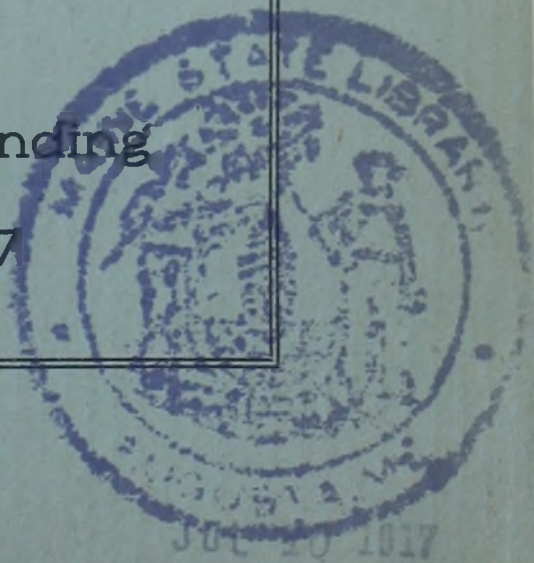

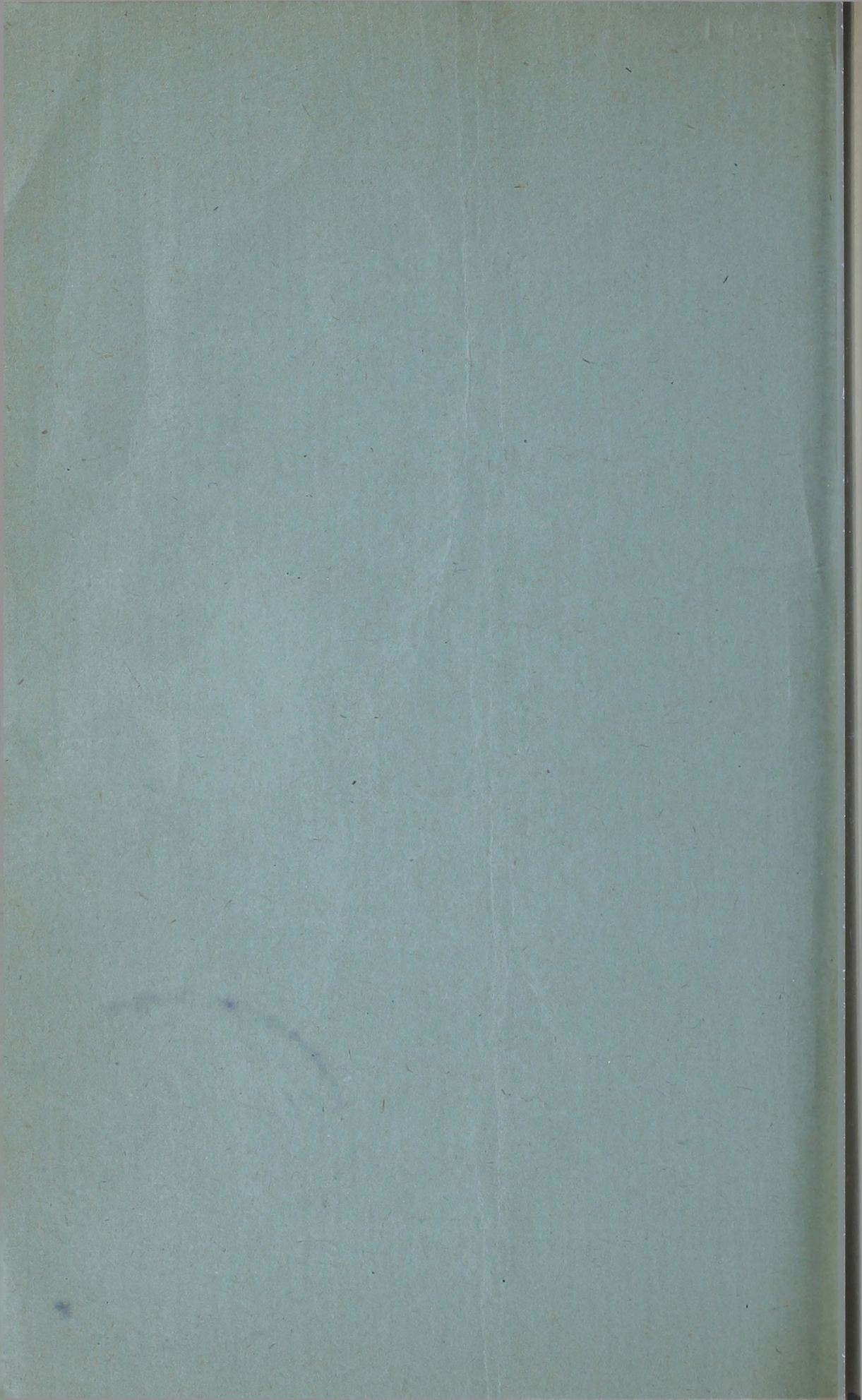

## Report of Superintendent of Schools.

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To the School Committee and citizens of the Town of Lincolnville, I hereby respectfully submit to you my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools :

I feel that I am justified in saying that the majority of our schools have done excellent work during the past year. Many of our pupils are well qualified to enter Normal and High Schools.

Although it has been very hard to secure satisfactory teachers for all of our schools, we were fortunate enough to secure experienced teachers with four exceptions. Two held state certificates, four had Normal training and several from sixteen to forty terms experience.

We were obliged to pay higher wages than in the past and shall be obliged to continue doing so, if we wish to keep our best teachers and secure good teachers from away.

The Beach, Heal and Youngtown schools were in charge of the same teachers for the three terms ; the Wiley, Miller, Rackliffe and Deantown schools had the same teachers for two consecutive terms ; in the others a change was made each term.

The Youngtown school, through the efforts of teacher and pupils, has purchased a large dictionary and holder for the use of the school, also new curtains for the school room.

The Rackliffe school, though so small in number, has neatly papered its school-room at its own expense.

The Trap school, through the effort of the School League, has purchased new curtains for the school-room and has a small balance which is to be expended for pictures.

New histories have been introduced the past year. With

few exceptions, our books are in good condition. The greatest need the coming year will be advanced reading for the older pupils.

In closing I wish to extend my thanks to the teachers for their faithful and efficient work, and to the members of the School Committee for the honor conferred upon me and the assistance given me in the discharge of my duties.
