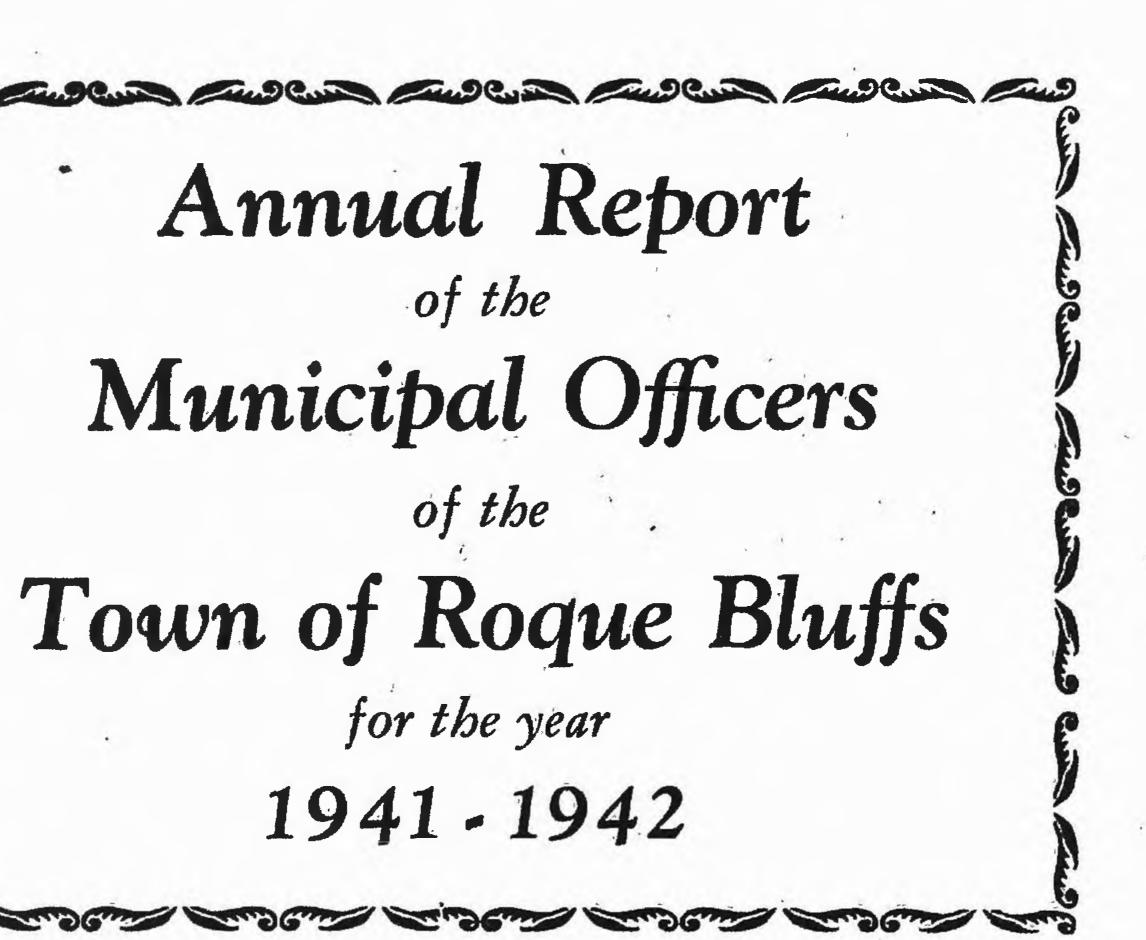

ANNUAL REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING 1941

Several visits have been made by the public health nurse to Roque Bluffs during 1941. Effort has been made to reach expectant mothers, infants and small children through home visiting.

Because of the small number of little children in town and because of the prevalence of mumps, no Well Child Conference was held in town this year. Later in the summer, parents were invited to take their infants or children to the Kennebec Well Child Conference and three children from Roque Bluffs were seen there, and had diphtheria immunization. This town has been interested in health protection for several years and most of the older children and many of the preschool children have been protected against diphtheria.

Five tuberculin tests were made in school, and several immunizations were given by the District Health Officer at the time of the school health inspection. The tuberculin tests were all negative; in other words, all satisfactory. Late in 1941 the audiometer was used to test the children's hearing and all proved satisfactory.

I submit herewith, my annual report as Superintendent of your school.

It was with regret that we found it necessary to accept Mrs. Hoyt's resignation. Mrs. Hoyt has been with us as teacher since 1937, during which time she has built up and maintained a very high standard.

Our pupils, on the whole, have always passed the Achievement Tests and have given a good account of themselves in competition with other students in higher institutions of learning.

I consider that we were fortunate in securing Mrs. Sara Parker to fill the vacancy. Mrs. Parker is a Normal School graduate and has had several years teaching experience.

We should all realize that there is an acute shortage of teachers and should do all in our power to cooperate with Mrs. Parker in maintaining the standards of our school.

Health and Safety Programs have been given as usual. Much fine work in Music and Art has also been accomplished.

Much needed repair was done this year on the underpinning of the building. I consider the building in good condition at the present writing.

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

State of Maine

To Walter Morse, a Constable of the Town of Roque Bluffs, in the County of Washington and State of Maine,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Roque Bluffs aforesaid, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the School House in the said town of Roque Bluffs, on the thirtieth day of March, A. D. 1942, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, there and then to act upon the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- Article 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the selectmen and other officers as printed.
- Article 4. To choose three selectmen.
- Article 5. To choose three assessors.
- Article 6. To choose one or more overseers of the poor.
- Article 7. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. To choose one member of the superintending school committee for three years.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road

- commissioner and if so, to elect the same and fix his compensation.
- Article 10. To fix the amount to be paid for the collection of taxes.
- Article 11. To choose a tax collector.
- Article 12. To choose all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 13. To see what sum the town will raise for maintenance of improved state road under the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of Ten Dollars for the combatting of tuberculosis in Washington County, said sum to be expended by the Washington County Anti-Tuberculosis Association.
- Article 15. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the following purposes:

 Contingent Fund; Highways and Bridges; Poor; Snow Removal; Schools; Repairs on School Buildings; and all and any other town charges for the year ensuing.
- Article 16. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of Maine, 1937.

- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, and how much, for the cutting of bushes on the improved State Aid Road.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, to be not less than Thirty-eight Dollars, for the maintenance of improved Third Class Roads.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to borrow not exceeding Eleven Hundred Dollars upon the faith and credit of the town, during the municipal year 1942 and 1943 in anticipation of and to be pail from the amount to be collected from taxes of said municipal year. And if the town votes so to borrow to authorize and direct the treasurer to execute and deliver the negotiable interest bearing promissory note or notes of the town for the sums so borrowed.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute and deliver quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Article 21. To see what compensation the town will vote to the Fire Warden for his services.
- Article 22. To see what compensation the town will vote the Moderator for his services.
- Article 23. To transact any other business that may properly and legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the School House at 8:30 A. M. on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters.
