ALL TAXPAYERS SHOULD READ THE FOLLOWING RE-QUIREMENTS AND COMPLY WITH THEM

Section 70, Chapter 13, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930

"Before making an assessment, the Assessors shall give seasonable notice in writing to the Inhabitants, by posting notifications in some public place in Town, or shall notify them, in such other ways as the Town at its Annual Meeting directs, to make and bring in to them true and perfect lists of their polls and all their estates, real and personal, not by law exempt from taxation, of which they were possessed on the first day of April of the same year. If any resident owner after such notice, does not bring in such lists, he is thereby barred of his right to make application to the Assessors or the County Commissioners for any abatement of his taxes, unless he offers such lists with his application and satisfies them that he was unable to offer it at the time appointed."



HISTORICAL

Cranberry Isles was set off from Tremont March 16, 1830, and incorporated as a town under the name of Cranberry Isles.

The first board of selectmen was Samuel Hadlock, Enoch Spurling and Joseph Moore.

The town is composed of five islands—Great Cranberry island, Little Cranberry island, Sutton island, Baker's island and Bear island.

For years the town maintained schools on four of the five islands. Later it was found advisable to discontinue Sutton and Baker's island schools, and at the present time we have two graded schools employing four teachers.

In 1904 the present school building on Great Cranberry island was erected to replace the two old buildings and the schools combined.

In the year 1913 we felt the need of a better and larger school building on Little Cranberry island, and at the annual town meeting it was voted to build the present schoolhouse.

In the year of 1907 the New England Telephone Company extended its lines to our islands, bringing us in much closer touch with our neighboring towns.

An agreement was made in 1928 with the Bangor Hydro-Elsctric Company to furnish Great and Little Cranberry islands with electricity, and on September 28 of that year electric lights were shining in many homes.

In 1932 an agreement was made with the Bangor Hydro-Electric Company, and its service was extended to Sutton and Bear islands.

For many years the chief industry was fishing, but for the past thirty years yachting has played a large part. There are several boat storage and repair yards.

Perhaps the most interesting place in town is the Islesford Collection Building and its contents of a large variety of antiques and relics of bygone days. It was founded several years ago by our friend and neighbor, William Otis Sawtelle, a resident of this town. Mr. Sawtelle has done a great deal in bringing some of our old family records to light and up to date, properly filed for quick reference. A visit to the museum will convince you that your time is much too short to see and appreciate all of Mr. Sawtelle's work.

To Alonzo J. Bryant, a Constable of the town of Cranberry Isles, in said county, GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Cranberry Isles, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at Neighborhood House, Little Cranberry Island, in said town, on Monday, the second day of March, A. - 12 To see if the town will vote to hold the next annual town meeting at Town Hall, Great Cranberry Island.

- 13 To see what sum of money shall be raised for necessary town charges.
- 14 To see what sum of money shall be raised for the support of the poor.
- To see what sum of money shall be raised for highways 15 on the different islands.
- 16 To see what sum of money shall be raised for snow removal on the different islands
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for 17 insurance on school buildings.
- To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money for 18 schools under this joint budget, to be accounted for separately.

First National Bank of Bar Harbor, note for \$2,000.00, due April 14, 1936.

Arthur M. Spurling, note for \$2,000.00, due July 1, 1936. Leslie M. Rice, note for \$2,000.00, due July 1, 1936.

Bar Harbor Banking & Trust Co., note for \$1,000.00, due October 1, 1936.

- 40 To see if the town will vote to establish the bounds of its town road as laid out by selectmen, and recorded by the town clerk on the eighth day of February, A. D. 1900.
- 41 To see if the town will vote to elect a fire warden, according to section 6 of chapter 35 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- 42 To see if the town will vote to purchase calcium chloride, or some other suitable material for laying dust on its roads.
- 43 To choose a town auditor for the ensuing year.
- 44 To see if the town will vote to have the assessors visit taxable property.
- 45 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- 46 To vote pay of moderator for his services.

The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for

the purpose of correcting the list of voters in said town, and hearing and deciding on applications of those claiming the right to have their names upon said list, at Neighborhood House, Little Cranberry Island, in said town at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
