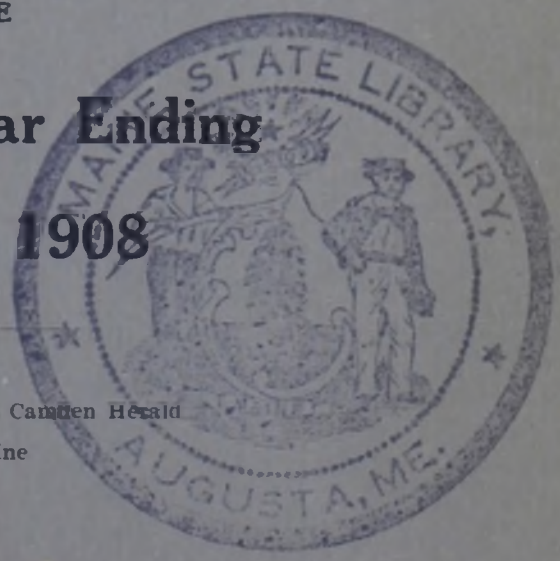

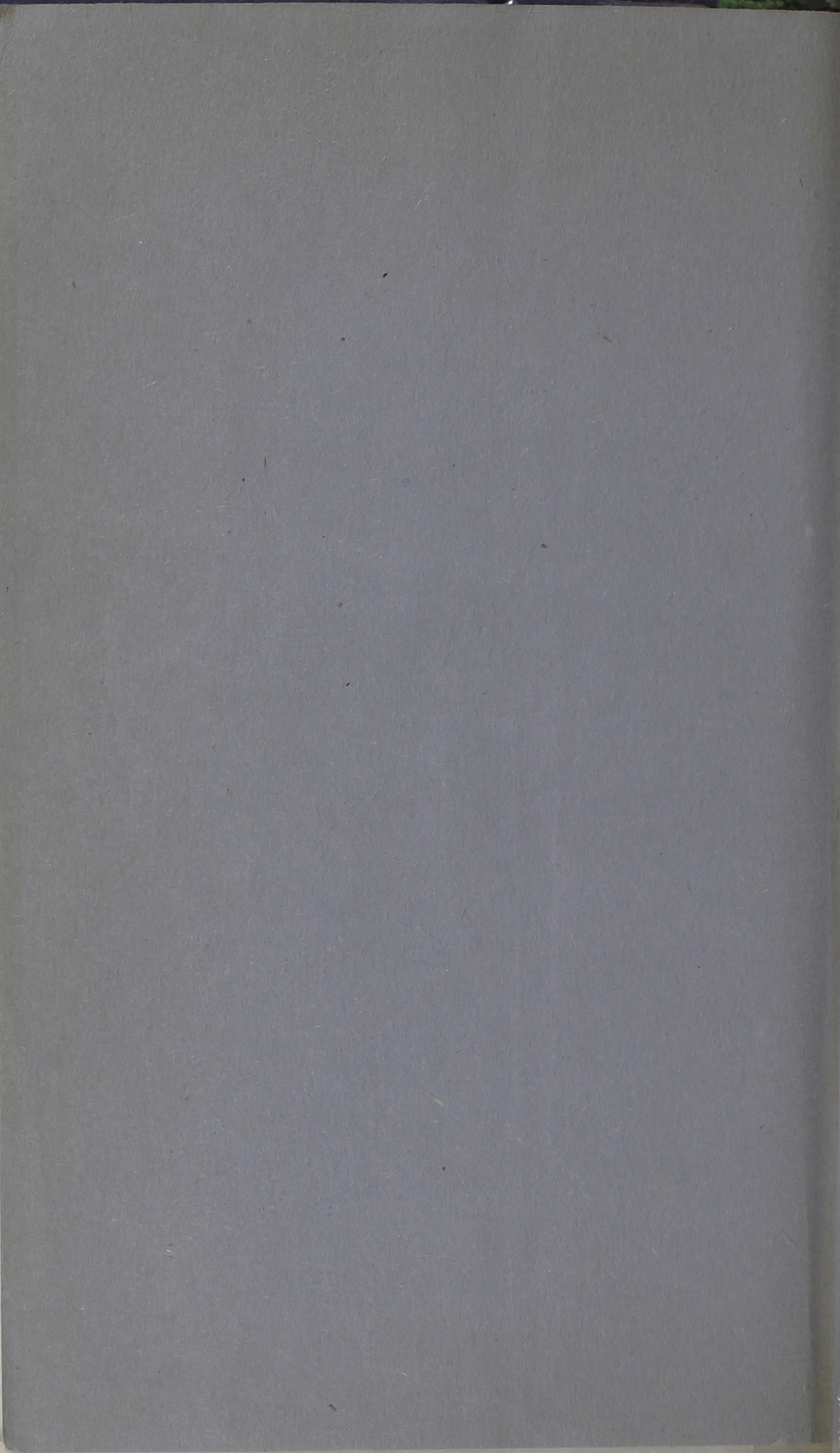

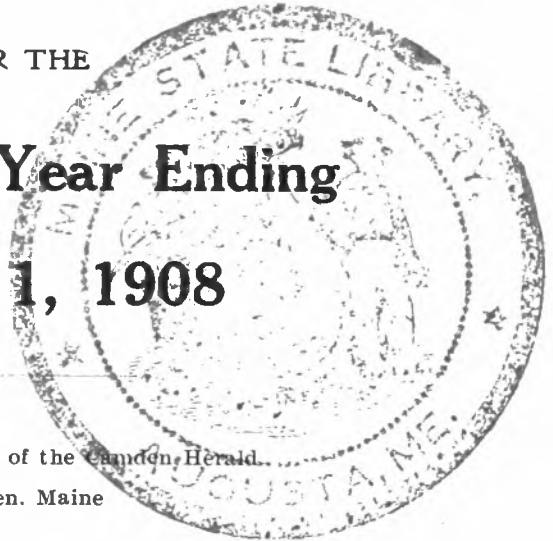

Report of the Superintendent of Schools.

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of
Lincolnvillle :

The past year, on the whole, has been one of general success in our schools. Some of the schools have made exceptionally good progress. To do the best work, it is absolutely requisite that the S. S. Committee and the teachers have the help of the parents in their schools. It is equally necessary that the citizens become intimately acquainted with their respective schools and learn from their own point of view what their school is doing.

There are some changes that seem essential in our schools in order to gain the most advantages to the large majority of our scholars.

The most of our pupils do not attend school after finishing what we have in town. Now in order to benefit this part of our scholars we must give them a better chance than they have at present. In these schools of all classes mixed together the pupil invariably does the best work in the studies which he naturally takes to and is deficient in those studies which are less pleasing to him. In short, the mixed schools like ours do not give, or at least do not require an even development. We need a chance for these scholars to gain a more complete education.

The schools at the Beach and Center have taken examinations the last of the term, based on the required work of the Grammar Schools of the State, from the seventh to the ninth grades, in Arithmetic and Grammar. The pupils of these two schools are now prepared to commence in their respective grades and work up to the next higher grade. The highest grade is next to the High School.
