WARRANT

State of Maine,

To F. Albert Thayer, Constable of the Town of Glenburn, in the  
County of Penobscot, and State of Maine, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town of Glenburn, qualified by Law to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on the ninth day of March next, at 10.00 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To act on reports of town officers for past year.
- Art. 4 To choose a town treasurer, for ensuing year.
- Art. 5 To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of poor for ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To choose one member of the school board, for three years.
- Art. 7 To choose one or more road commissioners for ensuing year.
- Art. 8 To choose a constable for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9 To choose sextons for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for common schools.
- Art. 11 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school appliances.

Art. 12 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for high school tuition.

Art. 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school house repairs.

Art. 14 To see what action the town will take in regard to selling or moving the school house in the Canty district.

Art. 15 To see what action the town will take in regard to building on a room onto the Center school house.

Art. 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to build a room onto the Center school house.

Art. 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to move school house in the Canty district to the place desired and to remodel same.

Art. 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for patrol maintenance.

Art. 19 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to buy snow fence.

Art. 20 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred and sixty-two dollars for the maintenance of third class highways.

Art. 21 To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to co-operate with the State Highway Commissioners and adjoining towns in maintaining winter-open highways as provided in Chap. 227 of the Public Laws of 1927.

Art. 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for winter-open highways, including state and town highways.

Art. 23 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town of State Aid as provided in Section 19 of Chap. 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 24 To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provisions of Section 18, Chap. 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916 or under the provisions of Section 21, Chap. 25, of Revised Statutes as amended by Chap. 258, of Public Laws of 1917.

Art. 25 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended for advertising in natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 26 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for charities and corrections.

Art. 27 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for fire protection.

Art. 28 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for health and sanitation.

Art. 29 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to reimburse the treasury on overdrawn road accounts.

Art. 30 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest on loans, etc.

Art. 31 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay abatements.

Art. 32 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers and Treasurer to hire sums of money for the municipal year, and to the extent of what sum.

Art. 33 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for general highways and bridges.

Art. 34 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for general government.

Art. 35 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of schools and citizens to have free privileges of the

Bangor Public Library.

Art. 36 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair the upper hall in the town hall and to buy chairs for lower hall.

Art. 37 To see what method the town will make in regard to the collection of taxes for the year 1931, and thereafter.

Art. 38 To choose all other necessary town officers.

Art. 39 To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred and twenty dollars to pay Martha Sanford one note on permanent loan.

Art. 40 To see if the town will vote to build a fence between school lot at Glenburn Center and Mary Megquier and appropriate money for the same.

Art. 40-A To see if the town will vote to purchase snow removal equipment and appropriate for the purpose.

Art. 41 To see if the town will vote to purchase land for addition to Lake View and Birch Grove Cemeteries and to appropriate money for the purpose.

Art. 42 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall on Monday, the ninth day of March, A. D., 1931 at nine o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

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To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Glenburn:

I herewith submit the annual report of the schools of Glenburn for the municipal year ending February 20, 1931.

### SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Eva MacDonald, term expires March, 1931.

Audrey Perkins, term expires March, 1932.

Freeman Walker, term expires March, 1933.

We have had a very profitable year both in the amount and quality of the work accomplished. This result has been brought about chiefly by the good teachers we have been able to secure. All of our teachers have worked faithfully for the welfare of the pupils. At the beginning of the school year Miss Louise Lyford was engaged for the Center Grammar School. Miss Lyford is an excellent teacher and the very best of results have been obtained.

Mrs. Ruth Hillman was engaged for the primary grades. After seven weeks Mrs. Hillman resigned. Substitutes were engaged to finish the term, Miss Gladys Cookson is now teaching this school and is doing good work.

Miss Vivian Smith is again in charge of the W. Glenburn school and is doing very creditable work.

It will be necessary to raise additional money this year. The large increase in scholars calls for an extra outlay for books and supplies. We have many more pupils in high schools.

With the additional pupils at the Center school it seems to be necessary to provide extra room. I would suggest that the lumber in the Canty schoolhouse be used in building an addition to the Center building.
