## TOWN WARRANT

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Penobscot, ss.

Levant, Me., Feb. 21, 1933.

*To Ira H. Goodwin, a Constable in the Town of Levant, in  
said County,* GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Levant, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town, on Monday, the thirteenth day of March, A. D. 1933, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town reports as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of Poor.

Art. 5. To elect a member of the Superintending School Committee for 3 years.

Art. 6. To elect a Road Commissioner or Commissioners.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise, to be expended for the repair of roads and bridges, to be used for summer work.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for snow removal for the year 1933-34. *370, 00*

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for patrol maintenance for 1933-34.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for support of schools. *600*

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repair of schoolhouses and outbuildings. *25*

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for school appliances. *250, 00*

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for high school tuition. *700, 00*

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of poor. *500*

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for contingent expenses.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Memorial purposes; care of cemeteries, and for interest on the local school fund. *150, 00*

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916. *710*

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 32, inclusive, of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes, for

construction of a State Aid highway extending from Kenduskeag town line over State Aid road No. 2 in a westerly direction through the town of Levant to the Stetson town line; thence over State Aid road No. 2 and Third Class road No. 1 in a westerly direction on the direct road from West Levant to Stetson Village; thence northerly over State Aid road No. 1 in the town of Stetson to the Exeter town line; thence over State Aid road No. 2 in a northerly direction in the town of Exeter to Exeter Corner; thence over State Aid road No. 1 in a general easterly direction to the Corinth town line.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise \$2,152.80 or \$1,998.80 as the town's share of the Third Class bridge at South Levant, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise \$524.00 for maintenance of Third Class road.

Art. 21. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous treatment to State Aid roads built within the last 5 years, in accordance with provisions of Chapter 271, P. L. 1931.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State Aid highway construction in excess of the amounts required to meet the State apportionments.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote money, and say how much, to make the road from Levant Village to Kenduskeag line suitable for mail route.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the services of the County Nurse.



Art. 25. To see what action the town will take in regard to selling the Nason place.

Art. 26. To see if the town will elect a Budget Committee, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 27. To choose a Winter Commissioner, for breaking roads and to have charge of snow plow, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to hire two men with trucks and plows to help plow roads when storms are light, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise \$1,000.00 for annual payment on the tractor and snow plow.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Treasurer to deduct 25% of all orders after May 1 to any person owing the town a tax, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to make all poll taxes payable on or before May 1.

Art. 32. To see if the town will fix a date when all taxes shall be paid.

Art. 33. To choose a Tax Collector.

Art. 34. To see what date the town will fix on which the Tax Collector shall settle in full with the Treasurer, by cash or otherwise.

Art. 35. To choose a Treasurer and fix compensation.



Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed from Dr. W. S. Purinton to corner lot on Union Avenue and Lake Road, so-called, and in return give to members of the High School Reunion a permit to build thereon a building for a Public Library at an estimated cost of \$2,000.00.

Art. 37. To see if the town will unite with the members of the High School Reunion to build a fireproof concrete vault suitable to protect town records, and raise or appropriate money for same, or act anything relating thereto.

Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to abate the taxes against the estate of Willard E. Clark.

Art. 39. To elect Constables and all other town officers.

Art. 40. To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer, with the consent of the Selectmen, to hire money necessary to meet bills during the municipal year in anticipation of, and to be paid out of the current year's taxes, and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory note or notes of the town therefor.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town House at 9 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.

Fail not to make due service of this warrant and return your doings thereon at the time and place of said meeting.
