

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS,

The superintendent having had the supervision of the schools of the town of Hope respectfully submits the following report:

PRECINCT 1.

Spring and Fall terms taught by Myrtle Carter.

PRECINCT 4.

Spring and Fall terms taught by Minnie Barrett. Winter term by Alice Hobbs.

PRECINCT 5.

Spring term taught by Lizzie Hobbs. Fall term by Julia Bills. Winter term by Minnie Barrett.

PRECINCT 6.

Spring term taught by Winifred Wentworth. Fall and Winterterms by Nellie Wooster.

PRECINCT 7.

Spring, Fall and Winter terms taught by Gertrude Dunbar.

Our schools the past year have all been taught by teachers of our own town with very good results.

It being the vote of the town to maintain a school in Precinct 1, 'it was thought best to convey part of the scholars from No. 2 to No. I which has been done, making the school in Precinct I rank nearer the size of the other schools in town and more interesting both to pupils and teacher. I have introduced Stetson's "History and Civil Government of Maine" into all the schools which has been a benefit to the larger scholars for which it was intended. At the close of the school year I gave a written examination to all the schools in spelling, writing, arithmetic, geography and grammar which was very well taken thus showing that the teachers have been thorough in their work and each scholar taught to think for himself and not to depend upon the text book or teacher. Now I would recommend a course of study for the schools, by that I mean certain work for each school year in all the schools the same and by so doing the superintendent will be better prepared to furnish examinations, (which I most earnestly believe in) at the end of the year at least, if not at the end of each term and by good, faithful work and careful observation we may be enabled to get close to graded school work.

Part of our books have been in use a long time and consequently are getting poor so perhaps it would be well for the town to raise a small sum for new ones to supply the needs.

Nothing has been done to any of the school buildings except absolutely necessary repairs and I would call the attention of the citizens to the condition of the school buildings and request your earnest and careful consideration of the same.

I have received \$15 from the town of Rockport and \$5 from the town of Union for tuition of scholars. It not being received before the settlement of town business I have the same in my possession. Respectfully submitted, EVA L. TAYLOR, Superintendent of Schools. South Hope, Feb. 26, 1900.


