SUPT. OF SCHOOLS REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Hope:

I herewith submit my first report as Superintendent of Schools of the town of Hope. From my observations the work in general is on an average with the rural schools of the state. It is useless to expect the work to compare with that of graded schools where a teacher has one or two grades and from four to six weeks more in the school year. I am well pleased with the work at South Hope and the Head of the Lake where we have experienced teachers; the other two teachers have done well considering their training and experience. I believe that the town should pay more for experience and training. I feel it my duty to recommend that the building at South Hope should be remodelled into a two teacher school as soon as the town is able to do it. With so many little ones in the school we need a teacher for the lower grades. It is the start the children get that counts more than anything else.

I am glad that the town has done so well in providing suitable toilets at the schools and thus far they have been kept in good condition.

I am recommending that the Committee employ a Helping Teacher for next year and I have included the cost in my school budget. When we have to employ teachers with no training and little experience the Helping Teacher can be used to great advantage.

Since the state funds are now sent to the towns in a lump sum it is best for the towns to raise all moneys for schools in the same way and I have made my budget accordingly, viz: one amount for C. S., H. S. and Text Books and Supplies.

We are running the schools this year thirtytwo weeks and I feel that we should have thirtyfour as recommended by your former Superintendent.

I wish it were possible to establish School Improvement Leagues in each district so that the parents and friends interested could get in close touch with the work of the schools and see their needs. I shall be glad at anytime to confer with any of the citizens relative to school conditions and improvements when convenient to meet you.

I invite your attention to the financial statement which follows.

TOWN WARRANT

State of Maine

KNOX, SS.—To Carl Merrifield, a Constable in the Town of Hope in said County:

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Hope, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said Town on Monday, the 10th day of March, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To hear and act on the reports of the town officers.

Art. 4. To choose Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor.

Art. 5. To choose one or more members of the School Committee.

Art. 6. To choose a Sexton.

Art. 7. To see what method the town will take to repair the roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To choose Road Commissioners,

Art. 9. To see what method the town will take to collect the taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To choose a collector of taxes.

Art. 11. To choose a Treasurer.

Art. 12. To choose one or more Constables.

Art. 13. To choose all other necessary town officers.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of schools.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for tuition of scholars at secondary schools.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to purchase text books.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repair of school buildings.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of poor.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of roads and bridges.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cutting bushes.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking roads in winter.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money per hour the town will vote to pay for labor on the highways.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town expenses.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay the town officers.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid, as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to appro-

priate and raise the sum of \$533 for improvement of section of State aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commissioners in addition to the amount regularly raised for care of ways highways and bridges, the amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize and empower the treasurer of the town to borrow on the faith and credit of the town from time to time, such sums of money as may be necessary for payment of town charges and to give the notes of the town for such sums, to be paid during the municipal and current year, such notes to be countersigned and recorded by the Selectmen.

Art. 28. To see what action the town will take in raising and appropriating money for the rebulding of the Prescott Bridge.

Art. 29. To act on any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Town House, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
