Levant:*

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Levant for the municipal year ending February 15, 1938.

SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE

S. A. French, term expires March, 1938

Halice Bemis, term expires March, 1939

D. E. Mason, term expires March, 1940

The work done in our schools during the past year has been very satisfactory. We have had the benefit of trained and efficient teachers. All citizens are cordially invited to visit the schools to learn from their own observation what we are doing.

At Levant Village, Miss Vivian Grant is teaching the first four grades and Miss Lillian Leighton the five upper grades. The usual high standard has been maintained. Mrs. Madeline Carter was employed to teach at South Levant. This school is very large, at present there are forty pupils with nine grades. Mrs. Carter is a diligent worker and good progress has been made. At West Levant Miss Lillian Wyman is still in charge of the primary room. We were fortunate in securing the services of Miss Flora Elliott for the grammar grades. These teachers are doing excellent work.

REPAIRS

Only repairs of a minor nature, such as appeared absolutely necessary, have been made this year. At Levant Village the

foundation of the building is in bad condition and should have attention. The grammar room is in need of repairs. New seats should be provided for the grammar room at West Levant.
