REPORT OF THE
SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens
of Cranberry Isles:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration my sixth annual report of the condition, progress and needs of the schools of Cranberry Isles.

Teachers and Common Schools.

There have been three changes in the teaching force during the year; namely, Miss Doris Kelley at Islesford primary, Mr. Rolf Motz at Islesford grammar, and Miss Flora Berry at Great Cranberry Island primary. Miss Campbell, at Great Cranberry Island grammar, is completing her second year at this school, and the work and attendance of her pupils show that no mistake was made in retaining her services for another year.

The Misses Kelley and Berry and Mr. Motz are graduates of Machias normal school, and come well recommended by the normal school faculty. The work done by these four teachers during the year has thoroughly convinced me that we have been fortunate in our choice of teachers, and that we should endeavor to retain their services as long as possible. The work done by the pupils has been of a high standard; increased interest has been shown in league work, entertainments and along athletic lines. All these activities have a tendency toward making up a well-balanced school, keeping the pupils interested, happy and contented.

Following is the number of pupils in each grade:

Grade 1—	4 boys,	9 girls.
2—	5 boys,	4 girls.
3—	1 boy,	0 girls.
4—	2 boys,	2 girls.
5—	4 boys,	4 girls.
6—	4 boys,	4 girls.
7—	6 boys,	2 girls.
8—	4 boys,	6 girls.

Total, 30 boys and 31 girls attending the common schools. The census shows 64 boys and 65 girls, or a total of 129.

All necessary supplies have been furnished the pupils during the year. New readers, histories, charts and English books have also been added.

With our excellent corps of teachers, plenty of good material to work with, such as text-books, supplies, maps, etc., and the hearty co-operation of both pupils and parents with the teachers, it is not to be wondered at that the schools of Cranberry Isles rank with the best in the State.

The schools have been thoroughly cleaned, sanitary conditions improved, and all necessary repairs made.

The superintending school committee has looked into the financial needs of the schools for the ensuing year carefully, and I believe their recommendations to be as conservative as possible for the best interests of the schools.

In closing, I wish to thank the superintending school committee and citizens for the interest and co-operation they have shown in the schools, and for the courteous treatment accorded me during the year.
