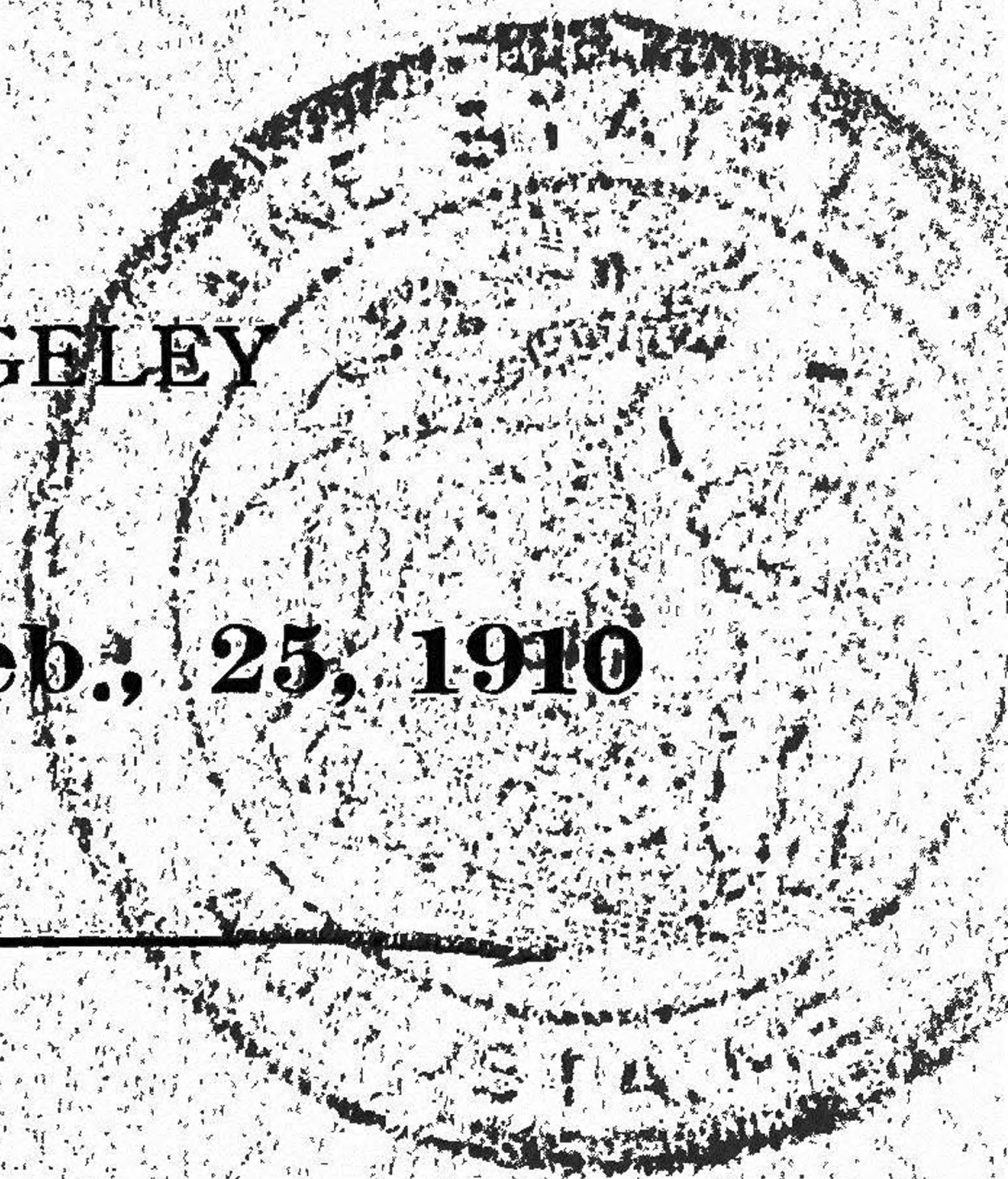

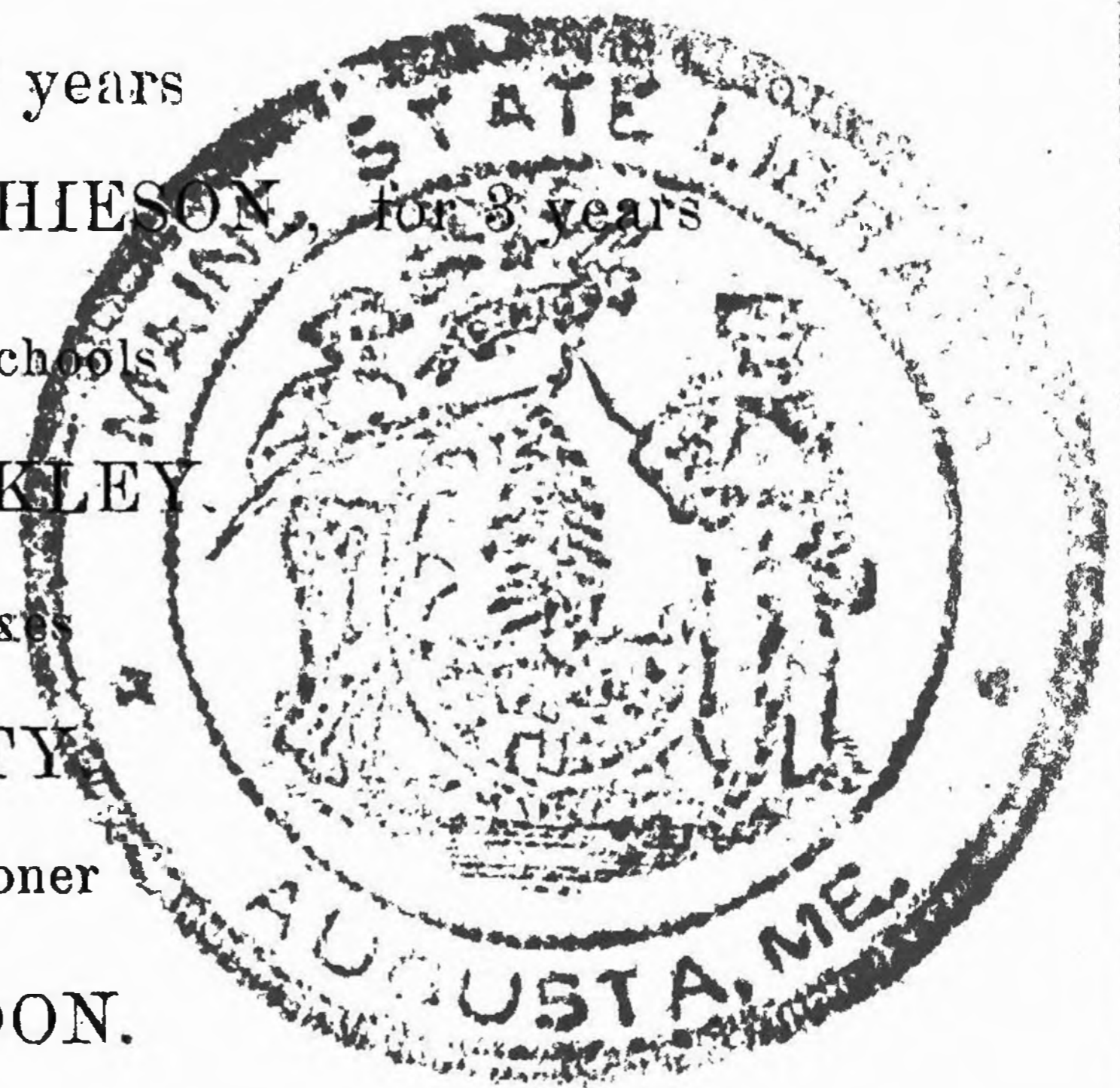

## Town Warrant.

FRANKLIN S S

STATE OF MAINE.

*To George M. Esty, a constable in the town of Rangeley in  
in said County greeting:*

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Rangeley qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall in said town, on the Seventh day of March, A. D. 1910, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles to wit;

FIRST.— To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

SECOND.— To hear and accept reports of Town Officers.

THIRD.— To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

FOURTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the support of Common Schools for the year ensuing.

FIFTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the support of a Free High School for the year ensuing.

SIXTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the purchase of text-books for the year ensuing,

SEVENTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the repair of School Houses for the year ensuing.

EIGHTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the year ensuing.

NINTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways, for the year ensuing.

TENTH.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for repair of bridges, for the year ensuing.



**ELEVENTH.**— To see if the town will vote “yes” or “no” upon the adoption of the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907 as amended by Chapter 69 of the Public Laws of 1909, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to State aid for highways for the year 1910.

**TWELFTH.**— To see if the town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the sum of \$450. being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Chapter 112 of the Public Laws of Maine for the year 1907, and amended by Chapter 69 Public Laws of 1909.

**THIRTEENTH.**— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for breaking winter roads for the year ensuing.

**FOURTEENTH.** To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise to pay interest on town bonds for the year ensuing.

**FIFTEENTH.**— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise to build and repair sidewalks in Rangeley Village for the year ensuing.

**SIXTEENTH.**— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise pay for the observance of Memorial Day, and how the same shall be expended.

**SEVENTEENTH.**— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise for the Library Association.

**EIGHTEENTH.**— To see what the town will vote to rent the Town House for, to the Grange for one year.

**NINETEENTH.**— To see if the town will vote to extend the sidewalk on Allen Street to Oquossoc Avenue.

**TWENTIETH.**— To see if the town will vote to have the taxes collected the same as last year, so far as discount and interest are concerned; and if so how much money, the town will raise to pay discount on the same.

TWENTY-FIRST.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise to pay insurance.

TWENTY-SECOND.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise to pay the Rangeley Water Company for use of water for year ensuing.

TWENTY-THIRD.— To see what sum of money, the town will vote to raise to pay town charges for the year ensuing.

TWENTY-FOURTH.— To see if the town will vote to have a Selectmens office, if so, to raise money for the same.

TWENTY-FIFTH.— To see if town will vote to have the town lines run, and if so, to raise money for the same.

TWENTY-SIXTH.— To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the Selectmen, record of which was filed with the town clerk, Feb. 15, 1910- Munyon Spring road.

TWENTY-SEVENTH.— To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the Selectmen, record of which was filed with the town clerk, Feb. 15, 1910. Richardson road so called, and if accepted, how much money shall be raised to build the same.

TWENTY-EIGHTH.— To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the selectmen record of which was filed with the town Clerk. Feb. 28 A. D. 1910. Amos Ellis road so called and if accepted how much money shall be raised to build the same.

TWENTY-NINTH.— To see if the town will vote to accept the town way as laid out by the selectmen record of which was filed with the town Clerk Feb. 28 A. D. 1910. Weiss road so called and if accepted how much money shall be raised to build the same.

THIRTIETH.— To see what sum of money if any the town will vote to raise to grade up the lot at the west end of the village school house.

THIRTY-FIRST.— To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Apparatus for the schools.



THIRTY SECOND.— To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to take care of the over-flow from the cesspool at Village School House, and how the same shall be expended.

THIRTY-THIRD. To see what action the town will vote to take relative to joining with other towns in employing a district Superintendent of schools.

THIRTY-FOURTH.— To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate money to pay the unpaid bills of J. A. Russell & Co., and A. L. Oakes.

THIRTY-FIFTH.— To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall at 12 o'clock noon, March 7th 1910, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

# SCHOOL REPORT.

RANGELEY, MAINE Feb. 25 — 1910

*To the Municipal Officers and Citizens of Rangeley.*

I herewith present my report of the condition of schools in town for the past year

During the fall term the pupils in the High School labored under difficulties. The attendance was greater than ever before, the room was small and crowded, and there was no suitable place for the Chemistry Class to perform its work. An addition has since been built which furnishes two excellent school rooms, one for the High School, the other for the Primary Grades. The Sub.primary room has been made larger and the room formerly used as a High School room made into a laboratory with modern equipments.

A class of five was graduated from the High School last spring, two of whom are attending Bates College. In order to get our High School ranked in Class A it was necessary to have 36 weeks of school, to finish the laboratory room and furnish a suitable amount of apparatus as ordered by the State Inspector of Schools. This incurred an extra expense of about \$300 00 but, having done it we shall be allowed \$500 00 from the state for Free High School, instead of \$250 00 each year, as formerly. In the rural districts with the exception of the White School, it was thought best to have no winter term the pupils being mostly small and living some distance away, This year the law requires at least 26 weeks of school in each district. Many of the school books throughout the town are in very poor condition and must be replaced by new ones, and in several instances a change in text books would be advisable.

We have been fortunate in securing an able corps of teachers for the village schools who have worked for the advancement of their pupils, In the rural schools, also, most of the teachers have given satisfaction and some of the pupils have done exceptionally good work. During the past year the Rangeley High School has won in both the interscholastic track meets thus winning the silver cup.

For several years there has not been enough money raised by the town to purchase the needed amount of text books, supplies, repairs etc and pay the deficit of the year before. I would recommend that this year an amount be raised to balance all accounts and provide for next years emergencies.
