BUILDINGS

The new chemical room of the High school has been completed and the sinks in the same connected with the sewer.

The Meadows building has been painted, shingled and the chimney rebuilt. The interior has been painted and such plastering done as was needed.

The Wadsworth building had to be shingled on the southern side, causing an unexpected expense of \$44. The interior, because of the soft coal and the leaking roof, had to be kalsomined, causing another unexpected expense of \$16. The frost, by heaving the wall of the Grammar building, broke all the set bowls, causing an expense of \$50. While repairing the Baily building to properly ventilate the upper room, much decayed wood was found in a corner of the building. This wood was removed and the old and unused chimney closed, another unexpected expense.

The sewer of the High school has given us much trouble, but the defect has been corrected. When the appropriation for the chemical room was made no money was appropriated to furnish the same. The room has been fairly well furnished. The above are the causes for the overdraft on the repair account. The severity of the winter caused a large fuel bill, hence the increased expense of the common schools.

All of the school buildings today are in good repair and no special appropriation is needed.

The material now used in the making of text books is so poor that these books will not wear as long as those of the past decade.

The Superintending School Committee, after careful examination, decided to adopt the new Walsh arithmetic. The objection to the old book was that it did not contain any rules and was too special in nature. The new Walsh seems to have all the good qualities of the old book and many new and valuable features.

A new and modern grammar has been introduced in the Grammar school. This book, the Hyde, was adopted only after all the other reputable books had been thoroughly examined.

Morton's small geography is now used instead of the old Natural. The new book has much better illustrations and is an "easier" book for the small grades.

Those teachers in the Primary schools that desired kindergarten material have been supplied with the same.

The resignations of Lela Miller, Lenora Bessey, Ardele Morse, Rose Moran and Vidae Gardiner were filled by the election of Nettie Sampson, Elizabeth Johnson, Margaret Ruggles, Edith Wilson and Jessie Stewart, in the above named order.

Corporal punishment has been prohibited by the Superintending School Committee.

More red tape has been enacted by the state officials.

To Seth V. Robbins, a constable of the Town of Thomaston, in the County of Knox.

GREETING:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Thomaston, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Watts Hall in said town, on the 28th day of March, 1904, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:—

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, Overseers of Poor, School Committee, Road Commissioner and all town officers.

Art. 4. To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Treasurer, Overseers of Poor, Superintending School Committee, Road Commissioner, Auditor and all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Common Schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Free High School for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the support of the Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairing sidewalks, highways and bridges, breaking out roads and shoveling snow from sidewalks.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for town expenses.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of Fire Companies.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay interest on town debt.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay on principal of town debt.

Art. 13. To see if the town will raise money to pay water rent for the ensuing year, and if so, how much.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the P. Henry Tillson Post to defray expenses on Memorial day.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for care of cemetery for the ensuing year.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the purchase of text books.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise for repairs on school buildings, supplies, incidental expenses, etc.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay School Superintendent.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay Superintending School Committee.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will raise for lighting streets the ensuing year.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to purchase hard pine lumber for sidewalks, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to discount on taxes paid before a certain date, when and how much, and charge interest after a certain date.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to select a committee including the Selectmen, Superintendent of Schools, Road Commissioner, Treasurer, Auditor and other citizens, to investigate articles in the warrant of Annual Meeting of 1905, calling for appropriations of money, and to report recommendations at said meeting.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to build a road as provided by law for State Road and, if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise money for bills of contagious diseases, and if so, what sum they will raise for said purpose.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to build a hose tower for the Knox Hose Company and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will raise to pay for running expenses of street sprinkler.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to establish an electric light on Wadsworth street near Hyler street.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to build a sewer on Gleason street from Gillchrest street to the Lawry house, and appropriate two hundred and fifty dollars for that purpose.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to dig a drain in front of the premises of James W. Reed on east side of Beechwood street, and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to purchase a horse for the town farm, and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the sidewalk on the west side of Beechwood street from the southerly line of the Robinson stable, so called, to a point near the Simmons blacksmith shop.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to purchase hard pine plank to repair the southerly end of the lower toll bridge, so called, and how much money they will raise for said purpose.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to raise fifty dollars to reimburse the Knox Hose Company for money expended on their building.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Road Commissioner to remove board or picket fence near the Decrow Place, so called; on the Marsh Road, and substitute wire therefor.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the east side of Beechwood street from its present terminus to the residence of Rosa Donato.

Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Superintending School Committee or Superintendent of Schools to open school in Beechwood street school house.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to repair Whalen's bridge, so called, and if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote to repair the R. H. Counce engine house and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to allow Jefferson Faulkner to connect his house by pipe with and take water from the reservoir on Brooklyn Heights.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to purchase machinery for permanent road building and, if so, how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to purchase six hundred and fifty feet of hose for the W. O. Masters and the Knox Hose Companies and how much money they will raise for that purpose.

Art. 43. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to accept one hundred dollars from the estate of Sarah J. Wight for perpetual care of the John Wight burial lot.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at their office on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, the 24, 25 and 26th days of March, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of correcting and revising the list of voters.
