Supt. of Schools Report

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of North Haven:

I herewith submit for your consideration my eleventh annual report of the condition and progress of the North Haven schools for the fiscal year ending February 1, 1929.

There was but one change in the teaching personnel this year. Prin. P. W. Bradbury of the high school faculty resigned during the summer to attend medical college, and Prin. R. C. Danforth was elected to fill this vacancy. A school system depends more upon the tenure of its good teachers for progress and efficiency than upon any other contributing factor.

The school census for 1928 was 140; the total enrollment was 109. The enrollment by grades was as follows: Sub Primary, 1; Grade One, 5; Grade Two, 10; Grade Three, 14; Grade Four, 10; Grade Five, 17; Grade Six, 11; Grade Seven, 9; Grade Eight, 11; Freshmen, 3; Sophomores, 8; Juniors, 8; Seniors, 2. The aggregate attendance was 15,278, average attendance, 84.88; percentage of attendance, 77.87 percent. This percentage of attendance is lower than our usual rate and is due to the epidemic of scarlet fever which occurred during the school year 1927-1928. Regardless of the prevailing epidemics the work in the Modern Health Crusade has been especially good. All of the schools won a pennant this year.

During the fall term a hot air furnace was installed in the high school building. Due to the obstructions encountered in excavating the drain, the

project proved to be more expensive than was anticipated. However, the heating plant is giving good results and we are no longer bothered with frozen water pipes.

An electric lighting system was installed in the high school building at a cost of \$127.24. This not only improves conditions for study on short, dark days, but adds many advantages to the laboratory equipment.

Next summer the high school building should be painted and its walls and ceilings re-decorated. With this exception the school buildings are in very good condition.

The school accounts are in very good condition except the repairs account. A substantial appropriation for this department should be raised at the annual town meeting to cover the existing overdraft and allow for the necessary repairs. There is nothing to be gained in raising insufficient appropriations because bills not covered by appropriation have to be met by temporary loan which incurs an interest charge.

The appropriation for Common Schools and High School should be somewhat larger than last year to allow for the increase in janitor service, fuel and salaries.

- 57. To see if the town will vote to accept the recommendation of the Selectmen, that the State Aid road work be done this year, 1929, on Middle Road, beginning at intersection with Pulpit Harbor road.
- 58. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying Road Machinery.
- 59. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to buy Road Machinery.
- 60. To see if the town will vote to have all Poll Taxes paid on or before the first day of June.
- 61. To see if the town will vote to exempt the property known as "Doctor's Home" from taxation for the ensuing year.
- 62. To see if the town will vote to exempt the "Knights of Pythias Hall" from taxation for the ensuing year.
- 63. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the Town Treasurer to hire in anticipation of taxes for 1929.

The Selectmen will be in session at Crockett's Hall at nine o'clock A. M. for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
