WARRANT OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING YEAR 1930

State of Maine

Penobscot, ss.

To Earl Morrill a constable of the town of Glenburn in the County of Penobscot.

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said town of Glenburn qualified by law to vote in town affairs to meet at the town house in said town on the 10th, day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:—

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 3. To act on reports of town officers for past year.
 - Art. 4. To choose a Town Treasurer for ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To choose a board of Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the poor, for ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To choose one member of the School Board for three years.
- Art. 7. To choose one or more Road Commissioners for ensuing year.
 - Art. 8. To choose a constable for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 9. To choose Sextons for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to sell the school-house in the County district, as recommended by the School Board.

- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to buy snow fence.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to cooperate with the State Highway Commission and adjoining town in maintaining winter open highways as provided in Chapter 227 of the Public Laws of 1927.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter open highways.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Patrol Maintenance for ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs on Third Class highways.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 19 of Chap. 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 18. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways, and Bridges, under the provisions of Sec. 18, Chap. 25, Revised Statutes of 1916, or under the provisions of Sec. 21, Chap. 25, R. S. as amended by Chap. 258 P. L. of 1917.
- Art. 19. An act to set off certain land from the Town of Glenburn to be annexed to the City of Old Town.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for common schools.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for schoolhouse repairs.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for School Appliance.

- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for High School Tuition.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for General Government.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Charities and Corrections.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Fire Protection.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for General Highways.
- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest.
- Art. 29. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay Abatements.
- Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Health and Sanitation.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Municipal officers and Town Treasurer to hire sums of money for the Municipal year and to the extent of what sum.
- Art. 32. To see what action the town will take in regard to the collection of 1930 taxes.
 - Art. 33. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to reimburse the Treasury on overdrawn Road Account.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair Lancaster Brook Bridge so-called.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to establish wages for men and teams for labor on highways.
- Art. 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay discounts on 1930 taxes.
- Art. 38. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
