

REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

January 6, 1930.

To the Citizens of the Town of Levant:

I hereby submit my report as a public health nurse from January 1, 1930, to January 1, 1931:

In May, two and one-half days were spent in school inspection. On June 6, the nurse was called to the village school to assist



the doctor in making a check-up for a skin disease that had broken out in this school. Several children were excluded at this time. Three days later the nurse returned and re-inspected these children and several home visits were made at this time to instruct the parents in the care of this disease.

September 19th and 26th, some time was again spent in this school.

In July, six home visits were made to get the coöperation of the parents in getting the defects of their children corrected.

On September 25th, the day was spent at the Grange Fair, where a Child Welfare Conference was held.

Seventeen children were weighed and inspected at this conference, and literature on child care was distributed to the mothers present.

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Levant for the municipal year ending February 15, 1931:

SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Geo. W. Worthing, Term expires March, 1931 S. A. French, Term expires March, 1932 Jasper Goodwin, Term expires March, 1933 We have had a very profitable year, both in the amount and quality of the work accomplished. This result has been brought about chiefly by the good teachers we have been able to secure. All of our teachers have worked faithfully for the welfare of each and every pupil. At Levant Village, Mrs. Aura Gifford is teaching the first four grades and Miss Marion Peabody the five upper grades. These teachers are doing excellent work. The school at South Levant has been under the management of Edith Bragg Miles, and her work is very satisfactory. At West Levant we were fortunate in securing the services of Mrs. Avis Eastman for the grammar grades and Miss Marjory Folsom for the primary grades. They have worked faithfully and good results have been obtained.

REPAIRS

Many improvements were made in the way of general repairs. The interiors of both rooms at West Levant were painted. The outbuildings were moved from the Reed Dist. and joined to the building at Levant Village, and many minor repairs made on all



buildings. Provisions should be made this year to repair the primary room at Levant Village and provide for new blackboards. Neither of these improvements will call for a large expense.
