The curriculum of the High School has been changed and new studies introduced.

To-day your scholars on entering the High School can elect one of the three following courses: College Preparatory, Commercial, English Classical. One of the graduates of the class of 1900 entered Bowdoin College, unconditionally. This I believe to be sufficient evidence that your High School ranks well as a College Preparatory.

The Commercial Course gives the scholars an opportunity to continue his drill in mathematics, to practice writing and to ascertain whether or not he has an aptitude for business.

Of course your High School can not give as complete a training in Business Methods as a school that makes a specialty of these subjects, yet a graduate from this course should be qualified to keep a complicated set of books.

The English Classical includes the modern law gauges. Here we have endeavored to acquaint the pupils with the best English authors, as well as to give instruction in Chemistry, Botany and other important studies that will prepare him for the regular routine of life.

The Commercial and English Courses are so arranged that the scholars can elect studies from either.

The attendance has been most gratifying. For the school year almost every seat in the schoolroom has been occupied by an enthusiastic scholar.

The roof of the High School building has been shingled on the east and patched on the west side. If the interior should be painted and the walls and ceiling should be stained, an improvement would be made that would be appreciated by both teachers and scholars.

GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

Mr. L. O. Packard requested a year's leave of absence that he might study Pedagogy. His request was granted, hence the change in teachers. Mr. R. A. Kane came to the Superintendent School Board highly recommended and his work for the last two terms has proven that no mistake was made in our selection.

Supplementary reading has been added. The school library somewhat improved by books of reference and charts.

This school needs topographical maps, a better school library and geographical readers.

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOLS.

These schools are crowded. The teachers do not have time for individual work. This crowded condition can be relieved.

First. By keeping fourth grades in Primary Schools.

Second. By putting sixth grades in Grammar and keeping fourth grades in Intermediate schools.

If the sixth grades are put into Grammar School new seats in that building at an expense of about fifty dollars will be required as well as another teacher whose salary would amount to about two hundred and fifty dollars per year. In these schools the teachers require more time to prepare their pupils for the higher grades.

More supplementary reading especially of a historical nature is required, as well as maps, charts and a school library.

The Baldwin readers are more satisfactory than were the Hazen's. The Dantonian system of vertical writing is producing better results than did the old system

PRIMARY SCHOOLS

These schools require modern appliances and more cheerful environments. Give your teachers the above requirements and the pupils will enter the upper grades better equipped for future work.

The hourly recess has been found to be a success. Instead of one long recess we now give the pupils two, each session. At the end of each school hour a recess of five minutes is given.

This system prevents the pupils from exhausting themselves as is common to long recesses; gives the teacher an opportunity to ventilate the schoolroom, relieves the school of "asking to go out" and that nervous tension so common to Primary grades.

As supplementary reading the Ward Rational Readers, a Phonetic System, has been used in two schools; the results have been gratifying.

I recommend their use in all your Primary Grades. The Oyster River school was closed because that district did not have the average attendance required by law. When that district can register seven pupils the school can again be reopened by a vote of the town.

Showing the citizens of Thomaston what facilities they have for handling fires with a water system of 22 hydrants, 14 reservoirs and a well equipped fire department as follows, viz:

R. H. Counce Co. 1 hand engine, 2 hose reels, 30 men, 500 feet of good hose. I would recommend the town purchase 400 feet of hose for the same.

Eureka Engine Co. 1 hand engine, 1 hose reel, 1 hose wagon, 1,100 feet of good hose and 15 men.

Knox Hose Co. 1 hose wagon, 1,000 feet of good hose and 18 men.

W. O. Masters Co. 1 hose wagon, 1,000 feet of good hose, 2 fire king extinguishers, ax and bars attached to wagon, 18 men.

"Our Own" Hook and Ladder Co. well equipped with ladders of all kinds, hooks, axes and bars, and 18 men.

In addition to the above, the State has a steam engine at the Prison, reel, 1,000 feet of hose and 20 men which the town can have the use of when-ever needed.

All of the town fire apparatus is in good condition for the coming year.

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Thomaston, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Watts Hall in said town, on the 25th day of March at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Common Schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Free High School for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairing sidewalks, highways and bridges, breaking out roads and shovelling snow from sidewalks.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for town expenses.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of Wire Companies.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay Interest of Town Debt.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay on principal of town debt.

Art. 13. To see if the town will raise money to pay the Camden and Rockland Water Co. Water rent the ensuing year and if so how much.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the P. Henry Tillson Post to defray expenses on Memorial day.
