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




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WARRANT

To Geo. A. Simmons, a constable in the town of Kingfield, in the county of Franklin,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Kingfield, qualified by law to vote in town affairs to assemble at French's Hall in said town on the second day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk and all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for free high school for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for text books for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs on school houses and for school supplies for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town debts.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of roads and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the abatement of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 14. To see what the town will vote in regard to the collection of taxes, when made payable, what discount to be allowed and interest charged.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" upon the adoption of the provision of Chap. 112 of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the town to state aid for highways for the year 1908.

Art. 16. To see if the town will raise, appropriate and set apart for the permanent improvement of the main highways within the town such sum of money as is contemplated and directed by Sec. 5 of Chap.' 112, of the Public Laws of Maine, for the year 1907, being the sum of \$62.00 Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay hydrant rental, water rental, electric lights and int. on town debt.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for use of fire department.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise fifty dollars to pay the rent of the public library room.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to abate Mrs. Lucretia Savage's tax for the year 1907.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and grant to E. B. Clayton Post, G. A. R., the sum of twenty-five dollars, to be expended in Kingfield Decoration Day, May 30, 1908, for speakers, band, and other necessary expenses, or act on any matter relating thereto.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to request the Huse Spool & Bobbin Co. to put two street lights on Church street.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell and deed the T. Horn house, and for what sum it may be sold.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to build a building to house road machines and rollers, and where and how the same shall be built, and how much money the town will vote to raise for the same.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to lay a sewer from a point near Fred Blanchard's house to river near Norton bridge, and how much money the town will vote to raise for the same, and how the same shall be laid.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to abate for a term of 10 years the taxes on a new mill to be built in the year 1908, on the site of the French saw mill.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to lay one or more sewers on the east side of the river in Kingfield village, and where, and how, the same shall be laid, and how much money the town will vote to raise for the same.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to make such changes in the construction of the cell at the town house, as may be necessary to heat and ventilate the same, and how much money the town will vote to raise for the same.

Art. 29. To act on any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at French's hall at eight o'clock, in the forenoon, on the day of said meeting.
