### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Cranberry Isles:

Below is a report of the superintendent of schools.

There have been three changes in the teaching force during the year, namely, Miss Vallie Lord, G. C. I. primary, in place of Mrs. Spurling, resigned; Dwight Perkins and Miss Adella Ames, Islesford primary and grammar, who take the place of Mr. and Mrs. Motz, resigned. These teachers are normal graduates, and are filling their positions to the satisfaction of all.

The attendance has been very satisfactory, and the pupils seem very much interested in their work. The pupils are well supplied with all necessary text-books and supplies. All the schools have been cleaned and the toilets put in a sanitary condition.

Following is the number of pupils in each grade:

Grade 1—7 boys, 3 girls.

2—0 boys, 4 girls.

3—4 boys, 6 girls.

4-5 boys, 3 girls.

5—1 boy, 0 girls.

6—3 boys, 2 girls.

7—6 boys, 3 girls.

8—5 boys, 4 girls.

Total, 31 boys and 25 girls, or 56 pupils attending common schools, a gain of 5 pupils over the preceding year.

Our high school tuition problem is getting more

serious each year, and if you will examine the above vou will notice that nine pupils be ready for high school will next To this may seem discouraging financially, but to me it gives a feeling of gratification that your children desire a higher education, and that the parents are encouraging their children along these lines, believing, as I do, that this is about as good an investment as can be made and will bring good returns. I believe that Cranberry Isles enjoys the distinction of sending more pupils to high school than a large majority of towns in the State that do not maintain a free high school.

In closing, I wish to thank the citizens for the courteous treatment accorded me during the year.

- 10 To choose constables for the ensuing year.
- 11 To choose surveyor of lumber and measurer of wood and bark for the ensuing year.
- 12 To choose by ballot road commissioners for the ensuing year.

- 13 To see if the town will vote to hold the next annual town meeting at town hall, Great Cranberry Island.
- 14 To see if the town will vote to sell land and school building on Sutton's Island, and act thereon.
- 15 To see if the town will vote to buy new hose for fire pump.
- 16 To see how much money the town will vote to raise for hose.
- 17 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars for new sanitary toilets, for school building at Great Cranberry Island.
- 18 To see what sum of money shall be raised for necessary town charges.
- 19 To see what sum of money shall be raised for support of the poor.
- 20 To see what sum of money shall be raised for highways on the different islands.
- 21 To see what sum of money shall be raised for repairs of school property.
- 22 To see what sum of money shall be raised for appliances, apparatus and insurance.

- 31 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs and maintenance of public wharf and float, Great Cranberry Island.
- 32 To see if the town will vote to appoint a caretaker of public wharf and act thereon.
- 33 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$70, for rent of superintendent of schools' office.
- 34 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$275 for superintendent of schools' wages.
- 35 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State-aid, as provided in section 20 of chapter 120 of the public laws of 1913.
