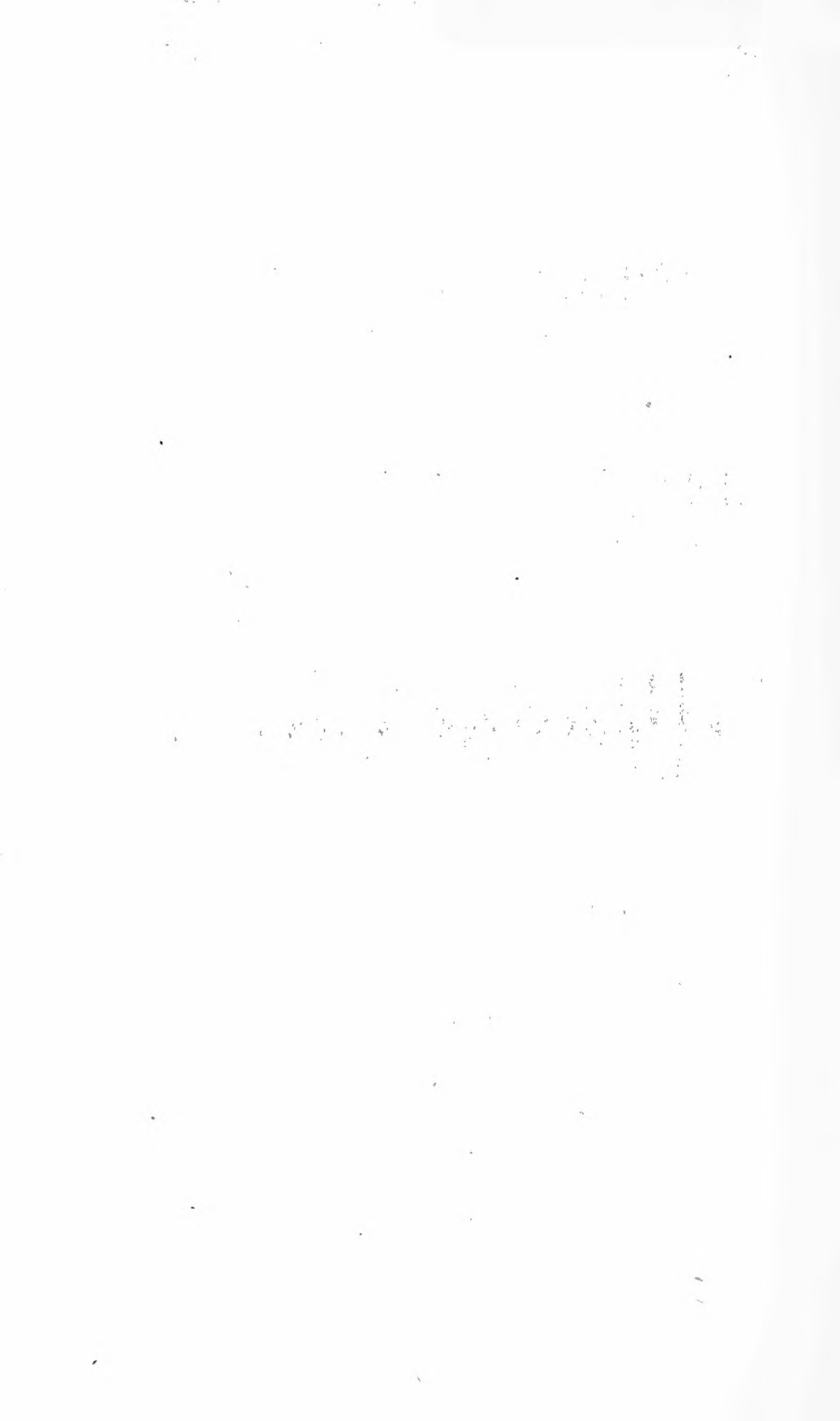

Superintendent's Report.

To the S. S. Committee and citizens of the town of Lincolnville, I herewith submit my report as Supt. of Schools:

With two or three exceptions our schools in town have been successful. Many of our teachers in the Spring and Fall terms were inexperienced, but were well qualified and the majority of them did good work. A fair degree of success has attended the efforts of the teachers. But there is need of more vigilance and care on the part of all concerned to insure better results.

Good government is hard to be defined, though we may have seen happy illustrations and all admit its necessity. The best government is not the most rigid, but that which awakening the pupils self-respect, renders the school room orderly and teachers thereby gain the confidence of the pupils without demanding it, enforce obedience without commanding. Self-respecting they command respect; self-governed they govern others. Sympathy with their charge, love for and enthusiasm in their work, must give a measure of success. Yet in some instances all these combined fail to secure a model school. Home government has much to do with the government and the order of the school room.

In conclusion I wish to thank the school board for the aid rendered me in the discharge of my duties. The following table shows the registration and attendance of pupils during the past year.
