School Report.

The schools have been all we could expect the past winter terms. We have been very fortunate in securing all good teachers. The Spring and Fall terms were generally satisfactory. We think we have a sufficient number of teachers in this town to successfully manage all the schools; the greater part of them have had quite an experience and always give thorough instruction and discipline. In all the schools most of the pupils exhibited a marked degree of thoroughness and activeness in their recitations. We have some classes that we are proud of, and our teachers of these classes are very much attached to them. We deem it a pleasure as well as a duty to compliment such.

Every pupil has had the privilege of thirty week's school and we think the school year has been uncommonly profitable.

REPAIRS.

It has been suggested by some having small scholars that there must be a school in the Payson School House next summer. In such an event I will recommend that a small sum be appropriated to repair the House. I also advise a small amount for the repairs of all the Blackboards in occupied School Houses and that such repairs be done by an experienced workman.

BOOKS.

Our books are in a dilapidated condition. I hardly think we can use them another year without buying more than half new ones. In this event think it would be better to exchange. In either case we need an appropriation. I have sold 1 book to E. Richards. \$.36.
