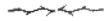

## SCHOOL REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of Unity:

I hereby submit the following report on the condition of your schools for the fiscal year 1940—41.

### COMMON SCHOOLS

The elementary schools have maintained the same high standard that they have during the past years. This year for the first time in six years, we have been able to make some progress in furnishing up to date textbooks. A new reading program has been installed: A new series of arithmetics and new grammars have been added. Next year we expect to provide for new histories, geographies and health books. There has been only two changes in the



teaching staff from last year. Mr. Cressy, a four year graduate of Gorham N. S., is teaching the grammar room, and Mrs. McDonald is at Farwells Corner. Our teachers are well trained and efficient in their work. The excellent condition of our elementary schools is a direct result of their excellent service.

### HIGH SCHOOL

There has been several changes in the teaching staff this year. Mr. Fox resigned and was replaced by Mr. Johnson U. of M. 1940. Mr. Gregory resigned and was replaced by Mr. Gove, Bates 1939. Miss Higgins resigned and was replaced by Mrs. Lowell U. of M. 1933. Miss Mitchell resigned and was replaced by Miss Worcester, U. of M. 1940. Mr. Crockett, Principal, is the only teacher remaining from last year.

In spite of all these changes I feel that we have one of the most efficient teaching staffs in the history of the school. The high school maintains a high standard of scholarship and instruction. It will compare very favorably with any class A standard school in the State.

### SCHOOL PHYSICIAN

I wish to report that the general health of the students in the Unity schools has been excellent. There have been some isolated cases of measles and chicken pox. Last spring the tuberculin test was given and no reactors found. I have examined the throats of all students recently and find no evidence of diseased tonsils.

I would recommend that a clinic for small pox vaccination be held this spring.

### INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION

This part of the educational program is beginning to show results. The girls and boys who have had this training during the past four years will go out much better pre-

pared to take up a useful life in the community. During the past two years we have expanded our shop equipment. We have also concentrated on the shop course training to a greater degree. Many of the projects of the agriculture and home economics classes have been exhibited at the fair, and at the school exhibit last fall. During the summer the agriculture class raised as a project one acre of tuber unit potatoes. The Home economics department has been providing the hot lunches for the village schools for the past four years.

## Warrant For Annual Town Meeting

March 10, 1941

---

To Alton McCormick, a Constable of the Town of Unity, in the County of Waldo, State of Maine.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Unity, in said county, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Lower Hall, Odd Fellows Building, in said Town on Monday, the Tenth day of March, A. D. 1941, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act on the report of the Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Superintendent of Schools, Town Clerk, and other Town Officers.

Art. 4. To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose three Assessors for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose three Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To choose necessary Superintending School Committee for the required term.

Art. 8. To choose a Town Treasurer.

Art. 9. To choose a Collector of Taxes.

Art. 10. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote

to raise and appropriate to pay town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing town roads.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of bridges.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy a road machine.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for State aid Construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Higways and Bridges under the provisions of section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3. Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 17. To see what sum if any the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid fund, for the purpose of applying Bituminous surface treatment to State aid roads in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132. Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise \$718.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class roads or to be used in conjunction with the State apportionment for the construction of third class roads.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$150.00 more or less for maintenance of resolve roads.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise \$650.00 more or less for patrol road maintenance.

Art. 21 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$390.00 for lighting the streets in Unity village for the ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of poor for the

ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Mothers' Aid and care of dependent children.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to authorize the School Committee to appoint a school physician.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 more or less for cutting bushes on town roads.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Health Department.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to purchase Fire fighting equipment, if so, to see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from Arthur Berry's Buildings to top of Hill connecting with road leading to A. L. Farwell's.

Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Miscellaneous expenses.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to receive Surplus Commodities.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 more or less for tarring Improved roads.

Art. 32. To see if the town will by its vote set the time when its Taxes Assessed, and Committed to the Tax Collector for the year 1941 shall become due.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to charge six per cent Interest on all Taxes, remaining unpaid after December 1, 1941.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to contract with a reliable party or take such action thereon as they see fit in regard to snow removal on our town roads.

Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will

vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal and sanding.

Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money, to pay town bills in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the ensuing year.

Art. 37. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the town of Unity, to sell and dispose of any real estate, acquired by the town, for the non-payment of Taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute Quit claim deeds for such property.

Art. 38. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for widening and ditching roads.

Art. 39. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting bushes on Improved roads.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to make it obligatory for all who have town orders, to pay 25 per cent, of such orders to the tax collector, to be applied on their unpaid taxes.

Art. 41. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for elementary and secondary schools, including Teachers' salaries, Fuel, Janitor services, Conveyance, Textbooks, Reference books and School supplies for Desk and Laboratory use.

Art. 42. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for lights and power for schools.

Art. 43. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Industrial Education.

Art. 44. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance on school buildings.

Art. 45. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs on school buildings.

Art. 46. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to use the abandoned school house for such pur-

pose as they see fit.

Art. 47. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of snow fence.

Art. 48. To see if the town will vote to accept \$100.00 from the Estate of Bertha W. Blethen, the income of said sum to be used for the perpetual care of the Cemetery lots of R. S. Knight, and Isaiah R. Blethen, in Pond Cemetery. (so called)

Art. 49. To see what action the town will take in relation to collection of taxes for said town for the ensuing year.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Selectmens' Office from one o'clock, until four o'clock P. M. on the three secular days preceding the town meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
