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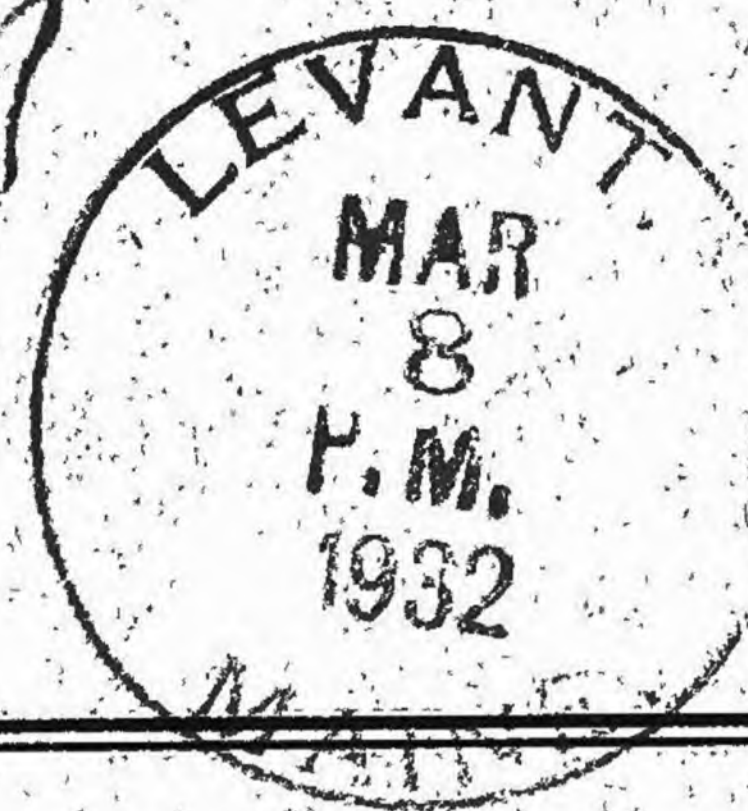

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Levant, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, the fourteenth day of March, A. D. 1932, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town report as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of Poor.

Art. 5. To elect a member of the Superintending School Committee.

Art. 6. To elect a Road Commissioner or commissioners.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to be expended for the repair of roads and bridges to be used for summer work.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for snow removal for the year 1932-33.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for patrol maintenance for 1932-33.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for support of schools.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repair of school houses and out buildings.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for school appliances.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for high school tuition.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of poor.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for contingent expenses.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Memorial purposes, care of cemeteries, and for interest on the local school fund.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 18. To see what sum, if any, the town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 32, inclusive, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes, for construction of a State Aid highway extending from Kenduskeag town line over State Aid Road No. 2 in a westerly direction, through the town of Levant to the Stetson town line, thence over State Aid Road No. 2 and Third Class Road No. 1 in a westerly direction on the direct road from West Levant to Stetson Village, thence northerly over State Aid Road No. 1, in the town of Stetson to the Exeter town line.
