ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT.

I hereby submit the fourth annual report of the condition of the fire department for the year ending Feb. 1, 1901, containing a full and complete list of its officers and members, condition of apparatus, number of fires, the cause, the loss and insurance as near as could be ascertained, the amount of money expended and recommendations.

FORCE OF DEPARTMENT.

The force of the department consists of forty-three men, classed as follows: One Chief Engineer, two assistant engineers, five firemen, five assistant firemen, thirty-two hosemen, ladder-men and axe-men.

FIRE AND ALARMS.

The number of alarms the department has responded to from Feb. 1, 1900 to Feb. 1, 1901, are as follows. One still alarm from Miss L. A. Foster's house, Main street, Oct. 23d, 5:30 o'clock p. m. Cause, fire in wood work around chimney, a narrow escape from a large fire. Handled by chemical from Noble Maxwell Hose Co., No. 1.

Two bell alarms from Wilson Chetley house, North Front street, April 6, 4:5 o'clock p. m. Department responded quickly, laid a line of hose from hydrant No. 9, North Front street, got a good water pressure and extinguished fire without any damage.

From Bag Mill Dec. 19, 5:30 o'clock p. m. Department responded in its usual quick time. As there was no fire the department was ordered back.

LOSSES AND INSURANCE.

The entire loss by fire this year will not exceed five dollars, which was to Miss Foster's house. The fire, as stated elsewhere, was in wood work around chimney. No insurance.

APPARATUS.

The apparatus in the department consists of two hose wagons, with two pony chemicals each, one hose reel, one hook and ladder truck, and three sleds for winter use for hose, two pony chemicals on Mt. Pleasant, at Eugene Rankins' residence and F. P. Hathorn's residence, one each. In reserve we have one hand engine and hose reel.

DETAILED STATEMENT OF APPARATUS.

Noble Maxwell Hose Co. No. 1, house on Main street near railroad. Apparatus in fine condition.

Independent Hose Co. No. 2, house on South Front street. Apparatus in fine condition.

Volunteer Hose Co., No. 3, house on North Front street. Apparatus in first-class condition.

HOSE.

There are 1,800 feet of hose in the department classed as follows: 1,500 feet 2 1-2 in first-class, and 300 feet of old 2 inch hose in very poor condition. They leak badly and cannot be depended on for fire service.

RECOMMENDATION.

I would recommend the purchase of 500 feet of 2 1/2 inch hose, which will make 2000 feet of good regulation hose, which would be a small amount for a village of this size. I would recommend an appropriation of \$650 for the fire department for the year 1901.

Every branch of the department has been maintained in as effective condition as in the past, which is a sufficient guarantee that it is in first-class condition excepting lack of hose, and the members of the several companies will render as good service in the future as has been their custom in the past.
