

School Superintendent's Report.

To the S. S. Committee and citizens of the town of Lincolnville, I hereby respectfully submit my report as Supt. of Schools.

The past year, on the whole has been one of general success in our schools.

We have had some difficulty to secure competent teachers, but were fortunate to obtain experienced teachers with two exceptions, and those two were well qualified for their positions.

Two held state certificates, one college certificate, five Normal training and several many terms experience.

We have been obliged to discontinue three of our schools and transport the scholars to other schools.

The Beach school, we divided this winter and employed two teachers, this has proved perfectly satisfactory to all, the scholars doing great credit to themselves and teachers.

We were obliged to pay higher wages this year and shall have to continue so if we wish to secure the services of competent teachers.

The number of visits by parents, citizens and S. S. Committee have been more than in the past and appreciated both by pupils and teachers.

New grammars have been introduced through the exchange of our old ones. I would advise that a committee of three be chosen to investigate the books in our schools and select those that will be of the greatest educational value to our schools.

I would like to suggest that covered tanks for drinking purposes be procured for the schools.

We have maintained an average of thirty weeks in all schools.

In conclusion I wish to thank the teachers for their faithful and efficient work, and to the members of the School Committee for the honor conferred upon me, also the citizens for their courtesy during the year.
