REPORT OF PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE

To the Citizens of the town of Glenburn:

I hereby submit my report as a public health nurse for the period from Jan. 1, 1928 to Jan. 1, 1929:

The nursing service has been carried on for the past year by Miss Katherine Noble, R. N., who came to Maine from Worcester, Mass., Jan. 1, 1928.

It is practically impossible to measure the value of a health service in dollars and cents or by cold statistics but the following figures will give some idea to the citizens of Glenburn what their public health nurse is doing.

During the summer four home visits have been made. Two of these were to secure cooperation of parents to have defects of school children corrected. One was of investigation and one visit was made to give advice to a tubercular patient. This woman has since gone to a sanitorium.

For Year Ending March 2nd, 1929

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Glenburn:

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Glenburn for the municipal year ending February 20, 1929.

Practically all of the regular work of the schools is progressing along the customary lines. Our teachers have worked faithfully for the pupils and community, and I am pleased to speak words of praise in their behalf.

As the building at Glenburn Center was divided, at the beginning of the fall term the school was divided into regular primary and grammar grades. Equipment for a class room was supplied, efficient teachers were employed and the very best of results obtained. Mrs. Halace Robinson was engaged to teach the West Glenburn school. Mrs. Robinson's work and methods are exceptionally good; excellent progress has been made.

Owing to the increase in the number of pupils at Glenburn Center we are crowded for room. In some way the building should be enlarged. It has been suggested that the building in the Canty Dist. be moved and joined to this building. Something must be done this year to relieve this condition.
