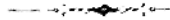

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Unity:

Another fiscal school year has passed, and in compliance with custom and the law of our state, I submit to you this my second annual report.

The annual teachers' meeting was held in Albion. All the teachers were present. The forenoon was given over to a general session with Miss Buck, leader of the Health Crusade, as speaker.

In the afternoon Mr. Josiah Taylor of the State Department spoke to the teachers at the high school and Superintendents Clifford of Boothbay Harbor, and Rowe of Warren spoke to the elementary teachers. Mr. Rowe, representative of Ginn & Co., gave a demonstration in the teaching of geography.

The same corps of teachers remained with us during the spring term, as last reported. The fall term opened with Mrs. Emma Edgerly in the intermediate room, Miss Alta Smith at Farwell's Corner and Miss Thelma Fogg at the Kelley school. The other teachers continuing in their respective schools.

Miss Smith resigned her position which took effect at the Christmas vacation, to accept a position in a high school in Massachusetts. This position was filled by Miss Lillian Davis of Belfast.

This has been a very successful school year. The pupils have made excellent progress in all the schools. Many favorable comments could be made in connection with the individual teacher.

Unity is justified in boasting of her good teachers, and of the excellent schools. Only one criticism has come up during the year and that is scarcely justifiable.

More than one parent has been heard to say, "I will be glad when my child goes to school," and this because of the care they require. The teacher has several to look after and control, and is deserving of some consideration, even when things do not go just as we wish they should.

BOOKS

Your text-books in English were old and out of date, so instead of patching up, a new book was introduced.

In making the selection, I placed several sample copies at the disposal of the teachers, and they made their choice which met with my approval.

Your texts are now all of the best, except history, but I do not favor discarding a book that is usable.

REPAIRS

Flush toilets have been installed at the village elementary school, also a drinking fountain. The system is similar to the one at the high school. We, at first, experienced some trouble with it, and did not accept it until the plumber installed a different pump.

The water has been analyzed and found to contain some foreign element. We believe we are now free from it,

but shall clean the well during the summer vacation and put a concrete curb over it.

GIFT

We acknowledge the gift of an organ to the grammar school by Mrs. Lowell. This is serving its purpose, as it aids in school programs.

HIGH SCHOOL

The fall term opened with two new teachers, Mr. Clyde Hall, a graduate of U. of M., as principal, and Miss Annie Leavitt, a graduate of Bates College, as assistant.

The school is doing good work in the class-room, and good discipline is maintained.

The average scholarship is above normal, but like all schools there are some satisfied with only a passing mark. You will find everywhere the good, the poor and indifferent, and your school is made up mostly of the first group of whom we hear but little. Why not speak of the good work of the majority, instead of that done by this small lot classified as the indifferent.

An invitation was extended the public to aid in grading the school grounds, but only the committee and myself were present, nevertheless a start was made and later put in very

good shape at little expense.

Mr. Wood, with his boys, went out after trees and planted them around the school lots. Later, he erected the flag pole.

The girls have been invited to start geraniums for planting in the spring. I now ask the high school to celebrate next Arbor Day in decorating your grounds with plants, and other trees, if necessary.

At the opening of the fall term, I found the number of students enrolled slightly larger than the preceding year. There are at present 60 students in school and they are classified as follows:

So far only four students have left school, three freshmen and one junior. Of these, two left, because they were unable to do the work, one left because of homesickness, and one found it necessary to leave to go to work.

The number of cases of absence and tardiness are very

great this year. During the fall term many boys found it necessary to stay at home to work. And this term there has been a great deal of sickness.

The course of study remains practically the same as last year, with the exception that all seniors are required to take review mathematics. This course consists of a review of algebra, arithmetic and geometry. I would like to advise that a course in commercial geography be introduced next year. Such a course, given in conjunction with commercial arithmetic, one half year of each, would, in my mind, be very beneficial to the student.

I find that in nearly all instances the entering classes are coming to us very well prepared. Although I do feel that in some cases pupils enter high school far too young. I find also, that in nearly all cases of failure this year the cause will be, lack of study or indifference on the part of the student.

In the past year we have not had as many visits from parents as I should have liked to have had. This is your school, and in order to judge us fairly, come in and visit us; do not trust too much to what others tell you. I also feel that there are cases where the student does not receive the proper encouragement at home. To do creditable work a boy or girl must study. And it has been my experience that boys and girls of high school age have to be compelled to study by some one. An hour and a half each night is none too little in nearly all cases.

In the majority of cases of reckless conduct about town by high school students, that have come to my attention, I find that a part of the blame rests with the parents. Are you positive that your boy or girl has the best possible surroundings and influences?

But do not judge the school by a select few. A too hasty opinion may be an unjust criticism of the school. If some regulation could be made and enforced whereby the students would have to remain at home evenings it would do away with many of these disgraceful occurrences.

This year we have added somewhat to our equipment, but there are still many things that we need. There is the ever-present need for more and newer reference books. Two or three good magazines, as the Literary Digest and the National Geographic would be very helpful. I understand that it has already been decided that more blackboards are to be installed. This is a much needed improvement, as we are greatly hampered by lack of board room.

The road to the school has been filled in and graded. Now, in the spring if a few more improvements are added to the school grounds by the students, it will add much to the outer appearance of the school building.

In closing I wish to say that you have a fine school, one that is a credit to the town; a school that deserves to be advertised. It is located so as to draw students from the surrounding towns, and with the opening of another year there should be a large increase in the enrollment.

I wish to express my appreciation of the way in which all school matters have been handled by the supt. of schools, the school committee and other town officials. And I wish to thank the citizens of the town for their loyal support.

Report of Teacher of Agriculture

To the citizens of the town of Unity:

The work in Agriculture this year is devoted to a study of poultry. Outside of the text-book we have carried on practical work by keeping a flock of twenty-five pullets in the house on the school grounds. These birds are tested stock from the University of Maine. We have carried on trap nesting with them and a few have missed very few days since starting to lay in November.

We plan to hatch and brood from individual birds just as soon as vacation is over this spring. This will all be carried on at the schoolhouse. These birds are owned by Lloyd Simpson and myself. They are White Leg Horns.

In shop work this year the boys spent about three weeks learning to file saws. We worked on all kinds that the boys brought in. A few of the boys became very proficient, especially on the cross-cut, where the teeth are large enough to see clearly.

Another job we have nearly finished is building a set of double sleds. This is quite a job to take up with the boys, but they do very good work and surely learn something that is of use to them. This gives them a fair knowledge of heating, bending, drilling and working iron, also an idea of laying out and assembling work.

The project work this year was very good. All the boys except one finished a very good project. The boys raising certified seed got good yields and sold their seed for a handsome profit.

I would like to say here that I have enjoyed working with the boys in Unity and hope they have gained thru my instruction. Also I wish to thank the parents and people of Unity for the support they have given me to put my work across. I would like to ask the people of Unity to give the same spirit of cooperation to the man who takes my place next year. I feel that it is a good course for the town and that it will grow to be a permanent part of your school.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Unity, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in the Town House, in said Unity, on Monday, the 14th day of March A. - Art 8 To choose by ballot one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.

- Art 9 To choose by ballot one or more fire wardens for the ensuing year, to fix their compensation and raise money for the same.
- Art 10 To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art 11 To see what method the town will take in relation to the collection of taxes, and see if the town will vote to allow a discount or rebate on all taxes paid before a certain date, and if so establish such date or dates and the amount of such rebate or discount.
- Art 12 To see if the town by its vote will set the date when its taxes assessed and committed for the year 1927 shall become due.
- Art 13 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the payment of rebate or discount on taxes, if so, how much.
- Art 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of poor for the ensuing year.
- Art 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of roads and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of miscellaneous expenses.
- Art 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote to

raise and appropriate for the repair of school buildings.

- Art 19 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$330 to pay for lighting the streets of the village for the ensuing year, as per contract with the Central Maine Power Co.
- Art 20 To see if the town will vote yes or no on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid road, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916
- Art 21 To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$1599.00 for the improvement of the section of state aid road, as outlined by the state highway commission in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, or raise the sum of \$533.00, it being the minimum amount the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of state aid highways for the ensuing year.
- Art 23 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town bills until taxes are collected.
- Art 24 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to redeem one or more of the

- schoolhouse bonds and also raise the sum of \$300 to pay interest on the above bonds to July 1, 1927
- Art 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- Art 26 To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100 from estate of E M Jones, the income of which to be used for perpetual care of lot in Pond cemetery.
- Art 27 To see if the town will vote to join with the state and county in building one or more of the three bridges; namely, Bither, Oxbow and Outlet bridges, so called, as recommended and estimated by the state highway bridge engineer.
- Art 28 To see if the town will vote to raise money to cover the estimated cost of one or more of the bridges, if so, determine how it shall be raised.
- Art 29 To see if the town will vote to maintain a school at the Kelley Dist, the average attendance having fallen below the required number.
- Art 30 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 for agricultural equipment.
- Art 31 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150 for insurance and lights for school buildings.
- Art 32 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for elementary and secondary schools, including teachers' wages, board, fuel, janitors' services, conveyance, tuition and board

of pupils, text-books, reference books and school supplies for desk and laboratory use.

- Art 33 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to pay money hired to repair Outlet bridge, as per vote of the town at a special meeting held June 12, 1926.
- Art 34 To see if the town will vote to allow such bills and accounts as shall be laid before them.
- Art 35 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session one hour prior to said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
