Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for high school tuition. 100

Art. 31. To choose a Treasurer and fix compensation.

Art. 32. To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer, with the consent of the Selectmen, to hire money necessary to meet bills during the municipal year in anticipation of, and to be paid out of the current year's taxes, and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory note or notes of the town therefor.

Art. 33. To elect Constables and all other necessary town officers.

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The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the Town House at 9 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.

Fail not to make due service of this warrant and return your doings thereon at the time and place of said meeting.
