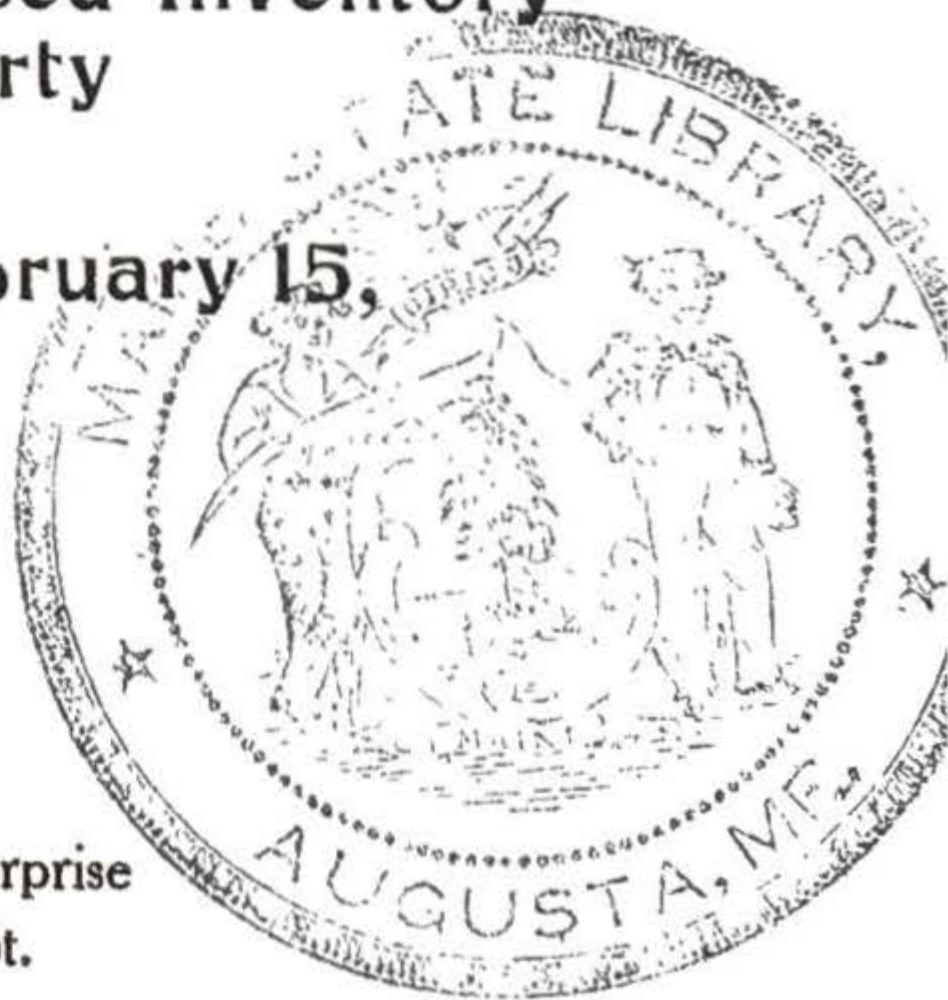

# Annual Report of Superintendent of Schools

FELLOW CITIZENS:—

In making my report I am pleased to say that our schools are making a steady advance. Our teachers have been earnest and painstaking winning in a large degree the cooperation of parents and friends which has resulted in commendable work. We must have uniformity of purpose if we are to secure efficiency. We have continued to keep our aim constantly in view, that accuracy and adherence to the ideal should be placed before dispatch. Other things being equal the training received from a normal course is of great benefit to every teacher. It is a satisfaction to know that several of our young ladies of last year's class in our High School are availing themselves of this opportunity. Our course of study for the common schools has been revised making the work of each grade specific and to conform with the requirements of the State of Maine Educational Department.

Our High School was never doing better work than now. The young men and women who are annually going to institutions of higher learning are earning a reputation for their alma mater of which every citizen of the town may well be proud.

I would recommend we appropriate \$2,500 at our annual meeting for the support of our common schools for the year ensuing and \$1,800 for our High School. Thanking all with whom I have been associated for their courtesy and kindly suggestion. Respectfully submitted,

To the Superintendent and Superintending School Committee:

Gentlemen—

The work in the High School during the past year has been, on the whole, quite satisfactory. At the beginning of the Fall Term every regular student who finished the preceding Spring's work, with the exception of the members of the graduating class, reentered school. This, I believe, is a record not only for our school but for all schools the size of ours.

The discipline of the school has remained at a high standard. Not a single difficult problem of maintaining order has occurred. The work required of the scholars have been gradually increased and many parents have reported that never before have their children worked so hard at their books outside of school. This is as it should be, for boys and girls must work hard, if they are to amount to much after leaving school.

Out of last year's graduating class four have gone to Normal School, and two will enter college. The necessary steps have been taken whereby these two can enter college on the Principal's certificate without examination. This is a privilege and honor which many High schools in towns larger than ours do not possess.

There are seventeen boys and one girl in the Agricultural Course. We expect now that these students will raise during the summer

months at least \$500 worth of produce. Next year we hope to arrange it so that everyone in the course shall earn at least \$50 during the year.

# WARRANT

---

TO FREEMAN E. RANKIN, A CONSTABLE OF THE TOWN OF WELLS, IN  
THE COUNTY OF YORK, GREETING—

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants in said Town of Wells qualified by law to vote in Town affairs to meet in the Town Hall in said town on Monday March 10, A. D., 1913, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act upon the following articles, to wit:

First To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second—To see if the town will vote to choose one or more Road Commissioners and whether the same shall serve one or three years.

Third—To choose a Town clerk, three Selectmen assessors of taxes, overseers of the poor, Town treasurer, collector of taxes, Town agent, one school committeeman for three years, one or more road commissioners, one auditor of accounts, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Fourth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for the support of the poor and other necessary charges incidental to the Town.

Fifth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for hydrant rental as per contract.

Sixth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of common schools for the ensuing year.

Seventh—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repairs of school houses for the ensuing year.

Eighth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purchase of free text books for the ensuing year.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of free High school for the ensuing year.

Tenth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance and repairs on highways, roads and bridges for the ensuing year.

Eleventh—To see if the Town will vote yes or no upon the adoption of the provision of chapter 112 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by chapter 69 public laws 1909, also chapter 21 public laws 1911, and chapter 183 public laws 1911, relating to the appropriation of money necessary to entitle the Town to State aid for the year 1913.

Twelfth—To see if the Town will raise and appropriate in addition to the amount regularly raised and appropriated for the care of ways highways and bridges the sum of \$550.00 being the maximum amount which the Town is allowed to raise under the provision of chapter 112 of public laws of Maine for the year 1907 as amended by chapter 69 public laws 1909, also chapter 21 public laws 1911, and chapter 183 public laws 1911.

Thirteenth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the transportation of High School Scholars for the ensuing year.

Fourteenth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise toward the payment of its indebtedness and interest due on the same.

Fifteenth—To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer to borrow money upon the credit of the town, fix the rate of interest and the amount to be borrowed for the ensuing year

Sixteenth—To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote passed at a special Town meeting held on April 17, 1911, and December 14, 1911 to issue its bond at a rate of three and a half per centum per annum and to vote to issue said bonds at a rate of four per centum per annum.

Seventeenth—To see if the Town will vote when all taxes shall be payable and what rate of interest it will charge thereafter and what discount not to exceed five percent shall be made on all taxes paid before the first day of October or any other date that may be voted and see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise to meet said discount.

Eighteenth—To see what date the Town will vote to have the commitment in the hands of the collector.

Nineteenth—To see if the Town will fix the compensation of the Collector for the ensuing year.

Twentieth—To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise to be expended by Abraham Lincoln Post, G. A. R. 129, in observance of Memorial Day.

Twenty-first—To see what sum of money the Town will vote and raise for destroying brown tail moth nests for 1913.

Twenty-second—To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money of not less than five hundred dollars, to continue the building of a town way at Ogunquit Beach called Ocean Avenue, as laid out by the selectmen of Wells, the return of said lay-out having been filed with the town clerk March 8, 1912, money to be expended before June 1st, 1913, upon petition 16 residents and 21 non-residents.

Twenty-third—To see if the town will vote to extend the breakwater at Wells Beach on the southern and the distance of 175 feet, and raise a sum of money for the same, upon petition of Lester L. Kimball and others.

Twenty-fourth—To see if the town will provide for two hydrants at Wells Beach to be located by Wells Beach Hose Co., and appropriate a sum of money for the same upon petition of George W. Moody and others.

Twenty-fifth—To see if the town will make necessary repairs on the road between the residence of Fred Studley and the Webhannet House at Wells Beach, and raise a sum of money for the same upon petition of A. A. Perkins and others.

Twenty-sixth—To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended by Wells Beach Hose Co. for the erection of a hose house at Wells Beach, upon petition of E. B. Studley and others.

Twenty-seventh—To see if the town will vote and raise a sum of money with which to repair the highway in the rear of the Johnson & Pease Carrol and Hobbs cottages at the northern end of Ogunquit Beach upon petition of W. H. Pitts and others.

Twenty-eighth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars to be expended as a special appropriation on the highway No. Berwick Road, so called, leading from the residence of C. C. M. Littlefield to Gray Corner, so called: To see if the town will appoint two men living on said highway to have full charge of said appropriation, upon petition of Lester W. Littlefield and others.

Twenty-ninth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to insert in the printed annual report of the municipal officers a condensed inventory of all taxable property in the town.

Thirtieth—To see if the town will vote to fix the time as between the first day of January and March of each year in which clams may be taken within its limits, and fix the fee for which the municipal officers may grant permits therefor.

Thirty-first—To see if the town will vote to set off a portion of the highway between the residence of C. O. Pope and the Wells Beach Road, so called, for a sidewalk, build the same and appropriate a sum of money therefor.

Thirty-second—To see if the Town will vote to repair the highway between the residence of Andrew J. Littlefield and the cottage formerly owned by Homer Hobbs, known as Atlantic avenue at Wells Beach, and raise a sum of money therefor.

Thirty-third—To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Power Sprayer to protect its shade trees from the Brown Tail Moth and other insects and raise a sum of money therefor.

Thirty-fourth—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money with which to repair the bridge across the highway leading from the residence of Joshua F. Hilton and John Stuart.

Thirty-fifth—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money with which to repair the highway leading from the Captain Thomas to the Oliver Stuart place "so called."

Thirty-sixth—To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money with which to repair the highway North Berwick road "so called" leading from C. L. Maxwell store to the York line.

Thirty-seventh—To see if the Town will vote to install a hydrant near the house of the late George Williams and raise a sum of money necessary for the same upon petition of George L. Bragdon and others.

Thirty-eighth—To see if the Town will vote to install a hydrant near the Henry Donnell cottage and raise a sum of money therefor upon petition of John W Jacobs and others.

Thirty-ninth To see if the Town will vote to purchase one thousand feet of drain pipe to be used upon the Portsmouth road of Ogunquit village leading from the store of W. F. Cousens towards the residence of Walter Littlefield, upon the petition of John W. Jacobs and others.

Fortieth—To see if the Town will vote to exempt from taxation live stock of three years of age and under upon petition of George F. Dixon and others.

Forty-first—To attend to any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at their office in Wells for the purpose of correcting list of voters on Saturday, March 8 A. D. 1913 from two o'clock to four o'clock in the afternoon and on the day of said meeting at 9 o'clock in the forenoon.

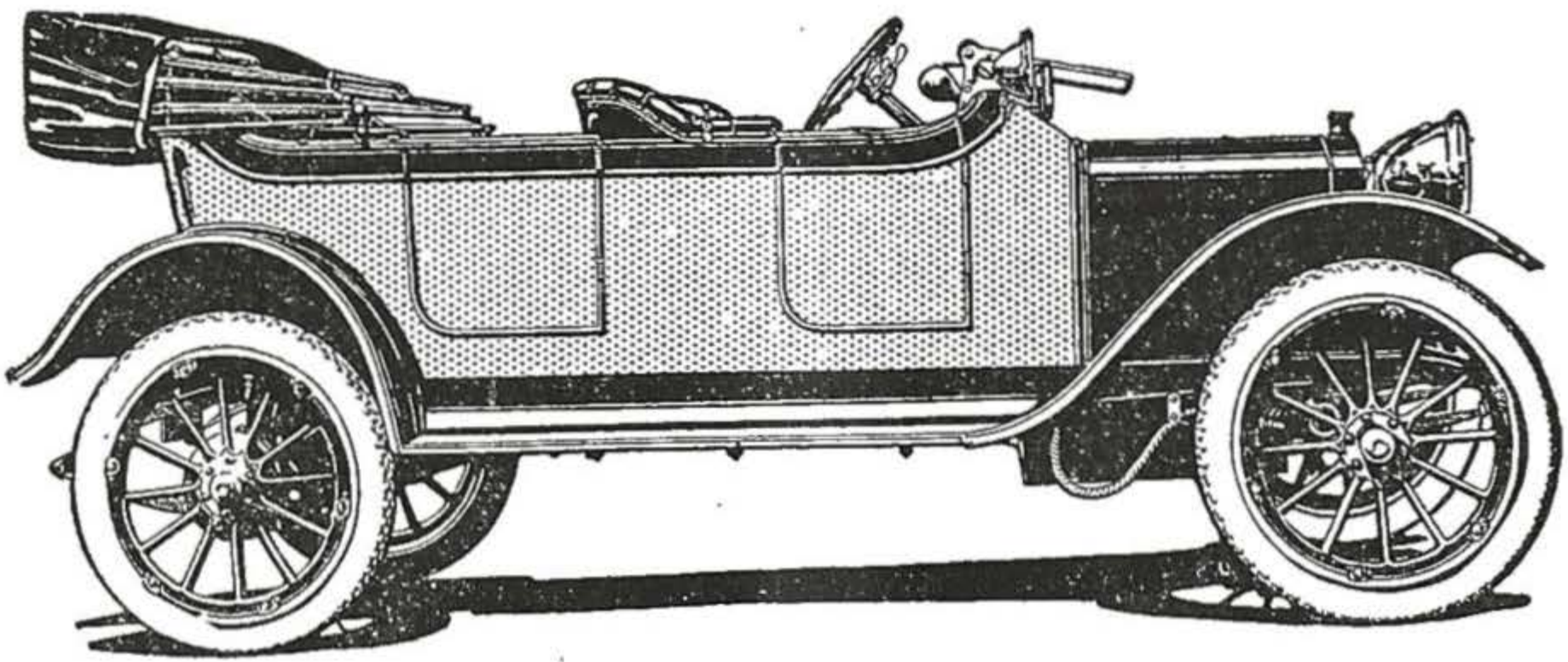
