The work done in our schools during the past year has been very satisfactory. We have employed teachers well trained for their positions and the parents have co-operated in every way possible. Only one of last year's teachers remained. Miss Vivian Grant who taught very successfully the Village primary last year was retained. Miss Lillian Leighton was secured for the grammar grades. Miss Leighton is a very efficient teacher.

The school at South Levant is in charge of Mrs. Mabel Gray, Mrs. Gray has done excellent work.

At West Levant Miss Greta Murray is in charge of the grammar grades and Miss Lillian Wyman the lower grades. They are capable teachers and have given satisfaction to all concerned.

### REPAIRS

LEVANT, MAINE, Feb. 28, 1936.

*To I. H. Goodwin, a Constable in the Town of Levant, in said County,*

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Levant, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the town house in said town, on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D. 1936, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town report as printed.

Art. 4. To elect three selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To elect a member of the superintending school committee to serve for three years.

Art. 6. To elect a road commissioner or commissioners.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise to be expended for the repair of roads and bridges, to be used for summer work.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for snow removal for the year 1936-37.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for patrol maintenance for the year 1936-37.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of schools.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for school appliances.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repair of schoolhouses and outbuildings.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for high school tuition.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of poor.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for contingent expenses.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for memorial purposes, care of cemeteries, and for interest on the local school fund.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 18. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for cutting bushes.

Art. 20. To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$131.00 for school bus insurance.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$471.00 for maintenance of third class road.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of \$40.00, or more, for school nursing in the Town of Levant under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.

Art. 23. To see if the town will grant and raise \$1,000.00 for annual payment on the tractor and snowplow.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise money, and say how much, to fix the fence around the schoolhouse at Levant Village, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to grant and raise money, and say how much, to build the bridge on the Kenduskeag Road between the houses of B. W. Higgins and W. W. Phillips, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to instruct the treasurer to deduct 50% of all orders after May 1 to any person owing the town a tax, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 to be expended on the Brann Road, so-called, beginning at the road leading from West Levant to Kenduskeag, and building as far as, and as your road commissioner was ordered to build by your selectmen, Fernald and Warren, last year, which was not done. The balance to be expended on Stearns Hill, so-called, or act anything relative thereto.

Art. 28. To choose a tax collector.

Art. 29. To choose a treasurer and fix compensation.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the treasurer, with the consent of the selectmen, to hire money necessary to meet bills during the municipal year in anticipation of, and to be paid out of the current year's taxes, and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory note or notes of the town therefor.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to refund to H. L. Lufkin the sum of \$50.40, being the tax on buildings burned, for the year 1935.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to refund G. M. Hodgdon for personal tax on Campbell Bros. for the year 1928, amounting to \$67.60; and on P. W. Manning, \$20.60; and on J. R. & P. W. Manning, \$17.60, for the year 1928; and on P. W. Manning for the year 1929, \$11.20; and on J. R. & P. W. Manning for the year 1929, \$19.20; all amounting to \$136.20.

Art. 33. To elect constables and all other necessary town officers.

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The selectmen give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the town house at 9.00 o'clock in the forenoon of the day of said meeting.
