

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

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

ANNUAL REPORT FOR ROQUE BLUFFS JANUARY 1 TO DECEMBER 31, 1947 BUREAU OF HEALTH NURSING SERVICE

The Public Health Nursing Service of Roque Bluffs has been continued this year with its aim for supporting good health, the correction of defects and prevention of disease. A total of twenty-three visits were made.

Since the first year of life is the period when the mortality rate is highest, emphasis is placed upon helping the mother in the care of the baby. The importance of medical supervision and protection against communicable diseases is stressed at this time. Three infant and five pre-school visits were made.

The Tuberculosis program is a preventative and diagnostic service. State Diagnostic X-ray Clinics are held annually in this area for the purpose of finding new cases of tuberculosis and for following known cases.

In the School Health Program, the nurse acts as a consultant for the teacher. Cases may be referred for home visits where physical defects and other problems are observed.

The contribution of the public health nurse in the venereal disease program consists of helping to get examinations for the individuals who have come in contact with the disease and to keep infected individuals under treatment until they are cured.

The Crippled Children and Pediatric Services consists of diagnostic and consultant clinics where specialists are in attendance. A medical social worker and nutritionist also attend these clinics. Children are referred to these clinics by the family physician, school personnel, social agencies and public health nurses.



All children receive a complete physical examination and assistance in correcting the physical defects found. Six home visits were made to these families to assist in carrying out recommendations made.

Interviewing key people in relation to health measures is another phase of the nurse's activities; these people include parents, physicians, superintendents of schools, teachers, town officials, chairmen of organizations and health minded citizens. It is through the interest and cooperation of these individuals that progress has been made, but there is need for more interest and participation by each citizen to further the health program. During the coming year, it is hoped that interest may be stimulated in forming a local health council which will be closely affiliated with the health program.

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF MAINE

To Harlan P. Johnson, a Constable of the Town of Roque Bluffs, in the County of Washington and State of Maine,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Roque Bluffs aforesaid, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the School House in the said town of Roque Bluffs, on the twenty-ninth day of March A. D. 1948, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, there and then to act upon the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- Article 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report of the selectmen and other officers as printed.
- Article 4. To choose three selectmen.
- Article 5. To choose three assessors.
- Article 6. To choose one or more overseers of the poor.
- Article 7. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. To choose one member of the superintending school committee for three years.



- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, and, if so, to elect the same and fix his compensation.
- Article 10. To fix the amount to be paid for the collection of taxes.
- Article 11. To choose a tax collector.
- Article 12. To choose all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 13. To see what sum the town will raise for maintenance of improved state road under the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930.
- Article 14. To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$10.00 for public health nursing in Roque Bluffs. Said sum to be expended by the State Bureau of Health, for local service.
- Article 15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to contract for removal of snow from State and Town ways approved by the State Highway Commission for snow removal. The contract not to exceed \$70.00 per mile.
- Article 16. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the following purposes:
 Contingent Fund; Highways and Bridges; Poor; Fire Bills; Snow Removal and Sanding; Schools; Repairs on School Buildings; and all and any other town charges for the year ensuing.
- Article 17. To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly

raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sections 25 and 29, Chap. 20, R.S. 1944, as amended.

- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the maintenance of improved Third Class Roads.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to borrow not exceeding Sixteen Hundred Dollars upon the faith and credit of the town, during the municipal year 1948 and 1949, in anticipation of and to be paid from the amount to be collected from taxes of said municipal year. And if the town votes so to borrow, to authorize and direct the treasurer to execute and deliver the negotiable interest bearing promissory note or
 - notes of the town for the sum or sums so borrowed.
- Article 20. To see whether or not the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 80, Section 95, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- Article 21. To see what action the town will take regarding the Grange tax.
- Article 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen on behalf of the town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem ad-



visable, and to execute and deliver quitclaim deeds for such property.

- Article 23. To see what compensation the town will vote to the Fire Warden for his services.
- Article 24. To see what compensation the town will vote the Moderator for his services.
- Article 25. To transact any other business that may properly and legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the School House at 8:30 A. M. on the day of said meeting, for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters.
