SCHOOL REPORT.

To the School Committee, and citizens of Poland:—

The Superintendent respectfully submits the following report of the condition, progress, and expenditures of your schools for the year ending March 1, 1902.

SCHOOL STATISTICS.

REMARKS.

CONDITION OF SCHOOL PROPERTY.

During the year the school buildings at Nos. 6 and 7 have received two coats of paint outside. Nos. 9, 10, and 16 repainted inside. New floor and seats at No. 10.

Several buildings will need repainting next year, and new out buildings should be provided at Nos. 2 and 4.

Two hundred Graves Graded Spellers, which were badly worn, have been exchanged for the same number of Reed's Word Lessons.

Supplementary reading has been provided for all the grades.

By purchasing a few new books to replace those totally unfit for use we were enabled to complete the year without further exchanges.

It will probably be thought advisable, another year, to exchange U. S. Histories, Algebras, and Physical Geographies.

In concluding my fourth annual report I desire to express my gratitude to pupils, teachers and all the citizens of the town who have so kindly aided in the advancement of our school interests.

I believe the S. S. Committee were wise in uniting some schools for the year, thereby making it possible to maintain the usual thirty weeks with less expenditure of money.

At the same time the average wages of teachers have been increased with, we are confident, a corresponding increase in the efficiency of our schools,

I trust that our schools may continue to progress until they shall be excelled by none.

- 4th To choose a Superintendent of Schools.
- 5th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of common schools.
- 6th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for free high school.
- 7th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school text books.
- 8th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of school property.
- 9th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of roads and bridges.
- 10th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of poor.
- 11th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for contingent expenses.
- 12th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on bonds.
- 13th To see if the town will vote to raise \$2000.00 to pay bonds maturing Sept. 1, 1902.
- 14th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay collector's commission and abatements.
- 15th To see what sum of money the town will vote to donate to A. A. Dwinal Post G. A. R., to help defray the expense of Memorial Day.
- 16th To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to

- pay snow bills.
- 17th To see what instructions the town will give the Selectmen in regard to reimbursing N. W. Titus for taxes paid on land he did not own.
- 18th To see if the town will vote to buy a lot and build a school house on Blackcat, and what sum of money they will vote to raise for that purpose.
- 19th To see if the town will vote to pay each member of the school board ten dollars.
- 20th To see what action the town will take in regard to buying a team for road work.
- 21st To see if the town will vote to make all the property of the Empire Grove Campmeeting Association's grounds, church property.
- 22d To see if the town will authorize the municipal officers to make application to the County Commissioners to designate a State road in Poland.
- 23d To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and expend in the permanent improvement of such road.
- 24th To see if the town will ratify the action of the Treasurer in releasing to Andrew C. Verrill the town's interest in the homestead of O. A. & B. F. Schellinger, also Sarah A. Doherty property to J. D. Dunn, upon payment of the unpaid taxes, cost and interest.
- 25th To see if the town will authorize the Treasurer to release the town's interest in any real estate sold for taxes, upon the payment of the unpaid taxes, cost and interest at six per cent standing against any parcel.
- 26th To see what action the town will take in regard to providing a suitable place for the better protection of patients afflicted with contagious diseases.
- 27th To see what action the town will take in regard to establishing a permanent Free High School at some place where it will be most convenient for all high school scholars and provide a suitable building for the same.
