# Superintendent's Report

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## To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Unity:

It is with pleasure that I submit this my tenth annual report of your schools.

The same corps of teachers as last reported remained with us during the Spring term, but as there were two local teachers, of experience and graduates preparatory for their work, available, Miss Velma Brown succeeded Miss Kennard as assistant in the high school, and Miss Dorrothy Knight was elected to the primary.

Miss Evelyn Waning declining a re-election to the Farwell School and as this school was made up mostly of boys we engaged a young man, Mr. Harvey Scribner.

Miss Edith Foster wishing to finish her normal course declined a re-election and Miss Cashman received the election.

This has on the whole, been a very pleasant year, and your pupils have maintained good progress. A few unpleasant things have come up for which the teacher was not responsible nevertheless anything that agitates causes friction and is felt in the classroom. At this time everything is normal and should so continue.

Believing that eight years in the elementary grades were not enough to prepare the average child for high school, we changed to the nine year plan starting out with the sub-primary.

With this plan every child should be able to make the



grades yearly, and too at the same time an exceptionally brilliant pupil can earn a promotion at mid year or pass a grade thus preparing for high school in eight years.

### REPAIRS

As it has always been difficult to keep the roof of the grade building water proof, your committee decided to put on a metal roofing. They purchased the "copper-roid" roofing and it is proving satisfactory. You have a roof if given a little attention will last many years.

It has been found that the center bearings of the high school building are sinking into the quicksand, thus causing the ceiling to buckle and break away at the sides.

This should receive immediate attention as conditions are growing worse.

A coat of paint would not go amiss on the interior of the rural schools, yet I do not recommend laying out much on these buildings as all your pupils should come to the village grade school as soon as road conditions make transportation possible.

### HIGH SCHOOL

Your high school continues to maintain its high standard of scholarship, and good reports come to us concerning our pupils who have gone out to schools of higher learning.

Unpleasant features are apt to occur, but when they do, I trust it is a warning to others.

# Town Warrant

**To George H. Foster Jr. a Constable of the town of Unity,  
in the County of Waldo, State of Maine:**

**Greeting:**

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Unity, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Lower Hall, Odd Fellows Building in said town on the eleventh day of March, A. D., 1935 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, School Committee, and Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 4. To choose necessary Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a member of the School Committee for a term of three years.

Art. 6. To choose one or more Road Commissioners and establish pay for same.

Art. 7. To choose all other necessary town officers except a Treasurer and Collector of Taxes.

Art. 8. To see what method the town will take in relative to collection of taxes for said town, for the ensuing year, and to see if the town will allow a rebate or discount on all property taxes paid before certain date or dates, and if so, establish such date or dates.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the payment of rebate or discount on taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To see if the town will by its vote, set the time when its taxes, assessed and committed for collection for the year 1935, shall become due.

Art. 11. To choose a Collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To chose a Town Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for each of the following purposes:

For salaries of town officers.

For repair of roads and bridges.

For plowing snow.

For street lights.

For the care of cemeteries.

For support of schools.

For repair of school buildings.

For lights and insurance on school buildings.

For support of poor.

For salary of Superintendent of Schools.

For State Road patrol.

For miscellaneous expenses.

For payment on school house well note.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the improvement of the section of State Aid Road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933.

Art. 16. To see what sum if any the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws 1931.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$613.00 for maintenance of Third Class Road.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 to be used in conjunction with state on patrolled road.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to pay Samuel and Addison Douglass for gravel and labor on Freedom and Thorndike road near Douglass Bridge, so called, if so, how much?

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to make it obligatory for those who have town orders to pay a certain part of such order to the Collector to be applied on their taxes.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money to pay town bills until taxes are collected.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed of the property of Eugene Reynolds as described in his deed, to the inhabitants of the town of Unity.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer and Selectmen to sell and convey in the name of the inhabitants of the Town of Unity, the interest in any real estate the town may own by virtue of Sheriffs' Deeds.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to instruct the School Committee to elect a School Physician.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used on the Clair Steven's Road, the Harlan Crosby Road and from Fred Murch's Corner to Knox line, if so, how much?

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to repair Perkin's Road, so called, or take such action thereon as they see fit.

Art. 27. To see what disposition the town will vote to make of the Kelley school house (so called).

Art. 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting,
