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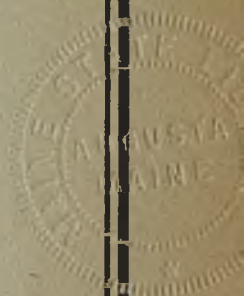
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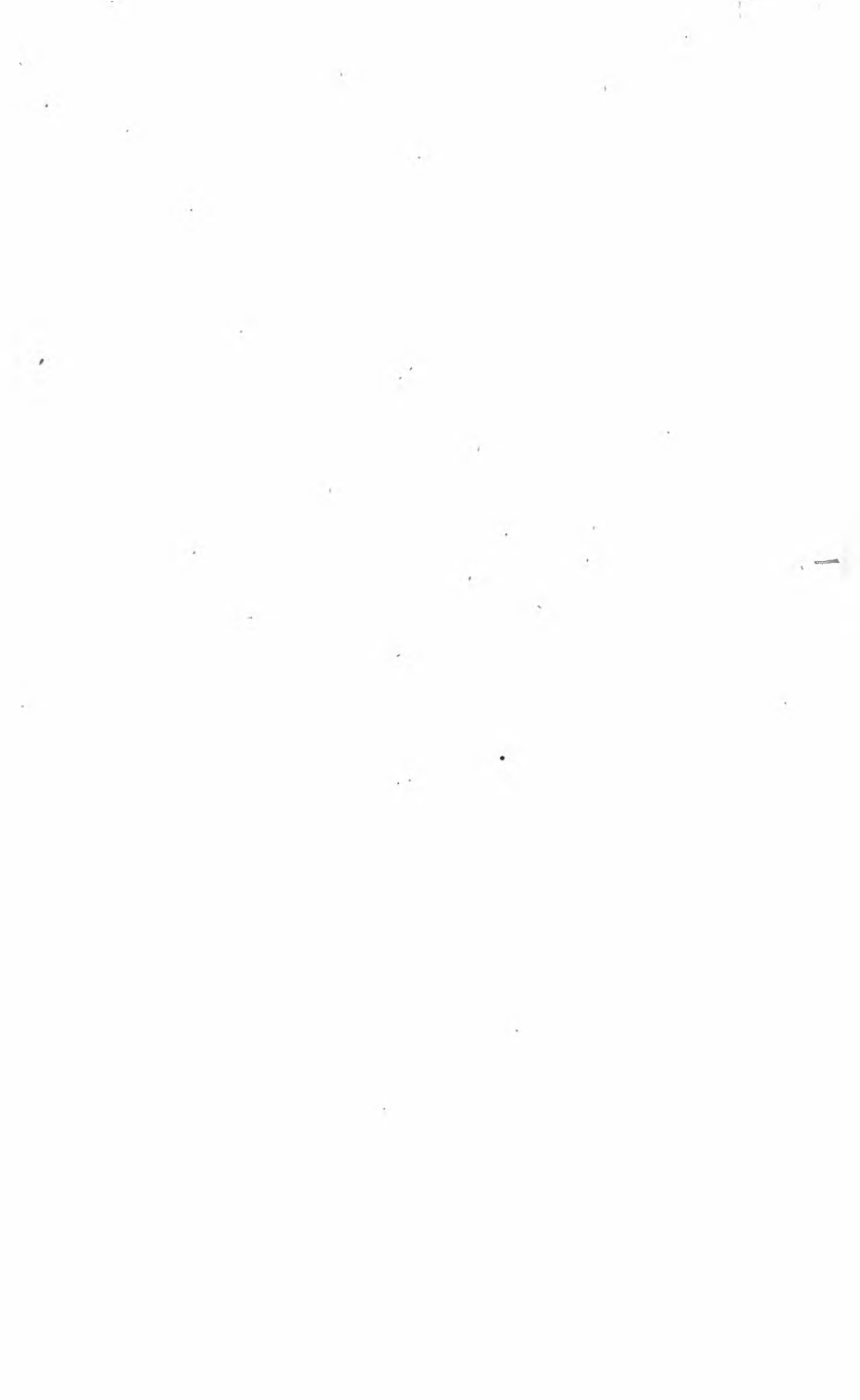

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TO THE SUPERINTENDING SCHOOL COMMITTEE AND
CITIZENS OF NEWCASTLE:

I hereby submit my annual report:

There has been but two changes in the teaching force this year, which would mean a better condition of our schools than in previous years, were it not, that despite the fact that our children have not been handicapped by circumstances of changing teachers they have still been deprived of time in which to finish the work required of them.

We have in our schools an excellent State Course of Study which requires thirty-six weeks to complete properly; with less than this they can pass on 70% basis of examination and 75% daily rank, which is rather unsatisfactory.

Teachers have tried to bring their scholars to the test of 75% rank and some have succeeded where others have failed.

Education today means success in the future; why not give these boys and girls of ours a better chance than we give to roads and sidewalks? The boys and girls are alive and we walk with them and not on them. Eight of these scholars from the grade schools entered Lincoln Academy last fall. It seems to be in order these days to boom things. States are boomed, towns are boomed; carnivals that cost sums of money are the means of these booms. Why not boom our schools of Newcastle? I am sure the result would be most satisfactory if parents and interested citizens would lead in this Educational boom.

There are four towns in this union of towns and three of them are running a school of 36 weeks; citizens and parents have seen that it should be so, and have made this length of school year possible. Your boys and girls are just as important as those of the other towns. Why should they be deprived of what the other towns are giving their children?

Do not think the present board of selectmen are responsible for this shortage; ask their help in this boom and I know it will meet with their approval. They are only town servants as all connected with schools are; but they are broad minded enough to believe in a square deal with the children of the town.

The present school year is 34 weeks in length, 12 weeks in the spring, 14 in the fall and 8 in the winter. We have eight teachers, two conveyance teams, seven janitors, besides fuel for seven buildings. Let us have an appropriation sufficient to cover these expenses for thirty-six weeks. Real repairs are needed at the village school building; the entrance steps are sadly in need of attention, and the inside walls as well. This

building is the best in town; it is too bad to allow it to deteriorate in this manner. It would be economy to put it in first class condition this year and save the added expense of its repairs another year.

Needed repairs have been made at Damariscotta Mills, North Newcastle and South Newcastle. A Kaustine Chemical toilet has been installed at North Newcastle. A sum of money sufficient to fit some of the other buildings with the required dirt closets should be appropriated this year. As the time for the installation of these toilets has been extended from 1924 to 1927, at the expiration of this time limit, every building in town must be furnished with proper out buildings.

Garrison Hill and South Newcastle, not having the required attendance, eight, may be continued only by vote of the town.

TOWN WARRANT

To A. B. GILPATRICK, a Constable of the Town of Newcastle, County of Lincoln, State of Maine.

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Newcastle qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble at Oliver's Hall in said town on the 17th day of March A. D. 1924 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

ART. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

ART. 2. To choose a Clerk for ensuing year.

ART. 3. To see what action the town will take on report of auditor.

ART. 4. To choose Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor and Fish Committee for ensuing year.

ART. 5. To choose a Treasurer for ensuing year.

ART. 6. To choose one member of school committee for three years.

ART. 7. To see what method the Town will adopt for the collection of taxes and fix compensation for same.

ART. 8. To choose a Collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

ART. 9. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.

ART. 10. To choose one member for Board of Trustees, Cemetery Association, to act for three years.

ART. 11. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or three road commissioners or leave it with Selectmen to appoint.

ART. 12. To see if the Town will vote the sum of one thousand dollars for Sinking fund for ensuing year.

ART. 13. To see if the Town will vote the sum of four hundred dollars for discount on taxes for ensuing year.

ART. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for repairs on school houses for the ensuing year.

ART. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for support of Common schools for ensuing year.

ART. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay tuition at Secondary Schools.

ART. 17. To see what sum the Town will vote for Text Books and Supplies.

ART. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for support of Poor for ensuing year .

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Highways for ensuing year.

ART. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote for repairs of Bridges for ensuing year.

ART. 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for Snow Bills for ensuing year.

ART. 22. To see if the Town will vote "Yes" or "No" on raising and appropriating money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Sec. 30 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$533 00 for State aid road under provisions of Section 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

ART. 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Sidewalk repairs for ensuing year.

ART. 25. To see if the town will vote the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750) to build permanent Sidewalk from "Genthner's Corner" toward station and instruct Selectmen to make contract for same.

ART. 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for payment of Town officers for ensuing year.

ART. 27. To see what sum the town will vote for Incidentals for ensuing year.

ART. 28. To see what sum the town will vote for expense of putting in sanitary closets at school houses as required by State law.

ART. 29. To see what sum the Town will vote for Free Library for ensuing year.

ART. 30. To see if the Town will vote the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) for Taniscot Engine Co. for purchase of hose and repair of Engine house.

ART. 31. To see if the Town will vote the sum of Thirty-five dollars (\$35) to Richard R. Wells Post American Legion.

ART. 32. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$650 00 for street lights for ensuing year.

ART. 33. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for patrol service in State roads.

ART. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay interest on Town Notes for ensuing year.

ART. 35. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$300 00 for Ridge road "special" to be added to amount of \$500 00 set aside by Legislature of 1922 as asked for by petition of B. A. Woodbridge and seven others.

ART. 36. To see if the town will vote to open and maintain the road leading from State road near residence of Henry Dodge by the buildings of Henry Whitcomb to old road as petitioned for by Manfred C. Dodge and eleven others.

ART. 37. To see if the Town will vote to continue school in District number 9 Sheepscot, petition by L. C. Carney and ten others.

ART. 38. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as necessary to pay current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 39. To choose all other necessary Town officers.

ART. 40. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
