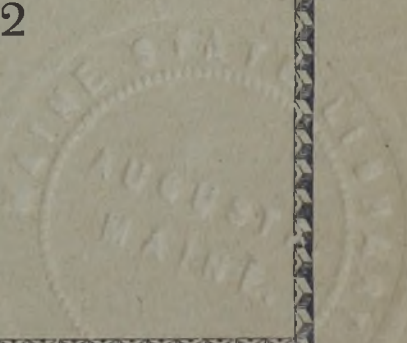

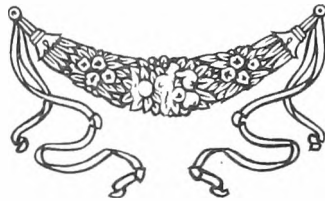

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens
of Lincolnville.

GREETINGS:

I have the honor of presenting for your considera-
tion the fourth annual report of the schools of Lincolnville.

The Hills school has fallen below the required aver-
age attendance. I recommend that the town vote to
leave this school to the discretion of the S. S. Committee.

Through the efforts of teacher and pupils a new flag
has been purchased for the Youngtown school.

Mrs. Grace Mahoney has been using the New Edu-
cational Music Course very successfully

We have maintained thirty weeks of school. This
leaves one week due Youngtown school from last year's
shortage.

Because of so many small children attending the
Center school, it seemed necessary to employ two
teachers. This plan has worked out very successfully.

Under the laws of the state the towns must put their toilet facilities in clean and sanitary condition by the year 1924.

The Center and Hills school buildings should be the first to receive new outbuildings. The Hills school building should also receive inside repairs.

One of the next requirements will no doubt be thirty-six weeks in the school year.

It would seem the best plan to add two weeks each year until the required number is reached.

With one or two exceptions we have had a splendid average attendance in school this year. We appreciate this co-operation between parents and teachers and urge that all parents have their children attend every day possible.

The teachers and pupils have all worked hard and faithfully throughout the year.

Twenty-three pupils were registered in secondary schools Sept., 1921.

There will be six pupils who will complete the elementary school work in June.
