Superintendent's Report

The work done in our schools during the past year has proven very satisfactory. The conduct of pupils has been excellent and the attendance has been very good except the winter teim, which was somewhat broken in many schools, caused by sickness, but on the whole, most efficient work has been done All schools have been maintained for 27

weeks during the year.

We have greatly improved the list of text books by putting Heath readers in all our schools and adding a few histories and grammars, also what geographies that were needed We have expended a little more money than was appropriated but to complete sets it was necessary, and deemed advisable, and with an equal appropriation for next year and expended at a good advantage, would put the books in a satisfactory condition. Very little repairing has been done the past year.

The prices for teaching and board paid this year are the same as last. Last fall, three other pupils passed examinations and entered preparatory schools, making six who are now attending. Their rank slips show that they are doing

good work and are a credit to their town.

Two of the teachers employed were beginners; they have worked for the interest of the schools as have all teachers

and have met with decided success.

Again I would urge the citizens to strive for the uplifting and advancement of our schools by co-operation with your school officials, and by liberal appropriation of school funds.

In conclusion I wish to thank the school board, citizens and teachers, for the support and courtesy I have received

during the year.
