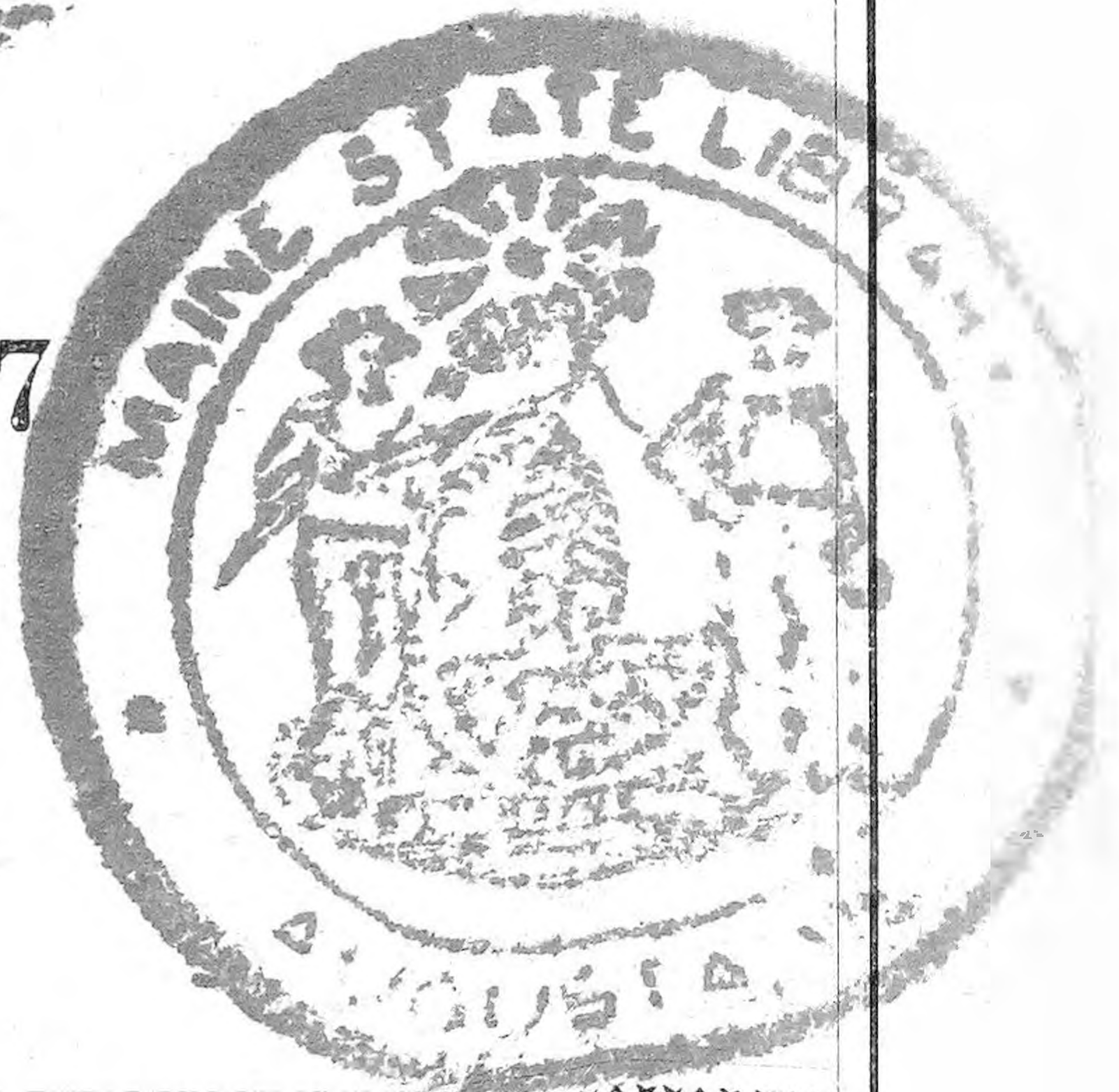

To *T. A. Haley*, constable of the town of Glenburn in said County:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Glenburn, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the town hall at Glenburn Center on Monday the 12th day of March, A. D.. 1917 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, viz:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To act on the reports of town officers for past year.

Art. 4. To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose one member of the school board for three years.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to have one or more road commissioners appointed.

Art. 8. To elect one or more fire wards for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 10. To see if the town will appropriate and raise the sum of \$300.00 for the improvement of the section of the State aid road as outlined in the State Highways Commission in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 11. To see whether the town will vote to raise money and what sum for the maintenance for the State highways during the ensuing year within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Sections 8-17 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for roads and bridges.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of poor.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of schools.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school supplies.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for free text-books.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs on schoolhouses.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for high school tuition.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on school fund.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial purposes.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemetery purposes.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on town hall debt.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for incidental purposes.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to destroy brown tail moth nests.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to buy or hire a piano for the town hall.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to build a culvert in front of Forest Grover's house.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to establish day wages for men and teams on highways.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to buy a road machine.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to permit Winslow Grant to build an underground cattle path across Pushaw road south of Walter Boynton's residence.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to pay Geo. Cookson five dollars a year for use of pump and watering trough.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to be entitled to an appropriation of five hundred dollars or more from the State to be expended on New County road.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to have all taxes paid on or before the 1st day of Jan., 1918.

Art. 33. To see what action the town will take relative to collection of taxes.

Art. 34. To choose all other necessary town officers required by law to be chosen at annual town meeting.

Art. 35. To see what action the town will take to continue the school in the Vickery District.

Art. 36. To see what action the town will take to discontinue the school in the Gibbs District and transport scholars to Vickery school.

The selectmen will be in session at the town hall in said Glenburn, on the 12th day of March, A. D. 1917 at 9 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters .

To the Citizens and School Committee of the town of Glenburn:

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools for the year ending March 1, 1917.

The work done the past year has been a continuation of the excellent work done by the former supt. of schools. My aim has been to provide the very best of teachers, and we have indeed been very successful.

The spring term in the Center School was taught by Miss Lenora Bunker, the order and advancement were excellent, as she resigned her position to accept a better one, Miss Grace Ogden was engaged, she taught the fall and winter terms with marked success.

The spring and fall terms in the Gibbs School were taught by Miss Mildred Batson. In all of her work she attained the highest type of efficiency. The winter term was taught by Mrs. Grace DeGrasse, a normal teacher of much experience, her school will prove one of the best in town this year.

Miss Marion Arey taught a very successful spring term in the Vickery School. The fall term was taught by Miss Irma Buswell, the energy that Miss Buswell showed in her work always brings success. The winter term was taught by Miss Marguerite Littlefield, excellent work was done. The spring term in the West School was taught by Miss Rena Shores and satisfaction given to all. The fall and winter terms were taught by Mrs. Myra Andrews this school under her management is in excellent condition, and nothing but praise can be said in her behalf.
