### Town Warrant.

To L. C. Dillingham, constable of the town of St. Albans, in the county of Somerset.—Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of St. Albans, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in the town house in said town on Monday, the sixteenth day of March, A. D. 1896, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- ART. 1. To choose a Moderator.
- ART. 2. To choose a Town Clerk and all other necessary town officers.
- ART. 3. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for the support of schools.
- ART. 4. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for free high school.
- ART. 5. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for the repair of school buildings.
- ART. 6. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to purchase text books.
- ART. 7. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for the support of poor.
- ART. 8. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to defray town charges.
- ART. 9. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to repair bridges.
- ART. 10. To see what sum the town will grant and raise, in money, to repair highways in summer.
- ART. 11. To see what sum the town will grant and raise, in money, to be expended on roads in winter.
- ART. 12. To see what sum the town will grant and raise, in labor and material, to repair highways in summer,

- ART. 13. To see what sum the town will grant and raise, in labor and material, to be expended on roads in winter.
- ART. 14. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to build board and wire fences on the highways.
- ART. 15. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to build a bridge across the stream near A. D. Baird's.
- ART. 16. To see what sum the town will grant and raise for memorial services.
- ART. 17. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to pay on town debt.
- ART. 18. To see what sum the town will grant and raise to build a school-house in the Lothrop district, so called.
- ART. 19. To see if the town will give the Grand Army Post, the Ladies Relief Corps and the St. Albans Band the use of the town hall for their regular meetings.
- ART. 20. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of Aaron Frost for stone removed from the mountain cemetery.
- ART. 21. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of J. L. Field for services in 1893.
- ART. 22. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of J. B. Atwood for services in 1894.
- ART. 23. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of J. C. Grover for care of James White in 1894.
- ART. 24. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of John Robinson for highway labor in 1892.
- ART. 25. To see what action the town will take regarding the claim of Theodore Smith for highway labor in 1894.
- ART. 26. To see if the town will vote to abate a part of the tax assessed against F. M. Wilkins in 1895.

The Selectmen will be in session at the town house at eight o'clock A. M., on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising and correcting the lists of voters.
