REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of
Unity:

It gives me pleasure at the close of another fiscal year to make this, my eleventh annual report.

Mr. Scribner declined a re-election to the Farwell Corner School, whereupon Mrs. Gertrude Dearborn, a teacher of experience, received the election.

Mr. Madden, principal of the high school, declined a re-election and the position was tendered Mr. Woodward, who had served efficiently as teacher of agriculture for six years. Mr. Woodward is now serving as principal and teacher of agriculture.

Mr. Karl McKechnie, a college graduate and man of experience, was elected as sub-master.

It is difficult to attain an efficiency of 100%, but your schools are all in excellent condition. It gives me real pleasure to take visitors who are authority in school work into our schools.

Castine Normal School has entered into an exchange plan, taking one of our teachers into normal school for a period of six weeks and sending us a trained teacher to get experience. While this teacher is in our school she is visited three times by Miss Bills, a critic teacher, also by Mr. Scott, a regular teacher and vice principal of the E. S. N. School.

The opportunity was first offered to Mrs. Ward, but she declined to accept and it went next to Mrs. Dearborn. Last year Miss Edith Foster exchanged with a teacher in Bar Harbor.

REPAIRS

Early last spring the septic tank at the high school refused duty, necessitating attention at a time when it was difficult to work to an advantage, owing to the caving in of the quicksand.

It being difficult to determine the amount of work needed to put the high school building back into shape and believing the funds would not be sufficient to complete the job, our attention went to repair work and painting the interior of the rural schools.

The stoves in the grade building are in bad shape and need attention. If new wood barrels can be secured for them the expense will not be very much. The building, too, should receive a coat of paint and the Farwell Corner school building reshingled.

HIGH SCHOOL

We have an enrollment of 75 this year, and of this number 36 are tuition students.

The school, under Mr. Woodward's leadership, has done good work and everything is in very satisfactory condition.

We appreciate the support our townspeople are giving us in our athletic activities. Our girls have done well in their basketball, being tied with Albion for championship in the western part of the county.

Our boys have shown true sportsmanship in all their games in spite of the fact they have had odds against them this season.

Because of the interest the boys are taking in the workshop projects we have added a few tools that will be of special service.

CONCLUSION

I wish to thank the families who were so unfortunate as to have the measles for their coöperation in preventing its spread to other families.

It has long been my plan to retire or at least to take a year's vacation at the conclusion of my term of office, July 1, 1937, and at this time I so notify the public in order to give my committee due time to locate my successor and to make it legal for candidates to solicit the position.

I thank the citizens, teachers and committee for their loyalty and whole-hearted support, and the students for the splendid school spirit they maintain.

TOWN WARRANT

To George H. Foster, Jr., a Constable of the Town of Unity,
in the County of Waldo and State of Maine,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Unity, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Lower Hall, Odd Fellows' Building, in said town on the *ninth* day of March, A. D. 1936, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose by ballot a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose by ballot a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the selectmen, assessors, overseers of the poor, school committee, superintendent of schools and treasurer.

Art. 4. To choose by ballot three selectmen for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose by ballot three assessors for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose by ballot three overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To choose by ballot a member of the school committee for a term of three years.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to act as road commissioners.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, and if so, elect one and establish pay for same.

Art. 10. To choose all other necessary town officers, except collector of taxes and treasurer.

Art. 11. To see what method the town will take in relation to collection of taxes for said town for the ensuing year and to see if the town will vote to allow a rebate or discount

on all property taxes paid before certain date or dates, and if so, establish such date or dates.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of rebate or discount on taxes.

Art. 13. To see if the town will by its vote set the time when its taxes, assessed and committed for collection for the year 1936, shall become due.

Art. 14. To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 15. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for each of the following purposes for the ensuing year :

- (a) For salaries of town officers.
- (b) For repair of town roads.
- (c) For repair of bridges.
- (d) For cutting bushes, State aid road.
- (e) For snow removal and sanding road.
- (f) For street lights.
- (g) For the care of cemeteries.
- (h) For the support of schools.
- (i) For teaching agriculture.
- (j) For agricultural equipment.
- (k) For laboratory.
- (l) For repair of school buildings.
- (m) For insurance on school buildings.
- (n) For lights and power for schools.
- (o) For the support of poor.
- (p) For salary of superintendent of schools.
- (q) For miscellaneous expenditures.
- (r) For State aid road patrol.
- (s) For payment on Well note.
- (t) For maintenance of resolve roads.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising and appropriating money necessary to

entitle the town to State aid, as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 18. To see what sum the town will appropriate for State aid road construction (in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 19. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State aid roads in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise \$507.00 for maintenance of third class road for the ensuing year.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to instruct the school committee to elect a school physician.

Art. 22. To see what disposition the town will vote to make of the town house.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$30.00 from Carrie L. Miller of Lawrence, Mass., \$5.00 of said sum to be used in preparing lot of Francis Brooks, a Revolutionary soldier, in Fowler Cemetery (so called). The income of \$25.00 to be used for the perpetual care of said lot.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to make it obligatory for those who have town orders to pay 25% or more of such order to the collector of taxes, to be applied on their taxes, if any.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to pay town bills until taxes are collected.

Art. 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at Lower Hall, Odd Fellows' Building, from 2 o'clock till 5 o'clock P. M., on the three secular days preceding the town meeting, for the purpose of registering and correcting the list of voters.
