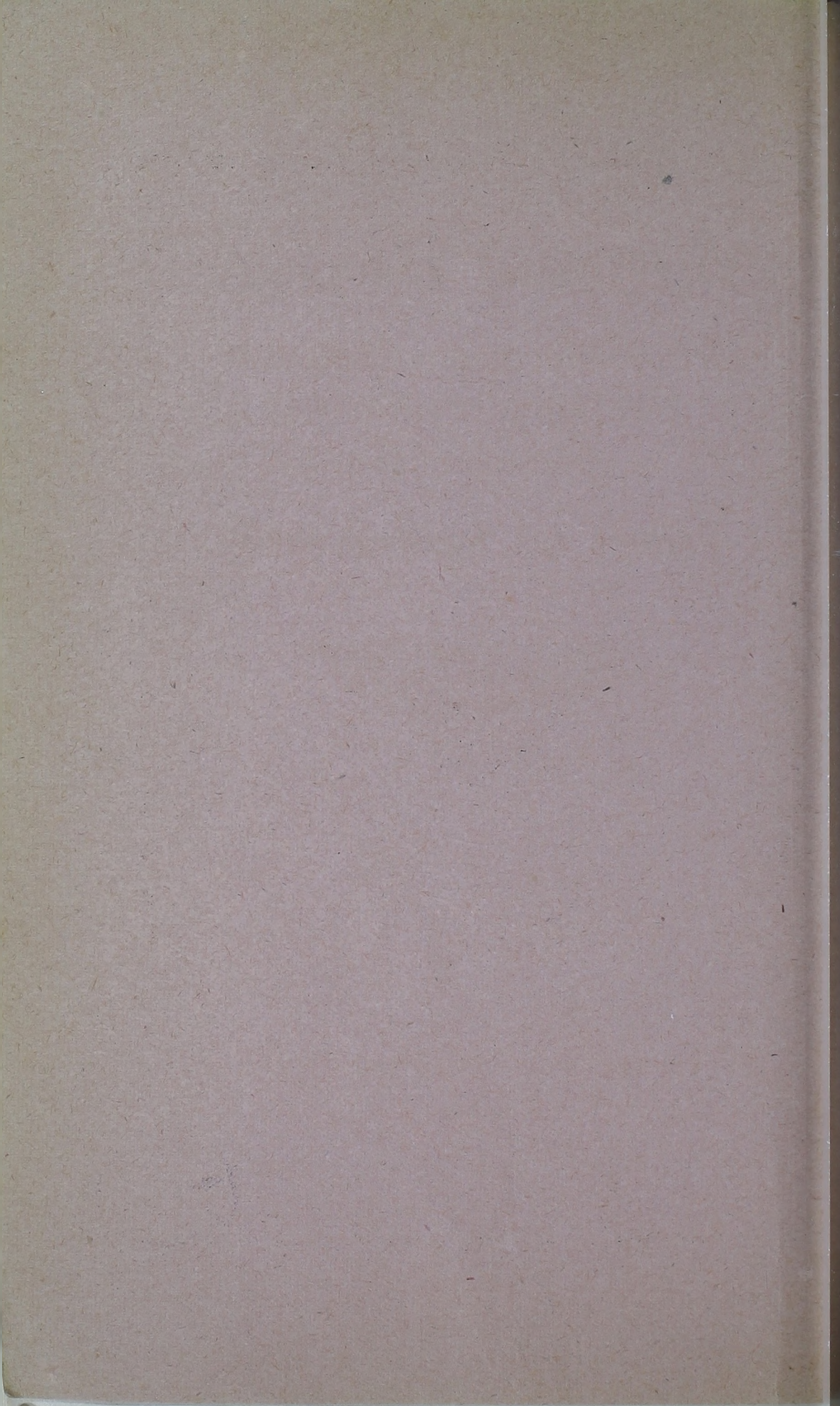

# Report of Superintendent of Schools

---

TO THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE AND CITIZENS OF THE TOWN  
OF LINCOLNVILLE :

I hereby submit the annual report of the schools of Lincolnville for the year ending March 1, 1919.

Through the efforts of several of our teachers and pupils many additions have been made to our school equipments, also one of our teachers presented the pupils with a fine dictionary. The schools are well supplied with flags.

Most of our books are well up-to-date, though I would advise exchanging our Readers in the first three grades for others more simplified.

We should, at this time have, at least, one Civil Government for each school, although the eighth and ninth grades are in need of them as a study.

A heater, which meets the requirements of the State Department, has been introduced into the Center School. This heater was recommended by the State Department and part of our equalization fund was set aside as an equipment fund by the state and to be used for the purpose of purchasing a heater.

One of our schools has held an almost perfect attendance during fall and winter, while others have been much broken up during the epidemic.

## ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

April 1st, 1918, there were enrolled 131 persons of school age. Of these 105 attended town schools, the remaining number were distributed in the following schools: Belfast High School, Camden High School, East Maine Conference and Rockland High. Thirty-one weeks of school were maintained in all the schools but the Beach, which had 30 weeks and the Rackliffe School, twenty-eight.
