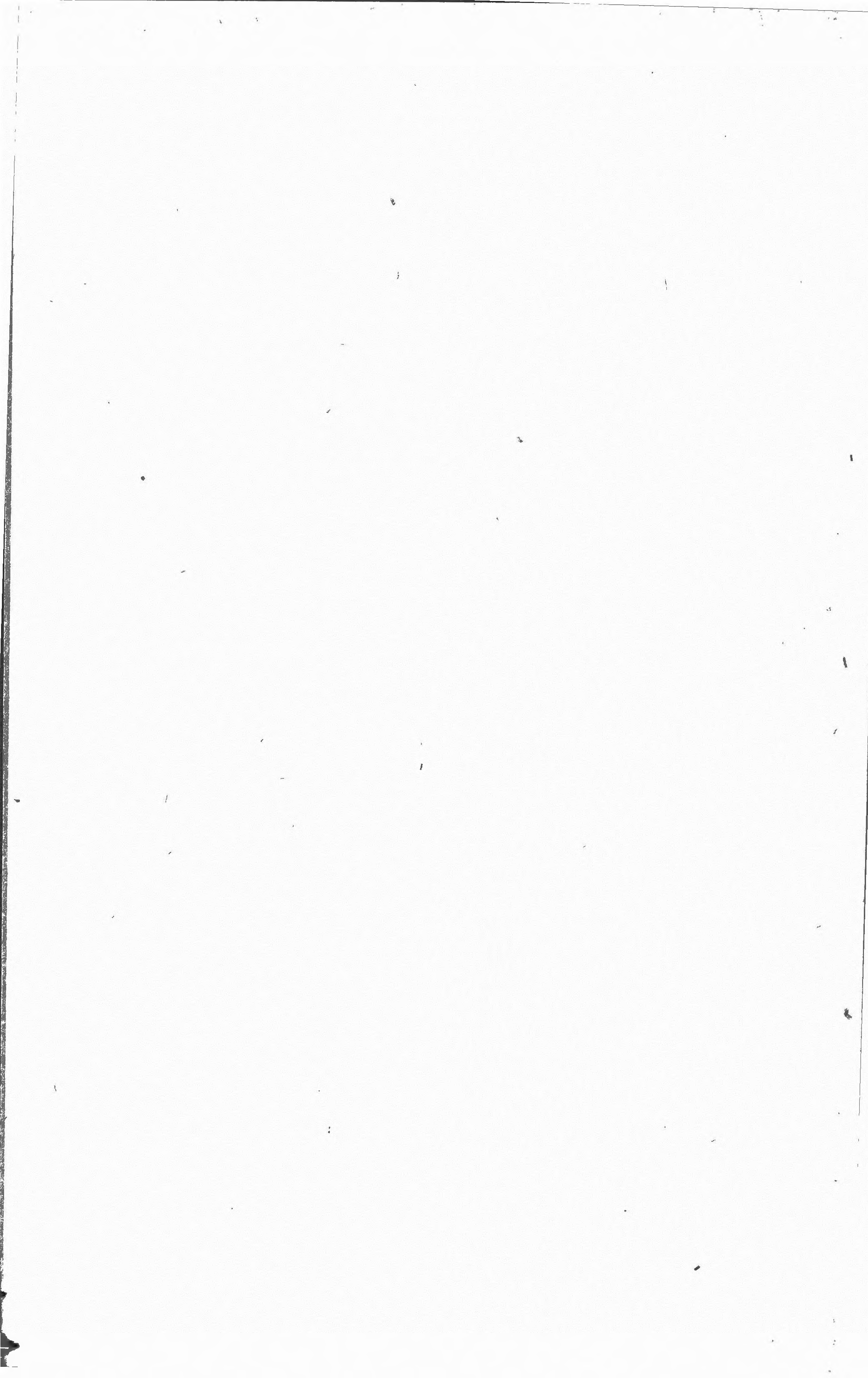

# TOWN WARRANT

*To William Tomlinson, a Constable of the Town of Rangeley, in the County of Franklin.*

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Rangeley, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the town house in said town, on the first day of March, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, to wit.:

ARTICLE 1.

To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2.

To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3.

To hear reports of town officers and take action thereon.

ARTICLE 4.

To choose all other town officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 5.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 6.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of a Free High School for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 7.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purchase of text books for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 8.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of school houses for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 9.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay for apparatus for the schools for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 10.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 11.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 12.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of bridges for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 13.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking winter roads for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 14.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on town bonds for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 15.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to build and repair sidewalks in Rangeley Village for the ensuing year, and how the same shall be expended.

## ARTICLE 16.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay for the observance of Memorial Day, and how the same shall be expended.

## ARTICLE 17.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Library Association for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 18.

To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes, and if so, how much, and how much money shall be raised to pay discount.

## ARTICLE 19.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay Rangeley Water Company for the use of water for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 20.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town charges for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 21.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay the expenses of office for the selectmen for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 22.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town officers for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 23.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay abatement of taxes for the ensuing year.

## ARTICLE 24.

To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided by Section 20 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

## ARTICLE 25.

To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$666.00 for the improvements of the section of state aid road as outlined in the report of the state highway commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of way, highways and bridges the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provision of Section 19 of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

## ARTICLE 26.

To see whether the town will vote to raise money, and what sum, for the maintenance of state and state aid highways during the

ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Sections 9 and 18 of Chapter 130, of the Public Laws of 1913.

ARTICLE 27.

To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay on town debt and outstanding orders.

ARTICLE 28.

To see if the town will vote to repair or fix up the belfry in the Village Schoolhouse so as to prevent any snow, rain or moisture getting onto or around the town clock, if so to raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 29.

To see if the town will vote to widen the road from the Indian Rock Road at Oquossoc to Bald Mountain stable, if so to raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 30.

To see if the town will vote to elect one or more fire wards as required by Chapter 108 of the Public Laws of 1913, and to take any other action relative to the same that the town may so vote.

ARTICLE 31.

To see if the town will vote to cut a trail from or near Oquossoc to Bald Mountain Road, within or near the limits of the present town way, if so, to proceed to raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 32.

To see if the town will vote to raise money for police protection, if so, how much.

ARTICLE 33.

To see if the town will vote to raise money if so, how much, to set out shade trees in Rangeley Village, provided the Rangeley Village Improvement Society will contribute the same amount making a joint fund, and how same shall be expended.

ARTICLE 34.

To see if the town will vote to have the streets in Rangeley Village sprinkled, and if so, to raise money for same, or take any other action relative thereto.

## ARTICLE 35.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the Town Hall, at 12.30 o'clock in the afternoon on the day of said meeting.

*To the Citizens of the Town of Rangeley; I hereby submit my report for the year ending February 1, 1915.*

The school year has passed without anything of moment to interfere with the work. The attendance has been good and there seems to be a good feeling between teachers and pupils.

During the summer a substantial concrete walk was built from the steps of the village school house to the street.

The district school buildings are in a good state of repair, but I would recommend uniting the wood shed at Oquossoc to the school house, and changing the closets as has been done at the White school.

The Wilbur school has remained discontinued during the past year as the number of scholars has remained below that required by law, and the scholars have been conveyed to and from the village school.

There have been several changes in the teaching staff during past year, and the teachers have all given a good account of themselves. There has been a spirit of loyalty among the teachers, and an air of business and purpose.

The high school has maintained a higher average in attendance than any previous year, and the work done is of a high order.

I wish to thank the members of the School Board for their loyalty and support.

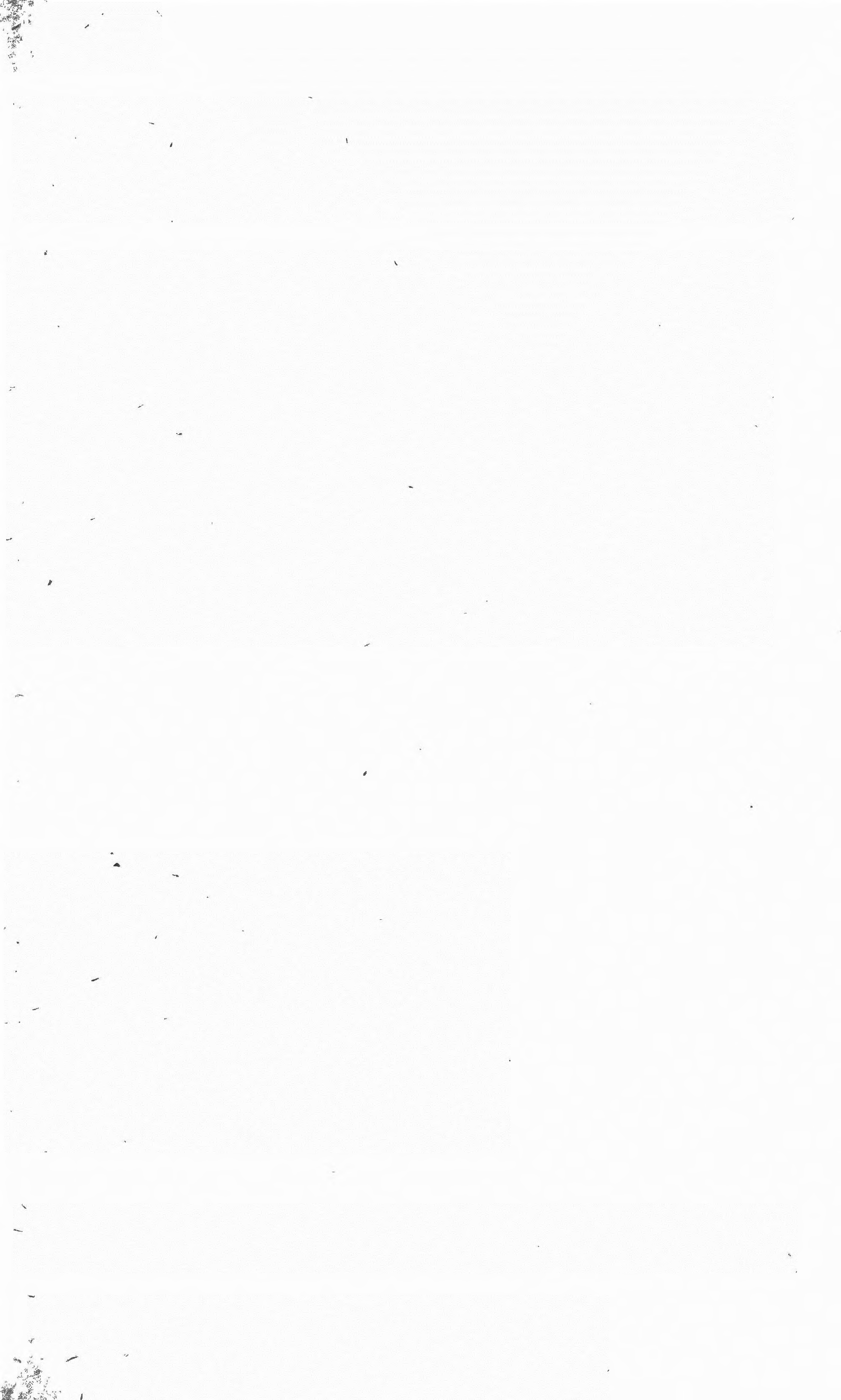
