Your schools are in excellent condition both in scholarship and morals. You have only two pupils below grade according to age in the entire town.

Your teachers are efficient and painstaking in their work being satisfied only when the pupil does his or her best. While we have practically the entire support and cooperation of the parents there are a few cases where it should be better, and I assure you that it is merited and would be much appreciated.

Repairs

Extensive repairs were made on the high and grade schools. The seats at the high school received a new finish, as did the entire woodwork of the building. A picture moulding was put in place and another moulding which serves as a support for the pictures.

The grade rooms were all thoroughly renovated and the rooms re-lighted to comply with state requirements. The well at the grade schools was thoroughly cleaned and a new standard curb placed on it.

Teachers' Retirement Fund

You will note that three teachers last year took advantage of the act. This year we have one elementary teacher and the three of the high school who are members. The other teachers come under the old pension law, or do not care to enroll.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Unity, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in the Town House in said town on the 14th day of March, A. D. 1932, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose by ballot a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To choose by ballot necessary selectmen assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4 To choose by ballot necessary school committee for the usual term.
- Art. 5 To choose one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To choose one or more fire wards for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7 To choose by ballot one or more constables for the ensuing year.

- Art. 8 To choose by ballot a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9 To choose by ballot a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10 To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11 To see what method the town will take in relation to the collection of taxes and to see if the town will allow a rebate or discount on all taxes paid before certain dates and if so establish such dates and the amount of such rebate or discount.
- Art. 12 To see if the town will vote to set the date when its taxes assessed and committed for the year 1932 shall become due.
- Art. 13 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the payment of rebate or discount on taxes paid on or before certain dates, if so, how much.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of town officers, including Supt. of schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15 To see what what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of of poor for the ensuing year
- Art. 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for miscellaneous expenses for the ensuing year.

- Art. 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of town roads for the ensuing year.
- Art. 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of culverts and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 19 To determine by vote what use shall be made of the excise tax on automobiles for the ensuing year.
- Art. 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal for the ensuing year.
- Art. 21 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50 to be used in conjunction with state for machine work on patrol road.
- Art. 22 To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate \$519 to be used for the maintenance of improved sections of third class road, or to be used in connection with the third class apportionment made by the state for the improvement of third class roads.
- Art. 23 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of state aid highway under the patrol system.
- Art. 24 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to state aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

- Art. 25 To see what sum, if any, the town will vote raise in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 32 inclusive of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930 for the improvement of a state aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commissioner. Work to begin town line and extend in a general easterly, nor easterly direction. It is the completion of state aid road built in 1931.

- Art. 27 To see what sum of money the town will vote raise and appropriate for the repair of school buildings.
- Art. 28 To see what sum of money the town will vote raise and appropriate for the teaching of agriculture.
- Art. 29 To see what sum of money the town will vote raise and appropriate for agricultural equipment.
- Art. 30 To see what sum of money the town will vote raise and appropriate for lights and insurance for school buildings.
- Art. 31 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$330.00 for lighting the village streets in Unity, as per contract with Central

Maine Power Co.

- Art. 32 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- Art. 33 To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from W W Moulton of Thorndike, the interest on said sum to be expended for the perpetual care of William H J Moulton's burial lot in Farwell Cemetery.

- Art. 35 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on Meadow Brook bridge note.
- Art. 36 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for school nursing in the Town of Unity under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.
- Art. 37 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town bills until taxes are collected.
- Art. 38 To see what action the town will take to provide water for the Village schools.
