

# Supt. of Schools Report

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of North Haven:

I herewith submit for your consideration my tenth annual report of the condition and progress of North Haven schools for the fiscal year ending Feb. 1st., 1928.

There has been little change in the teaching force this year. Miss Marjorie Bridges resigned her position in the Thorofare School and was succeeded by Miss Hazel Dickey, a graduate of Gorham Normal School. Miss Dickey has had one year's previous experience. Miss Sybyl Leach of the High School faculty resigned to continue her work at college and Miss Marie N. Buzzell was elected to succeed her. Miss Buzzell is a graduate of Colby and has had two years' previous experience.

The school census for 1927 was 143. The total enrollment was 107. The enrollment by grades was as follows: Sub Primary, 1; Grade 1, 9; Grade 2, 12; Grade 3, 10; Grade 4, 15; Grade 5, 11; Grade 6, 10; Grade 7, 10; Grade 8, 4; Freshmen, 9; Sophomores, 7; Juniors, 3; Seniors, 6. The aggregate attendance was 15, 131; average attendance, 84.07; percentage of attendance, 78.06 percent. This percentage of attendance is lower than usual because of the epidemic of whooping cough during the fall term of 1926.

The epidemic of scarlet fever caused the closing of school for two weeks in October. One week of this period came at the time of the State Teachers' Convention, the other week was made up at the end of the fall term, and the work will not be retarded to any appreciable extent.

In the Modern Health Crusade the Center Grammar School won a pennant. All the schools did excellent work in the crusade, but the broken attendance, resulting from the whooping cough epidemic, prevented the other schools from attaining a perfect score. The Health Crusade makes a little extra work for the teachers, but the results more than justify the additional effort. Habits of cleanliness and right living instilled into a child early in life can not help but be a strong factor for better health.

During the latter part of the fall term, a dental clinic was held for the benefit of the school children. Through this clinic, children were enabled to have their dental work done at a nominal cost and a great many took advantage of it, The Northeast School and the Thorofare Primary School received dental health certificates issued by the State Board of Health. Your superintendent received a letter from Miss Abbie Buck of the State Board of Health, enthusiastically praising the teachers and pupils for the cooperative spirit shown during the progress of the dental clinic.

The heating system in the high school building is in very poor condition. When the building was re-modeled, the project was accepted with the understanding that an approved type of heating plant would be installed as soon as possible. Although the building is small, four stoves are required to heat it, one in each room. With this arrangement, the water pipes always freeze in winter. Two of the stoves are now in very poor condition and the other two have seen their best days. Something will have to be done before another year. It would be possible to put in two new jacketed stoves at an approximate cost of \$150; but I would recommend the installation of a hot air furnace in the basement, thus doing away with all the stoves. This would provide more floor space in the rooms and make the building more comfortable and attractive place for the boys and girls.

With the exception of the Repairs Account, which has been considerably overdrawn for a number of years, due to small appropriations, the School accounts are drawn up to a very close margin. Last year we had substantial balances available in the Common School and High School accounts. There are no unexpended balances this year so larger appropriations for these accounts will be necessary. The unexpended balance in the Text Book Account will be sufficient for another year and no appropriation will be necessary for that account. It is impossible to make any recommendation for repairs, not knowing what repairs or improvements the town may wish to make. I do wish, however, to call your attention to the overdraft in the Repairs Account which should be considered when the appropriation is made.
