REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the superintending school committee and citizens of Glenburn:

I submit this my third annual report as superintendent of your schools. Since last year we have discontinued the school in the Gibbs District, some of the children attending the Center School, and the others the Sherburn School in Bangor, where they have the advantages of a two-teacher school, with less expense to the town.

The Center school was somewhat broken up in the fall term, on account of scarlet fever, making it impossible to accomplish as much as we would under favorable conditions.

ATTENDANCE ·

The attendance at the Center school has been very poor for the past year. Of course the scarlet fever was the cause of many of the absences; but a large majority of them were caused by the disinterested parents, who keep their children out for every little excuse they can think of.

Really some of the parents appear to think that they are making a good thing whenever they keep their children from school, even if the children do not help them at all; but play all day long.

Perhaps it will interest some of you to know that it is for the interest of every tax-payer in town, financially, to keep the children all in school; as a part of the State money is apportioned according to the attendance.

I ask every interested citizen to take hold and help the superintendent and board to keep the children in school as much as possible.

TEXT BOOKS

The text books are all in very good condition, except the geographies, which are not only very much out-of-date; but are badly worn. I would suggest that a change be made before the beginning of the fall term.

REPAIRS

You have use for only two school buildings at the present time, and both of these are in very bad condition. It seems that for years you have made only such repairs as were absolutely necessary to tide you over to the next year.

Some of the doors to these buildings resemble doors I have seen used in stables behind kicking horses. They are double boarded, securely spiked together, and hung with strap hinges fully eighteen inches in length, with latch to match hinges. Even these seem to have been all too frail in many instances, as some of them are broken. Do you know why this is so? I have heard the remark many times in this district; while talking these matters over with the citizens; That's good enough for them to stave up, they will destroy it anyway. Now it has been my experience in dealing with children, that they will in a majority of cases do what they think you expect of them. From your talk they knew that you were expecting them to destroy things, and judging from appearances they haven't disappointed you.

Now ladies and gentlemen: The time has come when it seems necessary to make some changes; why not begin this year, by thoroughly remodeling one of your school houses, giving the children a good, pleasant, convenient, sanitary school building. And talk to the children as though you had faith enough in them to believe that they would appreciate, and take care of it. I for one feel sure that they will not disappoint you, and that you will feel satisfied with your investment; which by the way will be only a little for each one. I believe that \$1000 with what the State will help us, will put the building in good condition, if properly laid out. Then it will require about \$225 more to fit it with new adjustable seats.

The West Glenburn building is the one I refer to.

CONCLUSION

In order that you may see how your tax rate and teacher's salaries compare with other towns of the State I give the following:

Municipal tax rate in Glenburn for year ending March 1922, .0335. Average for the State .03815. Rate in Glenburn for school purposes alone .0063. Average for State .01037.

We have paid the teachers of Glenburn for the past year about \$600 apiece, as against an average for the State of all elementary teachers of \$727.29.
