

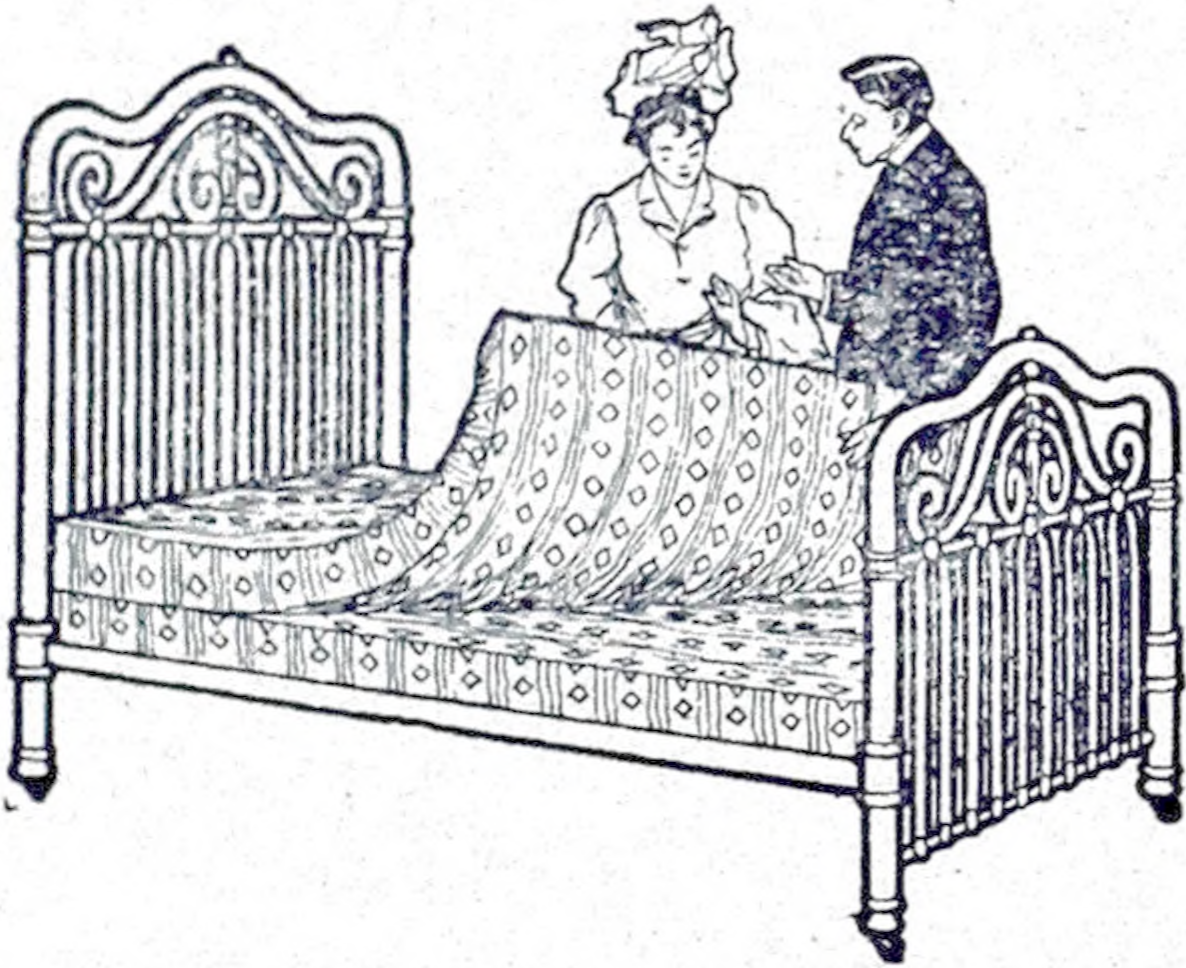

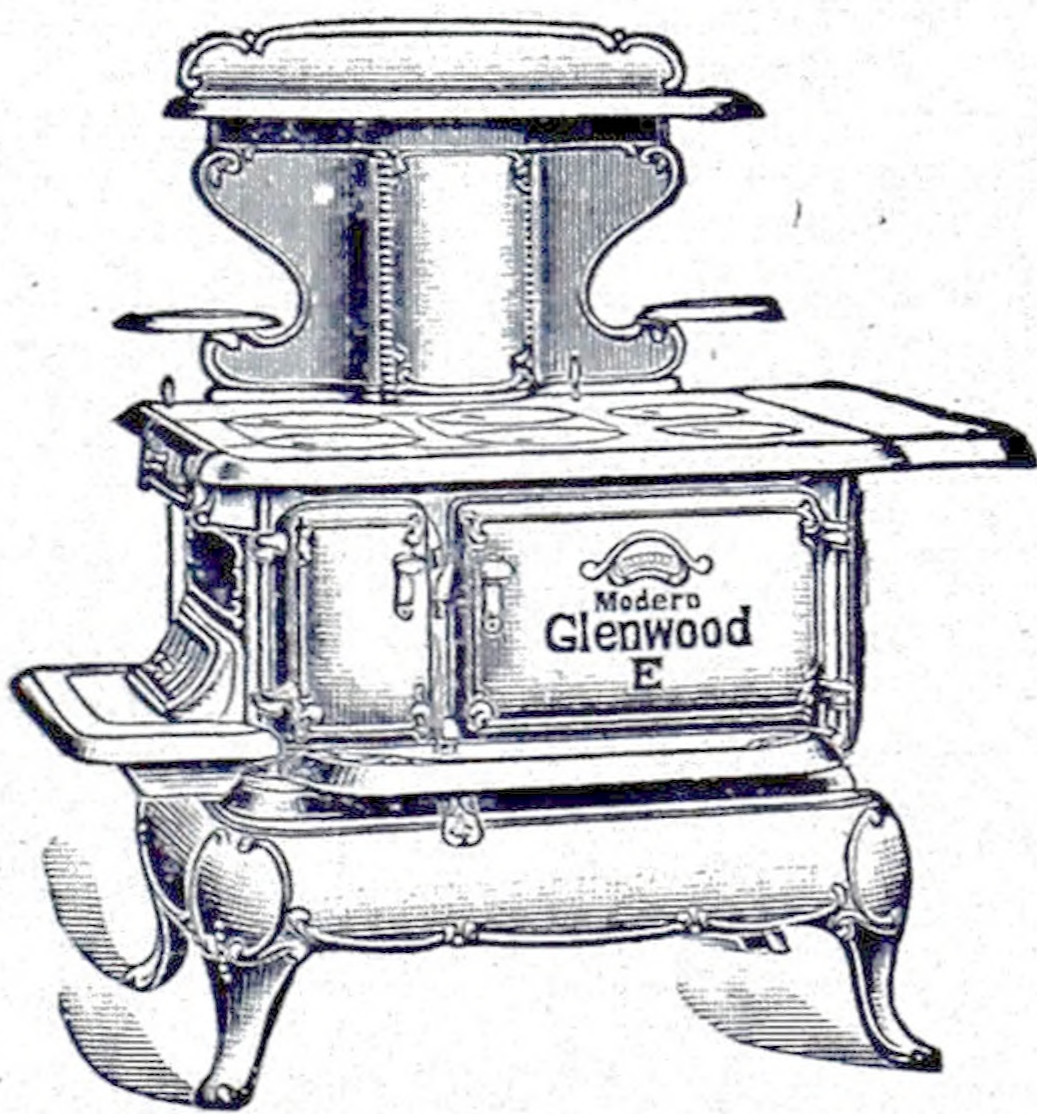

Glenburn schools have been in session 30 weeks and all schools have made good progress. I have changed the ungraded work to grade work as far as could be done in a short time, as a great many things must be worked out in the year to come. Another year will be more marked. Nearly all 9th grade pupils will be able to take the high school examination at the close of next spring term with good results. The west side school suffered from the change of teachers, having a different teacher each term, which is not for the best interest of any school. I find irregular attendance of many is a source of injury to a school. No teacher can do her best work with pupils who come one day and are absent two or three. Until school officers can find some way to prevent this no teacher or school can do their best work. We are in need of arithmetics to take the place of those we are using which are badly worn. The schools are in need of maps as there is not one in town. I have worked for your schools and their interest, aided by the S. S. Committee, whose words of advice and cheer have greatly helped me in the work. Every encouraging word has been appreciated. Trusting that results will speak for the work of the year better than words can do,

I very respectfully submit this my first report to the people of Glenburn.

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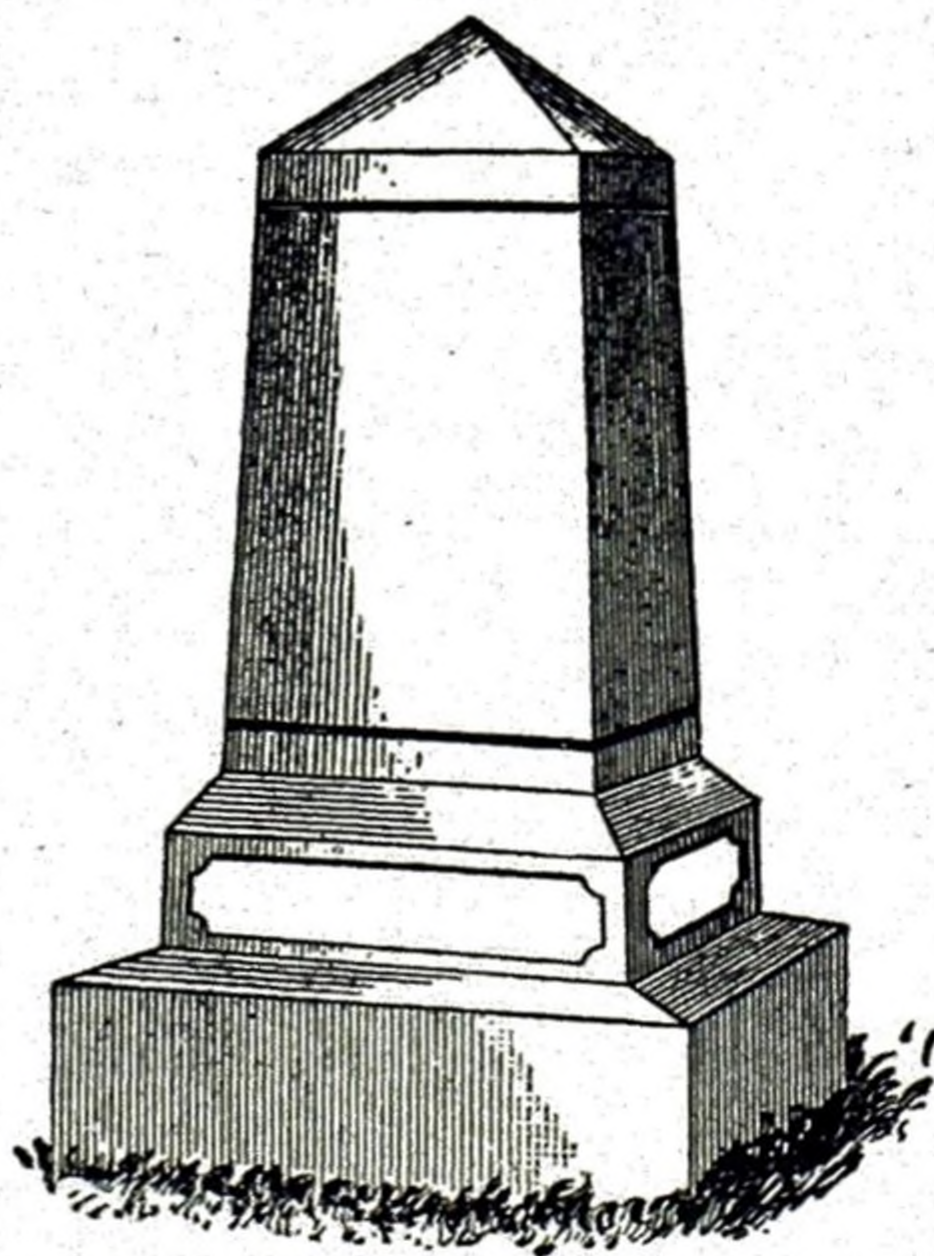
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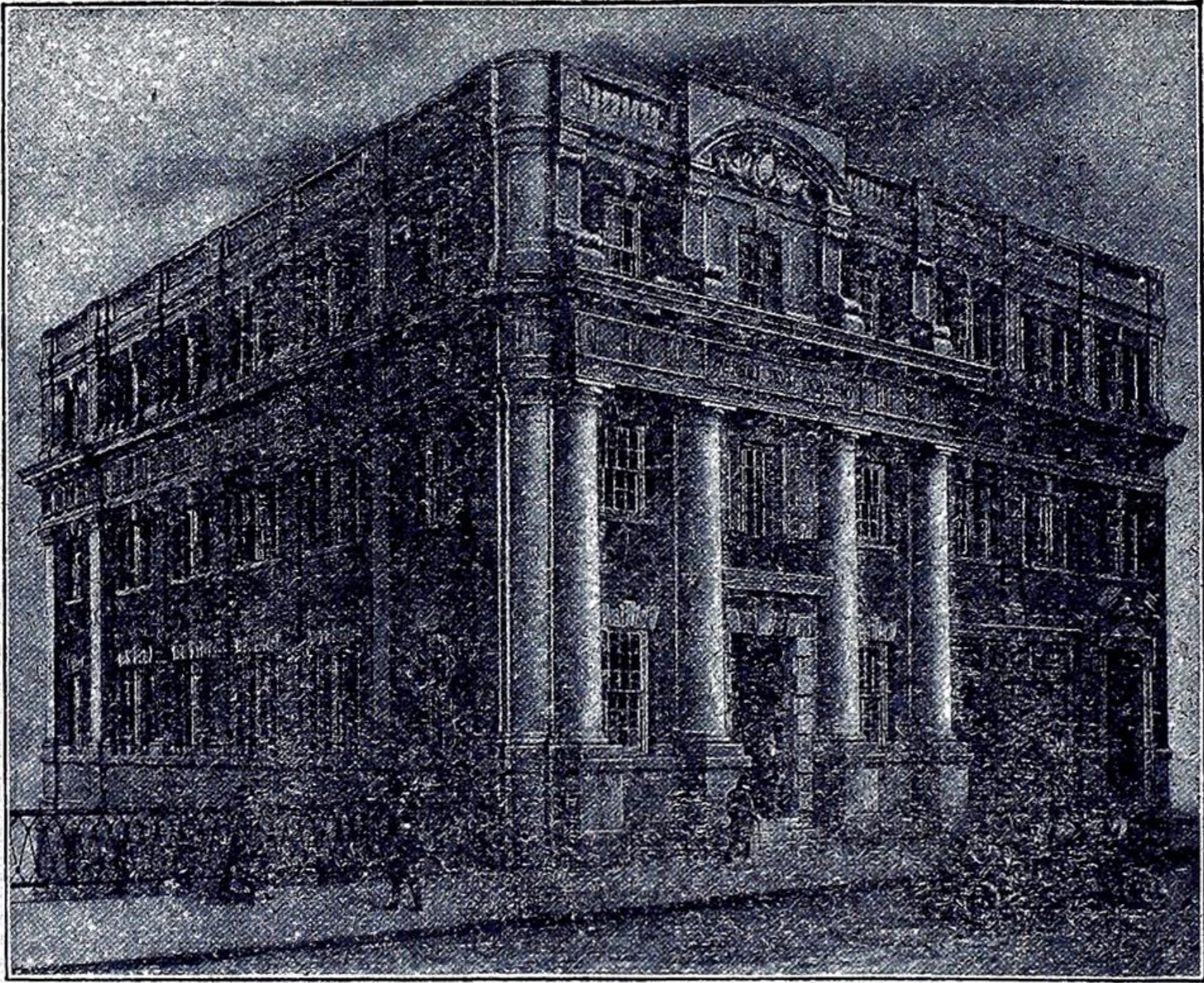
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
